AN ACT

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

32.086. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for all local $\mathbf{2}$ sales and use taxes collected by the department and remitted to a political jurisdiction or taxing district, the department shall remit one 3 percent of the amount collected to the general revenue fund to offset 4 the cost of collection, unless a greater amount is specified in the local $\mathbf{5}$ 6 sales and use tax law. The department shall not commingle the 7 remaining amounts collected with general revenues and shall remit the 8 remaining amounts collected to the political jurisdiction or taxing 9 district less any credits for erroneous payments, overpayments, and dishonored checks. 10

32.087. 1. Within ten days after the adoption of any ordinance or order in favor of adoption of any local sales tax authorized under the local sales tax law by the voters of a taxing entity, the governing body or official of such taxing entity shall forward to the director of revenue by United States registered mail or certified mail a certified copy of the ordinance or order. [The ordinance or order shall reflect the effective date thereof.]

2. Any local sales tax so adopted shall become effective [on the first day of the second calendar quarter after the director of revenue receives notice of adoption of the local sales tax, except] as provided in subsection [18] 19 of this section, and shall be imposed on all transactions on which the Missouri state sales tax is imposed.

123. (1) Every retailer within the jurisdiction of one or more taxing entities 13which has imposed one or more local sales taxes under the local sales tax law shall add all taxes so imposed along with the tax imposed by the sales tax law of 14 the state of Missouri to the sale price and, when added, the combined tax shall 15constitute a part of the price, and shall be a debt of the purchaser to the retailer 16 until paid, and shall be recoverable at law in the same manner as the purchase 1718 price. The combined rate of the state sales tax and all local sales taxes shall be the sum of the rates, multiplying the combined rate times the amount of the sale. 19 20(2) For all tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2022, the

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total combined rate of sales taxes imposed under the local sales tax law
shall not exceed the following amounts:

(a) For local sales taxes imposed under the local sales tax law by
a taxing entity that is incorporated as a city, town, or village, four and
one-half percent;

(b) For local sales taxes imposed under the local sales tax law by
a county, excluding cities not within a county, three and one-fourth
percent;

29(c) For local sales taxes imposed under the local sales tax law by all taxing jurisdictions other than those described in paragraphs (a) 30 and (b) of this subdivision, the total combined rate of sales taxes in any 31 given taxing jurisdiction shall not exceed three and one-fourth 32percent. For the purposes of this paragraph, local sales taxes imposed 33 by taxing entities described in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this 34subdivision, in a given taxing jurisdiction shall not be included in the 35 36 calculation of the total combined rate of sales taxes under this paragraph. 37

(3) For the purposes of subdivision (2) of this subsection, no
transient guest tax or convention and tourism tax shall be considered
a local sales tax under the local sales tax law.

(4) In any election in which more than one sales tax levy is approved by the voters, and the passage of such levies results in a combined rate of sales tax in excess of the limits provided for under subdivision (2) of this subsection, only the sales tax levy receiving the most votes shall become effective, provided such levy does not result in a combined rate of sales tax in excess of the limits provided for under subdivision (2) of this subsection.

(5) (a) For all tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2022, all taxing jurisdictions levying a local sales tax shall reduce such levy to a rate that will produce substantially the same amount of revenue collected from such sales tax during the fiscal year beginning on or after July 1, 2019, and ending on or before June 30, 2020, plus five percent of such amount.

54 (b) All taxing jurisdictions levying a local sales tax shall provide 55 data, in such form as shall be prescribed by the state auditor by rule, 56 substantiating such tax rate complies with the provisions of this 57 subdivision. The state auditor shall, within fifteen days of the date of 4 ation an

58receipt, examine such information and return to the taxing jurisdiction his or her findings as to compliance of the tax rate with this 59 subdivision. If the state auditor believes that a taxing jurisdiction's 60 proposed tax rate does not comply with this subdivision, then the state 61 62 auditor's findings shall include a recalculated tax rate, and the state auditor may request a taxing jurisdiction to submit documentation 63 supporting such taxing jurisdiction's proposed tax rate. Any rule or 64 portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010 that is 65 66 created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions 67 of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and 68 chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the 69 70 general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held 7172unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule 73proposed or adopted after January 1, 2022, shall be invalid and void.

4. [The brackets required to be established by the director of revenue under the provisions of section 144.285 shall be based upon the sum of the combined rate of the state sales tax and all local sales taxes imposed under the provisions of the local sales tax law.

5.] (1) The ordinance or order imposing a local sales tax under the local sales tax law shall impose a tax upon all transactions upon which the Missouri state sales tax is imposed to the extent and in the manner provided in sections 144.010 to [144.525] 144.527, and the rules and regulations of the director of revenue issued pursuant thereto[; except that the rate of the tax shall be the sum of the combined rate of the state sales tax or state highway use tax and all local sales taxes imposed under the provisions of the local sales tax law].

85 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, local taxing jurisdictions, except those in which voters have approved a local use tax 86 87 under section 144.757, shall have placed on the ballot on or after the general 88 election in November 2014, but no later than the general election in November 89 2022, whether to repeal application of the local sales tax to the titling of motor 90 vehicles, trailers, boats, and outboard motors that are subject to state sales tax 91 under section 144.020 and purchased from a source other than a licensed Missouri dealer. The ballot question presented to the local voters shall contain 92substantially the following language: 93

94 Shall the (local jurisdiction's name) discontinue applying 95 and collecting the local sales tax on the titling of motor vehicles, 96 trailers, boats, and outboard motors that were purchased from a 97 source other than a licensed Missouri dealer?

