AN ACT

To repeal sections 171.031 and 171.033, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to half-day educational programs.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 171.031 and 171.033, RSMo, are

- 2 repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be
- 3 known as sections 171.031 and 171.033, to read as follows:

171.031. 1. Each school board shall prepare annually

- 2 a calendar for the school term, specifying the opening date,
- 3 days of planned attendance, and providing a minimum term of
- 4 at least one hundred seventy-four days for schools with a
- 5 five-day school week or one hundred forty-two days for
- 6 schools with a four-day school week, and one thousand forty-
- 7 four hours of actual pupil attendance. In school year 2019-
- 8 20 and subsequent years, one thousand forty-four hours of
- 9 actual pupil attendance shall be required for the school
- 10 term with no minimum number of school days. In addition,
- 11 such calendar shall include six make-up days for possible
- 12 loss of attendance due to inclement weather as defined in
- 13 subsection 1 of section 171.033. In school year 2019-20 and
- 14 subsequent years, such calendar shall include thirty-six
- 15 make-up hours for possible loss of attendance due to
- 16 inclement weather, as defined in subsection 1 of section
- 17 171.033, with no minimum number of make-up days.

- 18 2. Each local school district may set its opening date each year, which date shall be no earlier than fourteen 19 20 calendar days prior to the first Monday in September. No public school district shall select an earlier start date 21 22 unless, for calendars for school years before school year 23 2020-21, the district follows the procedure set forth in subsection 3 of this section. 24 The procedure set forth in 25 subsection 3 of this section shall be unavailable to school districts in preparing their calendars for school year 2020-26 27 21 and for subsequent years.
- For calendars for school years before school year 28 2020-21, a district may set an opening date that is more 29 30 than fourteen calendar days prior to the first Monday in September only if the local school board first gives public 31 notice of a public meeting to discuss the proposal of 32 opening school on a date more than fourteen days prior to 33 the first Monday in September, and the local school board 34 35 holds said meeting and, at the same public meeting, a 36 majority of the board votes to allow an earlier opening date. If all of the previous conditions are met, the 37 district may set its opening date more than fourteen 38 calendar days prior to the first Monday in September. 39 condition provided in this subsection must be satisfied by 40 41 the local school board each year that the board proposes an opening date more than fourteen days before the first Monday 42 43 in September.
- 4. If any local district violates the provisions of this section, the department of elementary and secondary education shall withhold an amount equal to one quarter of the state funding the district generated under section 163.031 for each date the district was in violation of this section.

- 50 5. The provisions of subsections 2 to 4 of this 51 section shall not apply to school districts in which school 52 is in session for twelve months of each calendar year.
- 53 6. The state board of education may grant an exemption 54 from this section to a school district that demonstrates 55 highly unusual and extenuating circumstances justifying 56 exemption from the provisions of subsections 2 to 4 of this 57 section. Any exemption granted by the state board of 58 education shall be valid for one academic year only.
 - 7. Notwithstanding any provision of this section or section 171.033 to the contrary, for the purposes of any half-day educational program, any minimum number of hours of actual pupil attendance or minimum number of make-up hours required pursuant to such sections shall be reduced by one-half of such number.
 - 171.033. 1. "Inclement weather", for purposes of this section, shall be defined as ice, snow, extreme cold, excessive heat, flooding, or a tornado.
 - 2. (1) A district shall be required to make up the first six days of school lost or cancelled due to inclement weather and half the number of days lost or cancelled in excess of six days if the makeup of the days is necessary to ensure that the district's students will attend a minimum of one hundred forty-two days and a minimum of one thousand forty-four hours for the school year except as otherwise provided in this section. Schools with a four-day school week may schedule such make-up days on Fridays.
- 13 (2) Notwithstanding subdivision (1) of this
 14 subsection, in school year 2019-20 and subsequent years, a
 15 district shall be required to make up the first thirty-six
 16 hours of school lost or cancelled due to inclement weather
 17 and half the number of hours lost or cancelled in excess of

