AN ACT

To repeal sections 181.022, 181.100, 181.110, 181.130, and 182.900, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof four new sections relating to libraries.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 181.022, 181.100, 181.110, 181.130, and 182.900, 2 RSMo, are repealed and four new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as 3 sections 181.022, 181.100, 181.110, and 182.900, to read as follows:

181.022. 1. The secretary of state shall create the "Secretary's Council on Library Development" to advise the secretary of state and the state library on matters that relate to the state's libraries and library service to Missouri citizens, to recommend to the secretary of state and the state library policies and programs relating to libraries in the state, and to communicate the value of libraries.

6 2. Members of the secretary's council on library development shall serve 7 three-year terms, to be served on a rotating basis as shall be established by the 8 secretary of state.

9 3. The members of the secretary's council on library development shall be 10 appointed by the secretary of state, to include [members of the house of 11 representatives, members of the senate,] representatives of the public and of 12 libraries, trustees of Missouri libraries, and users of the state libraries, as well 13 as members of the house of representatives, members of the senate, and 14 the state librarian, who shall serve as ex-officio members of the council.

181.100. 1. As used in sections 181.100 to [181.130] **181.110** the 2 following terms shall mean, unless the context requires otherwise:

3 (1) "Agency", each department, office, commission, board, or other
4 administrative office or unit of state government;

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5 (2) "Electronic repository", a collection of electronic publications kept in 6 a secure environment with adequate backup to protect the collection;

7 (3) "Format", any media used in the publication of state information8 including electronic, print, audio, visual, and microform;

9 (4) ["Participating libraries", a library selected by the secretary of state 10 to assist the public in locating and using state publications in any format; and 11 designated to house and make available to the public publications which agencies 12 have produced in print;

(5)] "Publications", the information published by agencies intended for
distribution to the legislature, agencies, political subdivisions, nonprofit
organizations or broad distribution to the public, including publications issued
electronically or in other formats;

[(6)] (5) "State publications access program", a program to provide access to state publications for all citizens of Missouri through a secure repository of electronic publications available to the public through electronic networks [and print collections located in libraries throughout Missouri].

212. [Other provisions of law to the contrary notwithstanding, all state 22agencies required to issue and distribute multiple-produced annual, biannual, or 23periodic reports shall distribute such reports without charge only to those persons 24and offices listed in subsection 4 of this section.] For the purposes of sections 25181.100 to [181.130] 181.110, the word "report" means a state publication which 26is either a [printed] statement by a state agency, issued at specific intervals, 27which describes its operations and progress, and possibly contains a statement 28of its future plans; or a formal, written account of an investigation given by a 29person or group delegated to make the investigation. Such reports shall not be distributed to any other person, including members of the general assembly, state 30 31officeholders, other state agencies, divisions or departments, or to members of the 32public, except upon request.

33 3. [No report described in subsection 2 of this section shall be distributed 34 free of charge to any person or office, except as provided in subsection 4 of this 35 section. Each recipient of any such report shall pay the cost of printing and 36 postage, which cost shall be determined by the issuing agency prior to 37 distribution of the document.

4.] Each agency of state government which distributes annual, biannual,
or periodic reports printed in paper shall provide such copies of each such
document free of charge to the state library as the state library shall specify[,

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41 along with a statement of the cost and address where additional copies of such 42 report may be requested]. Two copies of all reports shall be provided to the 43 legislative library, one copy to the chief clerk of the house of representatives, one 44 copy to the secretary of the senate, one copy to the supreme court library and one 45 copy to the governor.

181.110. 1. For the purpose of providing the services described in this 2 section, each agency shall have the following responsibilities and powers:

3 (1) To submit to the state library electronically each publication created4 by the agency in a manner consistent with the state's enterprise architecture;

(2) [To determine the format used to publish;

6 (3)] For those publications which the agency determines shall be printed 7 and published in paper, to supply the number of copies [for participating 8 libraries] as determined by the secretary of state;

9 [(4)] (3) To assign a designee as a contact for the state publications 10 access program and forward this information to the secretary of state [annually].

11 2. For the purpose of providing the services described in this section, the 12 secretary of state shall have the following responsibilities:

(1) Through the state library, to provide a secure electronic repository of
state publications. Access to the state publications in the repository shall be
provided through [multiple methods of access, including the statewide online
library catalog and] a publicly accessible electronic network;

17 (2) [To create, in administrative rule, the criteria for selection of
18 participating libraries and the responsibilities incumbent upon those libraries in
19 serving the citizens of Missouri;

20 (3)] To set by administrative rule the electronic formats acceptable for 21 submission of publications to the electronic repository;

[(4)] (3) May issue and promulgate rules to enforce, implement and effectuate the powers and duties established in sections 181.100 to [181.130] 181.110.

3. For the purpose of providing the services described in this section, the
state library shall [have the following responsibilities, all] administer the
electronic repository of state publications for access by the citizens of
Missouri, to be performed in a manner consistent with e-government[:

(1) To administer the electronic repository of state publications for access
by the citizens of Missouri, and receive and distribute publications in other
formats, which will be housed and made available to the public by the

33 (2) To ensure the organization and classification of state publications
34 regardless of formats and the distribution of materials in additional formats to
35 participating libraries;

36 (3) To publish regularly a list of all publications of the agencies,37 regardless of format.

38 4. For the purpose of providing the services described in this section, the39 participating libraries shall have the following responsibilities:

40 (1) To ensure citizens who come to the library will be able to access41 publications electronically;

42 (2) To maintain paper copies of those state publications that agencies
43 publish in paper that are designated by the secretary of state to be included in
44 the Missouri state publications access program;

(3) To maintain a collection of older state publications published by the
agencies in paper and designated by the secretary of state to be included in the
Missouri state publications access program;

48 (4) To provide training for staff of other libraries to assist the public in49 the use of state publications;

50 (5) To assist agencies in the distribution of paper copies of state 51 publications to the public].

52 [5.] 4. All responsibilities and powers set out in this section shall be 53 carried out consistent with the provisions of section 161.935.

54[6.] 5. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this chapter shall 55become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of 56chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are 57nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant 58to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul 59a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking 60 authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2004, shall be 61 invalid and void. 62

182.900. Any city in this state may maintain from its own resources a free public library without the levy or collection of a tax specifically designated for the support and maintenance of such library. The governing body of the city may act as the library board for the library and may designate city officers and employees to serve in other capacities related to the operation of the library. The governing

6 body of the city may accept from any sources property or funds to be utilized for the establishment, maintenance and support of the library. Any city, not 7 8 already served by a county or other established library district as established under sections 182.010 to 182.802, maintaining from its own 9 resources a free public library without the levy or collection of a tax specifically 10 designated for the support and maintenance of such library shall be eligible for 11 12state aid to public libraries under the provisions of chapter 181 if the support provided by the city for the public library is at least equal to the amount of 13revenue which would be realized by a tax of one mill if the library had been tax 14supported. 15

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[181.130. The state library may enter into agreements with

2 participating libraries which meet standards for eligibility to be

3 established by the state library.]

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