108 (3) If the ballot question set forth in subdivision (2) of this subsection 109 receives a majority of the votes cast in favor of the proposal, or if the local taxing 110 jurisdiction fails to place the ballot question before the voters on or before the 111 general election in November 2022, the local taxing jurisdiction shall cease 112applying the local sales tax to the titling of motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and 113 outboard motors that were purchased from a source other than a licensed Missouri dealer. 114

115(4) In addition to the requirement that the ballot question set forth in 116 subdivision (2) of this subsection be placed before the voters, the governing body 117of any local taxing jurisdiction that had previously imposed a local use tax on the 118 use of motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and outboard motors may, at any time, place 119 a proposal on the ballot at any election to repeal application of the local sales tax 120to the titling of motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and outboard motors purchased 121from a source other than a licensed Missouri dealer. If a majority of the votes 122cast by the registered voters voting thereon are in favor of the proposal to repeal 123application of the local sales tax to such titling, then the local sales tax shall no 124 longer be applied to the titling of motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and outboard 125motors purchased from a source other than a licensed Missouri dealer. If a 126majority of the votes cast by the registered voters voting thereon are opposed to 127the proposal to repeal application of the local sales tax to such titling, such 128application shall remain in effect.

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(5) In addition to the requirement that the ballot question set forth in

130subdivision (2) of this subsection be placed before the voters on or after the 131general election in November 2014, and on or before the general election in November 2022, whenever the governing body of any local taxing jurisdiction 132 imposing a local sales tax on the sale of motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and 133134outboard motors receives a petition, signed by fifteen percent of the registered voters of such jurisdiction voting in the last gubernatorial election, and calling 135for a proposal to be placed on the ballot at any election to repeal application of 136137the local sales tax to the titling of motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and outboard 138motors purchased from a source other than a licensed Missouri dealer, the 139governing body shall submit to the voters of such jurisdiction a proposal to repeal 140application of the local sales tax to such titling. If a majority of the votes cast by 141the registered voters voting thereon are in favor of the proposal to repeal 142application of the local sales tax to such titling, then the local sales tax shall no longer be applied to the titling of motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and outboard 143144motors purchased from a source other than a licensed Missouri dealer. If a

majority of the votes cast by the registered voters voting thereon are opposed to
the proposal to repeal application of the local sales tax to such titling, such
application shall remain in effect.

(6) Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to authorize the votersof any jurisdiction to repeal application of any state sales or use tax.

150(7) If any local sales tax on the titling of motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and outboard motors purchased from a source other than a licensed Missouri 151152dealer is repealed, such repeal shall take effect [on the first day of the second 153calendar quarter after the election] as provided in subsection 19 of this 154section. If any local sales tax on the titling of motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and outboard motors purchased from a source other than a licensed Missouri 155dealer is required to cease to be applied or collected due to failure of a local 156taxing jurisdiction to hold an election pursuant to subdivision (2) of this 157subsection, such cessation shall take effect on March 1, 2023. 158

(8) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, if any local sales tax on the titling of motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and outboard motors purchased from a source other than a licensed Missouri dealer is repealed after the general election in November 2014, or if the taxing jurisdiction failed to present the ballot to the voters at a general election on or before November 2022, then the governing body of such taxing jurisdiction may, at any election subsequent to the repeal or after the general election in November 2022, if the 166 jurisdiction failed to present the ballot to the voters, place before the voters the 167 issue of imposing a sales tax on the titling of motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and 168 outboard motors that are subject to state sales tax under section 144.020 that 169 were purchased from a source other than a licensed Missouri dealer. The ballot 170 question presented to the local voters shall contain substantially the following 171 language:

Shall the ______ (local jurisdiction's name) apply and collect the
local sales tax on the titling of motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and
outboard motors that are subject to state sales tax under section
144.020 and purchased from a source other than a licensed
Missouri dealer?

Approval of this measure will result in an increase of local revenue to provide for vital services for _____ (local jurisdiction's name), and it will remove a competitive advantage that non-Missouri dealers of motor vehicles, outboard motors, boats, and trailers have over Missouri dealers of motor vehicles, outboard motors, boats, and trailers.

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(9) If any local sales tax on the titling of motor vehicles, trailers, boats,
and outboard motors purchased from a source other than a licensed Missouri
dealer is adopted, such tax shall take effect and be imposed [on the first day of
the second calendar quarter after the election] as provided in subsection 19
of this section.

[6.] 5. On and after the effective date of any local sales tax imposed 192193 under the provisions of the local sales tax law, the director of revenue shall perform all functions incident to the administration, collection, enforcement, and 194195operation of the tax, and the director of revenue shall collect in addition to the sales tax for the state of Missouri all additional local sales taxes authorized under 196 197 the authority of the local sales tax law. All local sales taxes imposed under the 198local sales tax law together with all taxes imposed under the sales tax law of the state of Missouri shall be collected together and reported upon such forms and 199200 under such administrative rules and regulations as may be prescribed by the director of revenue. 201

[7.] 6. All applicable provisions contained in sections 144.010 to [144.525] 144.527 governing the state sales tax and section 32.057, the uniform confidentiality provision, shall apply to the collection of any local sales tax imposed under the local sales tax law except as modified by the local sales tax law.

