JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri, an amendment repealing section 25(a) of article V of the Constitution of Missouri, and adopting one new section in lieu thereof relating to the nonpartisan court plan.

Be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring therein:

That at the next general election to be held in the state of Missouri, on 2 Tuesday next following the first Monday in November, 2020, or at a special 3 election to be called by the governor for that purpose, there is hereby submitted 4 to the qualified voters of this state, for adoption or rejection, the following 5 amendment to article V of the Constitution of the state of Missouri:

Section A. Section 25(a), article V, Constitution of Missouri, is repealed 2 and one new section adopted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 25(a), to read 3 as follows:

Section 25(a). Whenever a vacancy shall occur in the office of judge of any of the following courts of this state, to wit: The supreme court, the court of $\mathbf{2}$ 3 appeals, or in the office of circuit or associate circuit judge within the city of St. Louis and Jackson County, the governor shall fill such vacancy by appointing one 4 [of three persons] **person** possessing the qualifications for such office, who shall 5 be nominated [and whose] from a list of names [shall be] submitted to the 6 7 governor by a nonpartisan judicial commission established and organized as 8 hereinafter provided. Such list of names shall include all qualified nominees and shall not be limited in number, but shall contain at least 9 10 three nominees. If the governor fails to appoint any of the nominees within sixty days after the list of nominees is submitted, the nonpartisan judicial 11 12commission making the nomination shall appoint one of the nominees to fill the

13 vacancy.

Section B. Pursuant to section 116.155, RSMo, and other applicable constitutional provisions and laws of this state authorizing the general assembly to adopt ballot language for the submission of a joint resolution to the voters of this state, the official summary statement of the amendment proposed in section A shall be as follows:

6 "Shall the Missouri Constitution be amended to allow a 7 nonpartisan judicial commission to send a list of an unlimited 8 number of qualified candidates to the governor, as opposed to the 9 current limitation of three candidates, from which the governor 10 shall appoint one to fill a judicial vacancy in certain courts?"
