AN ACT

To amend chapter 192, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to mandatory influenza vaccinations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 192, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new $\mathbf{2}$ section, to be known as section 192.075, to read as follows:

192.075. 1. As used in this section, the following terms mean:

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(1) "Department", the department of health and senior services;

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(2) "Inspected facility", any private or public institution, facility or agency, whether organized for profit or not, used, operated, or 4 5designed to provide health services, medical treatment, or nursing, 6 rehabilitative, or preventative care to any person or persons that is 7 inspected by the department;

8 (3) "Volunteer", any individual working without compensation at 9 an inspected facility who has significant and direct contact with 10 patients at that facility.

11 2. Each year between October first and March first, all employees and volunteers of any inspected facility shall be required to receive an 1213 influenza vaccination, unless contraindicated, in accordance with the 14 latest recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and subject to the availability of the vaccine. An employee 1516 or volunteer commencing work during the flu season shall be required 17 to receive an influenza vaccination within two weeks of commencing 18 work. Nothing in this section shall be construed as requiring the department or any inspected facility to provide or pay for such 19 20 influenza vaccinations.

213. An exemption for the influenza vaccination requirement under 22this section shall be granted for medical contraindications, religious 23beliefs, or in the case of a vaccine shortage. Employees or volunteers requesting exemption due to medical contraindications shall, upon the 24request of the department, provide proof of medical contraindications 2526such as a letter from a physician or medical records. Employees or volunteers requesting exemption due to religious beliefs shall, upon the 2728request of the department, provide a written and signed request stating the reason for exemption. If any employee or volunteer is unable to 29receive an influenza vaccination due to a shortage of influenza 30 vaccines, the employee or volunteer shall, upon the request of the 31department, provide written documentation of his or her failure to 3233 obtain a vaccination for this reason.

34 4. The department may request proof of employee and volunteer influenza vaccinations during the course of any inspection of the 35 36 facility. All employees and volunteers who were employed or volunteering at the facility at the time the department made the 37request shall provide the inspected facility with such proof or with 38 39 proof of an exemption, as described in subsection 3 of this section, within seven days of the department's request. The inspected facility 40 shall make available such proof of vaccination or exemption to the 41 42 department within fourteen days of the department's initial request.

5. An inspected facility shall be deemed not in compliance with
the provisions of this section if, after the department's initial request,
less than ninety-five percent of the facility's employees provide proof
of vaccination or exemption. If a facility is deemed not in compliance,
the department may again request such proof within three months of
the initial request.

6. All inspected facilities shall post a sign in a conspicuous 49location of a minimum size of eleven inches by fourteen inches with the 50following statement in letters of no less than one inch: "MISSOURI 5152LAW REQUIRES EMPLOYEES AND VOLUNTEERS AT THIS FACILITY TO RECEIVE AN INFLUENZA VACCINATION EACH YEAR", and the 53following statement in no less than twelve-point font: "Proof of receipt 54of the influenza vaccination or proof of a medical or religious 5556 exemption or vaccine shortage must be provided upon the request of the Department of Health and Senior Services." 57

58 7. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require the 59 department to conduct an inspection only for the purposes of 60 determining compliance with vaccination requirements. The 61 department shall not issue any citation or any other penalty to an 62 inspected facility for failure to comply with the requirements of this 63 section.

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8. The provisions of this section shall automatically expire six
years after the effective date of this section, unless reauthorized by an
act of the general assembly.