207[8.] 7. All exemptions granted to agencies of government, organizations, 208persons and to the sale of certain articles and items of tangible personal property 209and taxable services under the provisions of sections 144.010 to [144.525] 210144.527, as these sections now read and as they may hereafter be amended, it 211being the intent of this general assembly to ensure that the same sales tax 212exemptions granted from the state sales tax law also be granted under the local 213sales tax law, are hereby made applicable to the imposition and collection of all 214local sales taxes imposed under the local sales tax law.

[9.] 8. The same sales tax permit, exemption certificate and retail certificate required by sections 144.010 to [144.525] 144.527 for the administration and collection of the state sales tax shall satisfy the requirements of the local sales tax law, and no additional permit or exemption certificate or retail certificate shall be required; except that the director of revenue may prescribe a form of exemption certificate for an exemption from any local sales tax imposed by the local sales tax law.

[10.] 9. All discounts allowed the retailer under the provisions of the state sales tax law for the collection of and for payment of taxes under the provisions of the state sales tax law are hereby allowed and made applicable to any local sales tax collected under the provisions of the local sales tax law.

[11.] **10.** The penalties provided in section 32.057 and sections 144.010 to [144.525] **144.527** for a violation of the provisions of those sections are hereby made applicable to violations of the provisions of the local sales tax law.

229[12.] 11. (1) For the purposes of any local sales tax imposed by an 230ordinance or order under the local sales tax law, all sales, except the sale of motor 231vehicles, trailers, boats, and outboard motors required to be titled under the laws of the state of Missouri, shall be deemed to be consummated at the place of 232233business of the retailer unless the tangible personal property sold is delivered by 234the retailer or his agent to an out-of-state destination. In the event a retailer has 235more than one place of business in this state which participates in the sale, the 236sale shall be deemed to be consummated at the place of business of the retailer 237where the initial order for the tangible personal property is taken, even though the order must be forwarded elsewhere for acceptance, approval of credit,shipment or billing. A sale by a retailer's agent or employee shall be deemed tobe consummated at the place of business from which he works.

(2) For the purposes of any local sales tax imposed by an ordinance or order under the local sales tax law, the sales tax upon the titling of all motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and outboard motors shall be imposed at the rate in effect at the location of the residence of the purchaser, and remitted to that local taxing entity, and not at the place of business of the retailer, or the place of business from which the retailer's agent or employee works.

(3) For the purposes of any local tax imposed by an ordinance or under the
local sales tax law on charges for mobile telecommunications services, all taxes
of mobile telecommunications service shall be imposed as provided in the Mobile
Telecommunications Sourcing Act, 4 U.S.C. Sections 116 through 124, as
amended.

[13.] 12. Local sales taxes shall not be imposed on the seller of motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and outboard motors required to be titled under the laws of the state of Missouri, but shall be collected from the purchaser by the director of revenue at the time application is made for a certificate of title, if the address of the applicant is within a taxing entity imposing a local sales tax under the local sales tax law.

258[14.] 13. The director of revenue and any of his deputies, assistants and 259employees who have any duties or responsibilities in connection with the 260collection, deposit, transfer, transmittal, disbursement, safekeeping, accounting, 261or recording of funds which come into the hands of the director of revenue under 262the provisions of the local sales tax law shall enter a surety bond or bonds 263payable to any and all taxing entities in whose behalf such funds have been 264collected under the local sales tax law in the amount of one hundred thousand dollars for each such tax; but the director of revenue may enter into a blanket 265266bond covering himself and all such deputies, assistants and employees. The cost 267of any premium for such bonds shall be paid by the director of revenue from the share of the collections under the sales tax law retained by the director of 268269revenue for the benefit of the state.

[15.] **14.** The director of revenue shall annually report on his management of each trust fund which is created under the local sales tax law and administration of each local sales tax imposed under the local sales tax law. He shall provide each taxing entity imposing one or more local sales taxes authorized by the local sales tax law with a detailed accounting of the source of all funds received by him for the taxing entity. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the state auditor shall annually audit each trust fund. A copy of the director's report and annual audit shall be forwarded to each taxing entity imposing one or more local sales taxes.

279[16.] 15. Within the boundaries of any taxing entity where one or more 280local sales taxes have been imposed, if any person is delinquent in the payment 281of the amount required to be paid by him under the local sales tax law or in the 282event a determination has been made against him for taxes and penalty under 283the local sales tax law, the limitation for bringing suit for the collection of the 284delinquent tax and penalty shall be the same as that provided in sections 144.010 285to [144.525] 144.527. Where the director of revenue has determined that suit 286must be filed against any person for the collection of delinquent taxes due the 287 state under the state sales tax law, and where such person is also delinquent in 288payment of taxes under the local sales tax law, the director of revenue shall notify the taxing entity in the event any person fails or refuses to pay the amount 289 290of any local sales tax due so that appropriate action may be taken by the taxing 291entity.

