AN ACT

To amend chapter 173, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the establishment of a specialized department of higher education website.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 173, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 173.035, to read as follows:

173.035. 1. The department of higher education shall develop,

maintain, and operate a website containing information for public and private institutions of higher education in this state directing students

4 to resources including, but not limited to, academic programs, financial

5 aid, and how courses may be transferred from one institution of higher

6 education to another. The information on the website shall be made

available to the public and shall be accessible from various devices

8 including, but not limited to, computers, tablets, and other electronic

communication devices.

2. Inclusion of institution information on the website is voluntary, and institutions of higher education may elect to have institutional information included on the website by notifying the department of higher education.

3. The department of higher education may promulgate all necessary rules and regulations for the administration of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to
