## AN ACT

To amend chapter 285, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to leave from employment.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 285, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 285.350, to read as follows:

285.350. 1. As used in this section, the following terms shall mean:

- (1) "Bereaved employee", any person performing work or service of any kind or character for hire within the state of Missouri who has incurred the death of a child, grandparent, parent, sibling, or spouse within the preceding fifteen calendar days;
- 7 (2) "Bereavement leave", leave from employment following the 8 death of a child, grandparent, parent, sibling, or spouse of a bereaved 9 employee;
- 10 (3) "Child", a biological, adopted, or foster son or daughter, a 11 stepson or stepdaughter, a legal ward, a son or daughter of a domestic 12 or civil union partner, or the person to whom a bereaved employee 13 stands in loco parentis who is under nineteen years of age;
- 14 (4) "Employer", any person acting directly or indirectly in the 15 interest of an employer in relation to a bereaved employee;
  - (5) "Grandparent", a parent of a bereaved employee's parent;
- 17 (6) "Parent", a biological, foster, or adoptive parent, a stepparent, 18 or any other person who stood in loco parentis to the bereaved 19 employee when the bereaved employee was a child;
- 20 (7) "Sibling", a person related to a bereaved employee by blood, 21 adoption, or affinity through a common legal or biological parent;

22 (8) "Spouse", a partner to a lawful marriage with a bereaved 23employee.

- 242. In the event of the death of a bereaved employee's child, 25grandparent, parent, sibling, or spouse, every employer of a bereaved 26 employee shall provide three days of bereavement leave to such bereaved employee. 27
  - 3. In accordance with the employer's leave policy, an employer of a bereaved employee may require verification of the bereaved employee's child, grandparent, parent, sibling, or spouse's death.
- 4. Any employer of a bereaved employee who fails to comply with the provisions of this section shall be liable to the bereaved employee affected for the full amount of the employee's wage rate for the three days bereavement leave, plus an additional equal amount as liquidated 34damages, less any amount actually paid to the employee by the 35 employer and for costs and such reasonable attorney fees as may be 36 allowed by the court. The bereaved employee may bring any legal action necessary to collect the claim. All actions brought under this section shall be commenced within two years of the accrual of the cause of action.