292[17.] **16.** Where property is seized by the director of revenue under the 293provisions of any law authorizing seizure of the property of a taxpayer who is 294delinquent in payment of the tax imposed by the state sales tax law, and where such taxpayer is also delinquent in payment of any tax imposed by the local sales 295296tax law, the director of revenue shall permit the taxing entity to join in any sale 297 of property to pay the delinquent taxes and penalties due the state and to the 298taxing entity under the local sales tax law. The proceeds from such sale shall 299 first be applied to all sums due the state, and the remainder, if any, shall be applied to all sums due such taxing entity. 300

301 [18.] 17. If a local sales tax has been in effect for at least one year under 302 the provisions of the local sales tax law and voters approve reimposition of the 303 same local sales tax at the same rate at an election as provided for in the local sales tax law prior to the date such tax is due to expire, the tax so reimposed 304 305 shall become effective [the first day of the first calendar quarter after the director 306 receives a certified copy of the ordinance, order or resolution accompanied by a 307 map clearly showing the boundaries thereof and the results of such election, 308 provided that such ordinance, order or resolution and all necessary accompanying 309 materials are received by the director at least thirty days prior to the expiration 310 of such tax. Any administrative cost or expense incurred by the state as a result 311 of the provisions of this subsection shall be paid by the city or county reimposing such tax] as provided by subsection 19 of this section. 312

313 18. If the boundaries of a city in which a sales tax has been imposed shall thereafter be changed or altered, the city clerk shall 314forward to the director of revenue by United States registered mail or 315 316 certified mail a certified copy of the ordinance adding or detaching territory from the city within ten days of adoption of the 317 ordinance. The ordinance shall reflect the effective date of the 318 319 ordinance and shall be accompanied by a map of the city clearly showing the territory added or detached from the city 320 321 boundaries. Upon receipt of the ordinance and map, the tax imposed 322 under the local sales tax law shall be effective in the added territory or 323 abolished in the detached territory on the first day of a calendar quarter after one hundred twenty days' notice to sellers. 324

325 19. (1) The effective date for the imposition, repeal, or rate 326 change of each local sales and use tax is the first day of the calendar 327 quarter after a minimum of one hundred twenty days' notice to sellers. 328 In all cases where notice is required to be made to the director of 329 revenue by a local taxing jurisdiction, such notice shall be made at 330 least one hundred twenty days prior to the effective date for the 331 imposition, repeal, or rate change of a local sales and use tax.

332 (2) The effective date for any local jurisdiction boundary change 333 for sales and use tax purposes is the first day of the calendar quarter 334 after a minimum of one hundred twenty days' notice to sellers.

335 20. (1) If a sales or use tax rate is increased, the new rate shall 336 apply to the first billing period starting on or after the effective date 337 of the increase;

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(2) If a sales or use tax rate is decreased, the new rate shall 339 apply to bills rendered on or after the effective date of the decrease.

66.620. 1. All county sales taxes collected by the director of revenue under sections 66.600 to 66.630 on behalf of any county[, less one percent for cost $\mathbf{2}$ 3 of collection which shall be deposited in the state's general revenue fund after payment of premiums for surety bonds as provided in section 32.087,] shall be 4 deposited in a special trust fund, which is hereby created, to be known as the $\mathbf{5}$ 6 "County Sales Tax Trust Fund". [The moneys in the county sales tax trust fund 7 shall not be deemed to be state funds and shall not be commingled with any funds

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of the state.] The director of revenue shall keep accurate records of the amount 8 9 of money in the trust fund which was collected in each county imposing a county sales tax, and the records shall be open to the inspection of officers of the county 10 and the public. Not later than the tenth day of each month, the director of 11 revenue shall distribute all moneys deposited in the trust fund during the 12preceding month to the county which levied the tax; such funds shall be deposited 13with the treasurer of the county and all expenditures of funds arising from the 14 15county sales tax trust fund shall be by an appropriation act to be enacted by the legislative council of the county, and to the cities, towns and villages located 1617wholly or partly within the county which levied the tax in the manner as set forth 18 in sections 66.600 to 66.630.

19 2. In any county not adopting an additional sales tax and alternate 20distribution system as provided in section 67.581, for the purposes of distributing the county sales tax, the county shall be divided into two groups, "Group A" and 2122"Group B". Group A shall consist of all cities, towns and villages which are located wholly or partly within the county which levied the tax and which had a 2324city sales tax in effect under the provisions of sections 94.500 to 94.550 on the 25day prior to the adoption of the county sales tax ordinance, except that beginning January 1, 1980, group A shall consist of all cities, towns and villages which are 26located wholly or partly within the county which levied the tax and which had a 2728city sales tax approved by the voters of such city under the provisions of sections 94.500 to 94.550 on the day prior to the effective date of the county sales tax. For 2930 the purposes of determining the location of consummation of sales for distribution 31of funds to cities, towns and villages in group A, the boundaries of any such city, 32town or village shall be the boundary of that city, town or village as it existed on March 19, 1984. Group B shall consist of all cities, towns and villages which are 33 located wholly or partly within the county which levied the tax and which did not 34have a city sales tax in effect under the provisions of sections 94.500 to 94.550 on 35the day prior to the adoption of the county sales tax ordinance, and shall also 36 37include all unincorporated areas of the county which levied the tax; except that, beginning January 1, 1980, group B shall consist of all cities, towns and villages 38 39 which are located wholly or partly within the county which levied the tax and 40 which did not have a city sales tax approved by the voters of such city under the 41 provisions of sections 94.500 to 94.550 on the day prior to the effective date of the 42county sales tax and shall also include all unincorporated areas of the county 43which levied the tax.

