Description of fiscal impact

HB 504 expands eligibility for reimbursement of domestic bison under MCA 2-15-3112, the Livestock Loss Mitigation Program. This program falls under the umbrella of the Department of Livestock.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions

Department of Livestock

1. The department estimates very few bison claims will be submitted. USDA Wildlife Services has only responded to three incidents in the past 5 years.
2. Bison claims are estimated at approximately \$3,600 per loss. Over the past five years commercial cattle loss reimbursements have averaged approximately \$1,800 each.
3. Since 2019, the board has paid out an average of \$251,194 annually on an average of 292 total loss claims per year.
4. The Livestock Loss Board program is appropriated \$450,000 annually to payout loss claims and has an additional \$300,000 in reserve for unusually large yearly claim totals.
5. In the event more bison losses are reported, funding reserves should be sufficient to compensate until additional appropriations can be justified and requested.

Department of Revenue

6. There may be more contacts for this verification, but the impact is expected to be minimal and can be accomplished with existing resources.


