AN ACT

To amend chapter 208, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to illegal drug use of applicants and recipients of temporary assistance for needy families benefits.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 208, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 208.027, to read as follows:

208.027. 1. The department of social services shall develop a program to screen and test each work-eligible applicant or work- $\mathbf{2}$ eligible recipient who is otherwise eligible for temporary assistance for 3 needy families benefits under this chapter and who the department has 4 reasonable cause to believe, based on the screening, engages in illegal $\mathbf{5}$ use of controlled substances. Any applicant or recipient who is found 6 7 to have tested positive for the use of a controlled substance, which was not prescribed for such applicant or recipient by a licensed health care 8 provider, shall, after an administrative hearing conducted by the 9 department under the provisions of chapter 536, be declared ineligible 10 for temporary assistance for needy families benefits for a period of one 11 year from the date of the administrative hearing decision. The 1213department shall refer an applicant or recipient who tested positive for 14 the use of a controlled substance under this section to an appropriate 15substance abuse treatment program approved by the division of alcohol 16and drug abuse within the department of mental health. Other 17members of a household which includes a person who has been declared ineligible for temporary assistance for needy families 18 19assistance shall, if otherwise eligible, continue to receive temporary assistance for needy families benefits as protective or vendor payments 20

21 to a third-party payee for the benefit of the members of the household.

222. The department of social services shall promulgate rules to develop the screening and testing provisions of this section. Any rule 23or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010 that is 24created under the authority delegated in this section shall become 25effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions 26of chapter 536, and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and 27chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the 28general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, to review, to delay the 29effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held 30 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule 3132proposed or adopted after August 28, 2011, shall be invalid and void.