Until January 1, 1994, the director of revenue shall distribute to the 45cities, towns and villages in group A the taxes based on the location in which the sales were deemed consummated under section 66.630 and subsection 12 of 46 section 32.087. (1) From and after January 1, 2017, in each year in which the total 81 revenues from the county sales tax collected under sections 66.600 to 66.630 in 82 the previous calendar year are less than or equal to the amount of such revenues 83 84 which were collected in the calendar year 2014, the director of revenue shall distribute to the cities, towns, and villages in group A and the cities, towns, and 85 villages, and the county in group B, the amounts required to be distributed under 86 the formula described in subsection 4 and in subsection 6 of this section. After deducting the distribution to the cities, towns, and 9596 villages in group A, the director of revenue shall, subject to the limitation described in subdivision (2) of this subsection, distribute funds in the county sales 97 tax trust fund to the cities, towns, and villages, and the county in group B as 98 follows: to the county which levied the tax, ten percent multiplied by the 99 100 percentage of the population of unincorporated county which has been annexed or incorporated since April 1, 1993, multiplied by the total of all sales tax 101 102revenues countywide, and a percentage of the remaining distributable revenue 103 equal to the percentage ratio that the population of unincorporated areas of the 104 county bears to the total population of group B as adjusted such that no city, town, or village in group B shall receive a distribution that is less than fifty 105106 percent of the amount of taxes generated within such city, town, or village based on the location in which the sales were deemed consummated under section 107 108 66.630 and subsection 12 of section 32.087; and to each city, town, or village in 109group B located wholly within the taxing county, a percentage of the remaining 110 distributable revenue equal to the percentage ratio that the population of such city, town, or village bears to the total population of group B, as adjusted such 111 112 that no city, town, or village in group B shall receive a distribution that is less 113than fifty percent of the amount of taxes generated within such city, town, or 114 village based on the location in which the sales were deemed consummated under 115section 66.630 and subsection 12 of section 32.087; and to each city, town, or

116 village located partly within the taxing county, a percentage of the remaining 117distributable revenue equal to the percentage ratio that the population of that 118 part of the city, town, or village located within the taxing county bears to the 119 total population of group B, as adjusted such that no city, town, or village in 120group B shall receive a distribution that is less than fifty percent of the amount 121 of taxes generated within such city, town, or village based on the location in 122which the sales were deemed consummated under section 66.630 and subsection 12312 of section 32.087.

124(2) For purposes of making any adjustment required by this subsection, 125the director of revenue shall, prior to any distribution to the county or to each 126 city, town, or village in group B located wholly or partly within the taxing county, 127identify each city, town, or village in group B located wholly or partly within the 128taxing county that would receive a distribution that is less than fifty percent of 129the amount of taxes generated within such city, town, or village based on the 130location in which the sales were deemed consummated under section 66.630 and subsection 12 of section 32.087 if no adjustments were made and calculate the 131132difference between the amount that the distribution to each such city, town, or 133 village would have been without any adjustment and the amount that equals fifty 134percent of the amount of taxes generated within such city, town, or village based 135on the location in which the sales were deemed consummated under section 66.630 and subsection 12 of section 32.087. 153(b) If, however, the aggregate amount of the difference calculated in 154accordance with this subsection is greater that the aggregate increase in the remaining distributable revenue for the applicable period in the current calendar 155156year over the remaining distributable revenue for the corresponding period in the calendar year 2014, the director of revenue shall deduct from the remaining 157distributable revenue an amount equal to the difference between the remaining 158159distributable revenue for the applicable period in the current calendar year and 160 the remaining distributable revenue for the corresponding period in the calendar 161 year 2014 and distribute an allocable portion of the amount of such difference to 162 each city, town, or village that would otherwise have received a distribution that 163 is less than fifty percent of the amount of taxes generated within such city, town, 164 or village based on the location in which the sales were deemed consummated under section 66.630 and subsection 12 of section 32.087 if no adjustment were 165166 made, such that each such city, town, or village receives a distribution that 167 includes an adjustment that is proportionate to the amount of the adjustment 168 that would otherwise have been made if such adjustment were calculated in 169 accordance with paragraph (a) of this subdivision;

170 (c) After determining the amount of the adjustment and making the 171 allocation in accordance with paragraph (a) or (b) of this subdivision, as 172 applicable, the director of revenue shall thereafter distribute the remaining 173 distributable revenue, as adjusted, to the county and to each city, town, or village 174 in group B located wholly or partly within the taxing county in the manner 175 provided in this subsection.

During 1995, each group A city, 212town and village shall receive that portion of the revenues arising from sales 213occurring within the municipality that remains after deducting therefrom an 214amount equal to the cumulative sales tax revenues arising from sales within the 215municipality multiplied by the percentage which is the sum of ten percent 216multiplied by the percentage of the population of unincorporated county which 217has been annexed or incorporated after April 1, 1993, and the percentage, if greater than zero, equal to the product of seventeen multiplied by the logarithm 218219(to base 10) of the product of 0.035 multiplied by the total of cumulative per 220capita sales taxes arising from sales within the municipality less the adjusted 221county average. From January 1, 1996, until January 1, 2000, each group A city, 222 town and village shall receive that portion of the revenues arising from sales 223occurring within the municipality that remains after deducting therefrom an

224amount equal to the cumulative sales tax revenues arising from sales within the 225municipality multiplied by the percentage which is the sum of ten percent multiplied by the percentage of the population of unincorporated county which 226 227has been annexed or incorporated after April 1, 1993, and the percentage, if 228greater than zero, equal to the product of 25.5 multiplied by the logarithm (to 229base 10) of the product of 0.035 multiplied by the total of cumulative per capita 230sales taxes arising from sales within the municipality less the adjusted county 231average. From and after January 1, 2000, the distribution formula covering the 232period from January 1, 1996, until January 1, 2000, shall continue to apply, 233except that the percentage computed for sales arising within the municipalities 234shall be not less than 7.5 percent for municipalities within which sales tax 235revenues exceed the adjusted county average, nor less than 12.5 percent for 236municipalities within which sales tax revenues exceed the adjusted county 237average by at least twenty-five percent.