18 thirty-six if the makeup of the hours is necessary to ensure

- 19 that the district's students attend a minimum of one
- 20 thousand forty-four hours for the school year, except as
- 21 otherwise provided under subsections 3 and 4 of this section.
- 3. (1) In the 2009-10 school year and subsequent
- 23 years, a school district may be exempt from the requirement
- 24 to make up days of school lost or cancelled due to inclement
- 25 weather in the school district when the school district has
- 26 made up the six days required under subsection 2 of this
- 27 section and half the number of additional lost or cancelled
- 28 days up to eight days, resulting in no more than ten total
- 29 make-up days required by this section.
- 30 (2) In school year 2019-20 and subsequent years, a
- 31 school district may be exempt from the requirement to make
- 32 up school lost or cancelled due to inclement weather in the
- 33 school district when the school district has made up the
- 34 thirty-six hours required under subsection 2 of this section
- 35 and half the number of additional lost or cancelled hours up
- 36 to forty-eight, resulting in no more than sixty total make-
- 37 up hours required by this section.
- 38 4. The commissioner of education may provide, for any
- 39 school district that cannot meet the minimum school calendar
- 40 requirement of at least one hundred seventy-four days for
- 41 schools with a five-day school week or one hundred forty-two
- 42 days for schools with a four-day school week and one
- 43 thousand forty-four hours of actual pupil attendance or, in
- 44 school year 2019-20 and subsequent years, one thousand forty-
- 45 four hours of actual pupil attendance, upon request, a
- 46 waiver to be excused from such requirement. This waiver
- 47 shall be requested from the commissioner of education and
- 48 may be granted if the school was closed due to circumstances

- 51 5. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, in school year 2020-21 and subsequent years, a 52 district shall not be required to make up any hours of 53 school lost or cancelled due to exceptional or emergency 54 55 circumstances during a school year if the district has an 56 alternative methods of instruction plan approved by the department of elementary and secondary education for such 57 58 school year. Exceptional or emergency circumstances shall include, but not be limited to, inclement weather, a utility 59 outage, or an outbreak of a contagious disease. 60 61 department of elementary and secondary education shall not approve any such plan unless the district demonstrates that 62 the plan will not negatively impact teaching and learning in 63 64 the district.
 - emergency circumstances and the district has an approved alternative methods of instruction plan, the district shall notify students and parents on each day of the closure whether the alternative methods of instruction plan is to be implemented for that day. If the plan is to be implemented on any day of the closure, the district shall ensure that each student receives assignments for that day in hard copy form or receives instruction through virtual learning or another method of instruction.
- 75 (3) A district with an approved alternative methods of
 76 instruction plan shall not use alternative methods of
 77 instruction as provided for in the plan for more than thirty78 six hours during a school year. A district that has used
 79 such alternative methods of instruction for thirty-six hours
 80 during a school year shall be required, notwithstanding

subsections 2 and 3 of this section, to make up any subsequent hours of school lost or cancelled due to exceptional or emergency circumstances during such school year.

- 85 (4) The department of elementary and secondary 86 education shall give districts with approved alternative 87 methods of instruction plans credit for the hours in which 88 they use alternative methods of instruction by considering 89 such hours as hours in which school was actually in session.
- 90 (5) Any district wishing to use alternative methods of 91 instruction under this subsection shall submit an 92 application to the department of elementary and secondary 93 education. The application shall describe:
 - (a) The manner in which the district intends to strengthen and reinforce instructional content while supporting student learning outside the classroom environment;
 - (b) The process the district intends to use to communicate to students and parents the decision to implement alternative methods of instruction on any day of a closure;
- 102 (c) The manner in which the district intends to
 103 communicate the purpose and expectations for a day in which
 104 alternative methods of instruction will be implemented to
 105 students and parents;
- 106 (d) The assignments and materials to be used within
 107 the district for days in which alternative methods of
 108 instruction will be implemented to effectively facilitate
 109 teaching and support learning for the benefit of the
 110 students;
- (e) The manner in which student attendance will be determined for a day in which alternative methods of

instruction will be implemented. The method chosen shall be

- 114 linked to completion of lessons and activities;
- 115 (f) The instructional methods, which shall include
- 116 instruction through electronic means and instruction through
- 117 other means for students who have no access to internet
- 118 services or a computer;
- 119 (q) Instructional plans for students with
- 120 individualized education programs; and
- (h) The role and responsibility of certified personnel
- 122 to be available to communicate with students.
- 6. For the 2018-19 school year, a district shall be
- 124 exempt from the requirements of subsections 2 and 3 of this
- section, and only be required to make up the first six days
- of school lost or cancelled due to inclement weather.
- 7. Notwithstanding any provision of this section or
- section 171.031 to the contrary, for the purposes of any
- 129 half-day educational program, any minimum number of hours of
- actual pupil attendance or minimum number of make-up hours
- 131 required pursuant to such sections shall be reduced by one-
- 132 half of such number.
