AN ACT

To amend chapter 142, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to economic subsidies for qualified gaseous biofuel producers.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 142, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 142.041, to read as follows:

142.041. 1. As used in this section, the following terms shall 2 mean:

- (1) "BTU of gaseous biofuel", British thermal unit of measurement to express the energy content of fuels. BTU is the expression of 1 BTU and use a conversion formula, as appropriate, that is published in the Federal Register as conversion factor for gaseous biofuel;
- 7 (2) "Gaseous biofuel", methane-based fuel derived from bio-waste 8 material, including animal waste, animal processing waste, pre and 9 post-consumer food waste, vegetative waste material, cardboard, and 10 paper waste materials and similar materials that are produced through 11 an anaerobic digester process, with the exclusion of landfills, that is 12 injected into the natural gas pipeline grid for delivery to the market;
- (3) "Gaseous biofuel certification", biofuel that meets commercially-acceptable natural gas pipeline quality standards of the local market, that the flow meters used to determine the quantity of gaseous biofuel produced are industry standard and properly calibrated by a third-party professional engineer, and the readings have been taken by a qualified individual;
- 19 (4) "MMBTU of gaseous biofuel", British thermal unit of 20 measurement to express the energy content of fuels. MMBTU is the 21 expression of 1 million BTU and use a conversion formula, as

22 appropriate, that it published in the Federal Register as conversion 23factor for gaseous biofuel;

- 24 (5) "Missouri qualified gaseous biofuel producer", any producer of gaseous biofuel whose principal place of business and facility for the 25anaerobic digester and biofuel upgrading is located within the state of 26 Missouri and is registered with the United States Environmental 27 Protection Agency according to the requirements of 40 CFR 79 and 28 which has made formal application, and conforms to the requirements 29 30 of this section, and:
- 31 (a) Has registered with the department of agriculture by March 32 31, 2018;
- (b) Has begun construction of the facility before July 31, 2018; 33 and 34
- 35 (c) Has begun production of gaseous biofuel before December 31, 2018. 36
- 37 2. There is hereby created the "Missouri Qualified Gaseous Biofuel Producer Incentive Fund" that shall be used to provide 38 economic subsidies to Missouri qualified gaseous biofuel 39 producers. Upon appropriation, the director of the department of 40 agriculture shall administer the fund. Notwithstanding the provisions 41 of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys remaining in the fund at 42the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the general revenue fund. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in 45the same manner as other funds are invested. Any interest and moneys 46 earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund.
- 3. A Missouri qualified gaseous biofuel shall be eligible for a monthly grant from the fund provided that one hundred percent of the feedstock originates in the United States. However, the director may waive the feedstock requirements on an annual basis if the facility provides verification that adequate feedstock is not available. A 52 Missouri qualified gaseous biofuel producer shall only be eligible for the grant for a total of sixty months unless such producers during the sixty months fail, due to a lack of appropriations, to receive the full amount from the fund for which the producers were eligible, in which case such producers shall continue to be eligible until they have received the maximum amount of funding for which such producers were eligible during the original sixty-month time period. of the grant is determined by calculating the estimated BTU of qualified gaseous biofuel produced during the preceding month from feedstock, as certified by the department of agriculture, and applying such figure to the per-BTU incentive credit established in this subsection. Each Missouri qualified gaseous biofuel producer shall be 63 eligible for a total grant in any fiscal year equal to two thousand three hundred forty-four millionths cents per BTU for the first five million 65 MMBTU of qualified gaseous biofuel produced from feedstock in the 66 fiscal year plus seven hundred eighty-one millionths cents per BTU for the next five million MMBTU of qualified biodiesel produced from feedstock in the fiscal year. All such qualified gaseous biofuel 69 produced by a Missouri qualified gaseous biofuel producer in excess of 70 ten million MMBTU shall not be applied to the computation of a grant 71pursuant to this subsection. The department of agriculture shall pay 72all grants for a particular month by the fifteenth day after receipt and 74 approval of the application described in subsection 7 of this section.

- 4. In order for a Missouri qualified gaseous biofuel producer to obtain a grant from the fund, an application for such funds shall be received no later than fifteen days following the last day of the month for which the grant is sought. The application shall include:
- 79 (1) The location of the Missouri qualified gaseous biofuel 80 producer;
 - (2) The average number of citizens of Missouri employed by the Missouri qualified gaseous biofuel producer in the preceding month, if applicable;
 - (3) The number of ton equivalents of Missouri feedstock and outof-state feedstock used by the Missouri qualified gaseous biofuel producer in the production of gaseous biofuel in the preceding month;
 - (4) The number of BTU of qualified gaseous biofuel the producer manufactures during the month for which the grant is applied;
 - (5) Any other information deemed necessary by the department of agriculture to adequately ensure that such grants shall be made only to Missouri qualified gaseous biofuel producers.
 - 5. The director of the department of agriculture, in consultation with the department of revenue, shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary for the administration of the provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010 that

is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2016, shall be invalid and void.

6. This section shall expire on December 31, 2018. However, Missouri qualified gaseous biofuel producers receiving any grants awarded prior to July 31, 2018, shall continue to be eligible for the remainder of the original sixty-month time period under the same terms and conditions of this section unless such producer during such sixty months failed, due to a lack of appropriations, to receive the full amount from the fund for which he or she was eligible. In such case, such producers shall continue to be eligible until they have received the maximum amount of funding for which they were eligible during the original sixty-month time period.