(3) For purposes of applying the redistribution formula to a municipality which is partly within the county levying the tax, the distribution shall be calculated alternately for the municipality as a whole, except that the factor for annexed portion of the county shall not be applied to the portion of the municipality which is not within the county levying the tax, and for the portion of the municipality within the county levying the tax. Whichever calculation results in the larger distribution to the municipality shall be used.

(4) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the fifty percent 245246of additional sales taxes as described in section 99.845 arising from economic 247activities within the area of a redevelopment project established after July 12, 1990, pursuant to sections 99.800 to 99.865, while tax increment financing 248remains in effect shall be deducted from all calculations of countywide sales 249taxes, shall be distributed directly to the municipality involved, and shall be 250disregarded in calculating the amounts distributed or distributable to the 251municipality. After the effective 281date of the annexation or consolidation, the annexing or consolidated city, town 282or village shall receive a percentage of the group B distributable revenue equal 283to the percentage ratio that the population of the annexed or consolidated area 284bears to the total population of group B and such annexed area shall not be 285classified as unincorporated area for determination of the percentage allocable to 286the county. If the qualified voters of any two or more cities, towns or villages in group A each vote to consolidate such cities, towns or villages, then such 287288 consolidated cities, towns or villages shall remain a part of group A. For the 289purpose of sections 66.600 to 66.630, population shall be as determined by the 290last federal decennial census or the latest census that determines the total 291population of the county and all political subdivisions therein. For the purpose 292 of calculating the adjustment based on the percentage of unincorporated county 293population which is annexed after April 1, 1993, the accumulated percentage 294immediately before each census shall be used as the new percentage base after 295such census. After any annexation, incorporation or other municipal boundary 296change affecting the unincorporated area of the county, the chief elected official 297of the county shall certify the new population of the unincorporated area of the county and the percentage of the population which has been annexed or 298299incorporated since April 1, 1993, to the director of revenue. There is hereby specifically exempted from the provisions of $\mathbf{2}$ [sections 144.010 to 144.525] this chapter and from the computation of the tax levied, assessed or payable [pursuant to sections 144.010 to 144.525] this 3 chapter such retail sales as may be made in commerce between this state and 4 any other state of the United States, or between this state and any foreign $\mathbf{5}$ 6 country, and any retail sale which the state of Missouri is prohibited from taxing pursuant to the Constitution or laws of the United States of America, and such 7retail sales of tangible personal property which the general assembly of the state 8 9 of Missouri is prohibited from taxing or further taxing by the constitution of this 10 state.

There are also specifically exempted from the provisions of the local sales tax law as defined in section 32.085, section 238.235, and [sections 144.010 to 144.525 and 144.600 to 144.761] **this chapter** and from the computation of the tax levied, assessed or payable pursuant to the local sales tax law as defined in section 32.085, section 238.235, and [sections 144.010 to 144.525 and 144.600 to 144.745] **this chapter**:

(1) Motor fuel or special fuel subject to an excise tax of this state, unless
all or part of such excise tax is refunded pursuant to section 142.824; or upon the

31 (2) Materials, manufactured goods, machinery and parts which when used 32in manufacturing, processing, compounding, mining, producing or fabricating 33 become a component part or ingredient of the new personal property resulting 34from such manufacturing, processing, compounding, mining, producing or fabricating and which new personal property is intended to be sold ultimately for 35 36 final use or consumption; and materials, including without limitation, gases and manufactured goods, including without limitation slagging materials and 37 38firebrick, which are ultimately consumed in the manufacturing process by blending, reacting or interacting with or by becoming, in whole or in part, 39 40 component parts or ingredients of steel products intended to be sold ultimately for final use or consumption; 41

42 (3) Materials, replacement parts and equipment purchased for use directly
43 upon, and for the repair and maintenance or manufacture of, motor vehicles,
44 watercraft, railroad rolling stock or aircraft engaged as common carriers of
45 persons or property;

46 (4) Replacement machinery, equipment, and parts and the materials and supplies solely required for the installation or construction of such replacement 47machinery, equipment, and parts, used directly in manufacturing, mining, 48 fabricating or producing a product which is intended to be sold ultimately for 49 final use or consumption; and machinery and equipment, and the materials and 50supplies required solely for the operation, installation or construction of such 51machinery and equipment, purchased and used to establish new, or to replace or 52expand existing, material recovery processing plants in this state. For the 5354purposes of this subdivision, a "material recovery processing plant" means a 55facility that has as its primary purpose the recovery of materials into a usable 56product or a different form which is used in producing a new product and shall 57include a facility or equipment which are used exclusively for the collection of

recovered materials for delivery to a material recovery processing plant but shall 58not include motor vehicles used on highways. For purposes of this section, the 59terms motor vehicle and highway shall have the same meaning pursuant to 60 section 301.010. For the purposes of this subdivision, subdivision (5) of this 61 62 subsection, and section 144.054, as well as the definition in subdivision (9) of subsection 1 of section 144.010, the term "product" includes telecommunications 63 services and the term "manufacturing" shall include the production, or production 64 and transmission, of telecommunications services. The construction and application of this subdivision as 7980 expressed by the Missouri supreme court in DST Systems, Inc. v. Director of 81 Revenue, 43 S.W.3d 799 (Mo. banc 2001); Southwestern Bell Tel. Co. v. Director of Revenue, 78 S.W.3d 763 (Mo. banc 2002); and Southwestern Bell Tel. Co. v. 82 Director of Revenue, 182 S.W.3d 226 (Mo. banc 2005), is hereby 83 affirmed. Material recovery is not the reuse of materials within a manufacturing 84 process or the use of a product previously recovered. The material recovery 85 86 processing plant shall qualify under the provisions of this section regardless of 87 ownership of the material being recovered;

(21) All ticket sales made by benevolent, scientific and educational associations which are formed to foster, encourage, and promote progress and improvement in the science of agriculture and in the raising and breeding of animals, and by nonprofit summer theater organizations if such organizations are exempt from federal tax pursuant to the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code and all admission charges and entry fees to the Missouri state fair or any fair conducted by a county agricultural and mechanical society organized and 202 operated pursuant to sections 262.290 to 262.530;

144.123. 1. The director shall provide and maintain a database 2 that describes boundary changes for all taxing jurisdictions and the 3 effective dates of such changes for sales and use tax purposes.

2. The director shall provide and maintain a database of all sales and use tax rates for all taxing jurisdictions. For the identification of counties and cities, codes corresponding to the rates shall be provided according to Federal Information Processing Standards (FIPS) as developed by the National Institute of Standards and Technology. For the identification of all other jurisdictions, codes corresponding to the rates shall be in a format determined by the director.

11 3. The director shall provide and maintain a database that assigns each five- and nine-digit zip code to the proper rates and taxing 12jurisdictions. The lowest combined tax rate imposed in the zip code 13 area shall apply if the area includes more than one tax rate in any level 14 of taxing jurisdiction. If a nine-digit zip code designation is not 1516 available for a street address, or if a seller or a certified service 17provider (CSP) is unable to determine the nine-digit zip code designation applicable to a purchase after exercising due diligence to 18 determine the designation, the seller or CSP may apply the rate for the 19 20 five-digit zip code area. For purposes of this section, there shall be a rebuttable presumption that a seller or CSP has exercised due diligence 2122if the seller has attempted to determine the nine-digit zip code 23designation by utilizing software approved by the governing board that 24makes this designation from the street address and the five-digit zip 25code applicable to a purchase.

264. The director may provide address-based boundary database records for assigning taxing jurisdictions and associated rates which 2728shall be in addition to the requirements of subsection 3 of this 29section. The database records shall be in the same approved format as the database records required under subsection 3 of this section and 30 shall meet the requirements developed pursuant to the federal Mobile 31 32Telecommunications Sourcing Act, 4 U.S.C. Section 119(a). If the director develops address-based assignment database records sellers 33 and CSPs shall be required to use such database. A seller or CSP shall 34use such database records in place of the five- and nine-digit zip code 3536 database records provided for in subsection 3 of this section. If a seller or CSP is unable to determine the applicable rate and jurisdiction 37

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38 using an address-based database record after exercising due diligence, the seller or CSP may apply the nine-digit zip code designation 39 applicable to a purchase. If a nine-digit zip code designation is not 40 available for a street address or if a seller or CSP is unable to 41 determine the nine-digit zip code designation applicable to a purchase 4243after exercising due diligence to determine the designation, the seller or CSP may apply the rate for the five-digit zip code area. For the 44 purposes of this section, there shall be a rebuttable presumption that 4546 a seller or CSP has exercised due diligence if the seller or CSP has attempted to determine the tax rate and jurisdiction by utilizing 47software approved by the director and makes the assignment from the 48address and zip code information applicable to the purchase. If the 49 director has met the requirements of subsection 3 of this section, the 50director may also elect to certify vendor provided address-based 51databases for assigning tax rates and jurisdictions. The databases shall 5253be in the same approved format as the database records under this section and meet the requirements developed pursuant to the federal 5455Mobile Telecommunications Sourcing Act, 4 U.S.C. Section 119(a). If the director certifies a vendor address-based database, a seller or CSP may 5657use such database in place of the database provided for in this subsection. 58

595. The electronic databases provided for in subsections 1, 2, 3, 60 and 4 of this section shall be in downloadable format as determined by 61 the director. The databases may be directly provided by the director 62 or provided by a vendor as designated by the director. A database 63 provided by a vendor as designated by the director shall be applicable and subject to the provisions of this section. The databases shall be 64 provided at no cost to the user of the database. The provisions of 65subsections 3 and 4 of this section shall not apply when the purchased 66 product is received by the purchaser at the business location of the 67 seller. 68

69 6. No seller or CSP shall be liable for reliance upon erroneous 70 data provided or approved by the director on tax rates, boundaries, or 71 taxing jurisdiction assignments, and no seller shall be liable for 72 erroneous returns made by a CSP on behalf of the seller.

In lieu of a database provided under this section, a certified 74 service provider, seller, or marketplace facilitator as defined under section 144.752, may utilize proprietary data that provides information on sales and use tax rates for all taxing jurisdictions, provided the director of revenue certifies that such proprietary data at a minimum meets the requirements of the database required under the provisions of this section.

144.124. 1. The director shall complete a taxability matrix. The 2 state's entries in the matrix shall be provided and maintained by the 3 director in a database that is in a downloadable format.

4 2. The director shall provide reasonable notice of changes in the 5 taxability of the products or services listed in the taxability matrix.

6 3. A seller or CSP shall be relieved from liability to this state or 7 any local taxing jurisdiction for having charged and collected the 8 incorrect amount of state or local sales or use tax resulting from such 9 seller's or CSP's reliance upon erroneous data provided or approved by 10 the director in the taxability matrix, and a seller shall be relieved from

11 liability for erroneous returns made by a CSP on behalf of the seller.

144.140. 1. From every remittance to the director of revenue made on or 2 before the date when the same becomes due, the person required to remit the 3 same shall be entitled to deduct and retain an amount equal to two percent 4 thereof.

5 2. The director shall provide a monetary allowance from the 6 taxes collected to a CSP under the terms of the contract signed with the 7 provider, provided that such allowance shall be funded entirely from 8 money collected by the CSP.

9 3. Any vendor receiving an allowance under subsection 2 of this
10 section shall not be entitled to simultaneously deduct the allowance
11 provided for under subsection 1 of this section.

144.190. 1. If a tax has been incorrectly computed by reason of a clerical error or mistake on the part of the director of revenue, such fact shall be set forth in the records of the director of revenue, and the amount of the overpayment shall be credited on any taxes then due from the person legally obligated to remit the tax under **this** chapter [144], and the balance shall be refunded to the person legally obligated to remit the tax, such person's administrators or executors, as provided for in section 144.200.

8 2. If any tax, penalty or interest has been paid more than once, or has 9 been erroneously or illegally collected, or has been erroneously or illegally 10 computed, such sum shall be credited on any taxes then due from the person 11 legally obligated to remit the tax under **this** chapter [144], and the balance, with 12 interest as determined by section 32.065, shall be refunded to the person legally 13 obligated to remit the tax, but no such credit or refund shall be allowed unless 14 duplicate copies of a claim for refund are filed within ten years from date of 15 overpayment.

16 3. Every claim for refund must be in writing and signed by the applicant, and must state the specific grounds upon which the claim is founded. 46 that have been made to obtain an assignment of rights from the vendor or 47 seller. Such statement shall contain a list of the transactions covered by the 48 assignment, the tax periods and location for which the original sale was reported 49 to the director of revenue by the vendor or seller.

The director shall not require such vendor, seller, or purchaser to submit 50amended returns for refund claims submitted under the provisions of this 5152subsection. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 32.057, if the seller is registered with the director for collection and remittance of sales tax, the director 53shall notify the seller at the seller's last known address of the claim for refund. 54If the seller objects to the refund within thirty days of the date of the notice, the 5556director shall not pay the refund. If the seller agrees that the refund is warranted or fails to respond within thirty days, the director may issue the 5758refund and amend the seller's return to reflect the refund. 5.] Amounts which a vendor charges to and receives from the purchaser in accordance with this section shall not be includable in his gross receipts if the amounts are separately charged or stated.

31[6.] 5. If sales tax for one or more local political subdivisions is owed by 32a taxpayer pursuant to chapter 66, 67, 92, or 94 and that taxpayer remits less than all sales tax due for a filing period specified in section 144.080, the director 33 34of revenue shall deposit the tax remitted proportionately to each taxing 35jurisdiction in accordance with the percentage that each such jurisdiction's share 36 of the tax due for the filing period bears to the total tax due from such taxpayer for such period. The unpaid balance due along with penalties and interest shall 3738 be similarly prorated among the state and all local jurisdictions for which tax was due during the filing period for which an underpayment occurs. The retailer shall offer a sales tax refund in lieu of the sales tax holiday.] A sale of property which is eligible for an exemption under subsection 1 of this section but is purchased under a layaway sale shall only qualify for an exemption if:

(1) Final payment on a layaway order is made by, and the
property is given to, the purchaser during the exemption period; or

(1) For any discount offered by a seller that is a reduction of the sales price of the product, the discounted sales price shall determine whether the sales price falls below the price threshold provided in subsection 1 of this section. A coupon that reduces the sales price shall be treated as a discount only if the seller is not reimbursed for the coupon amount by a third party.

(2) If a discount applies to the total amount paid by a purchaser rather than to the sales price of a particular product and the purchaser has purchased both exempt property and taxable property, the seller shall allocate the discount based on the total sales prices of the taxable property compared to the total sales prices of all property sold in the same transaction.

6. Items that are normally sold as a single unit shall continue to
be sold in that manner and shall not be priced separately and sold as
individual items.

Items that are purchased during an exemption period but that 51 are not delivered to the purchaser until after the exemption period due 52 to the item not being in stock shall qualify for an exemption. The 53 provisions of this subsection shall not apply to an item that was 54 delivered during an exemption period but was purchased prior to or 55 after the exemption period.
