Description of fiscal impact

HB 940 prohibits overnight camping and storage of personal property on state highway right-of-way. After the 72-hour notification to remove the campsite and all personal property, the Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) and law enforcement will post notice on the highway right-of-way, remove the campsite, and dispose of all personal property within 120 hours.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions

Department of Transportation

- 1. Over the past four years, MDT has tracked the costs associated with right-of-way encampment cleanups and cleaned up approximately 48 separate sites.
- 2. The total cost, across the four years was \$31,964, which results in an average cleanup cost of \$665.92 per site.
- 3. MDT is currently monitoring 20 active encampments.
- 4. Based on the historical average cleanup cost per site (\$665.92), the estimated total cost for these encampment cleanups is approximately \$13,318.40 ($665.92 \times 20 = 13,318.40$).
- 5. Camp cleanup will be completed by existing MDT staff.
- 6. MDT will develop and print notices for the removal of campsites and personal property located within MDT right-of-way. The estimated cost for designing and printing notices for the 20 active encampments is estimated at \$554.
- 7. Additionally, MDT will post no camping signs at the 20 active encampments for a total cost of \$1,127.60 (\$56.38 per sign x 20 = \$1,127.60).
- 8. The total cost to clean up the 20 sites, post no camping signs, and print and post notices for removal of campsites is \$15,000 (\$13,318.40+\$1,127.60+\$554).

- 9. The number of fines that will be collected is unknown at this time. The number of citations issued would be completed by other agencies.
- 10. It is assumed that additional encampment cleanups may occur beyond FY 2026, but the number, location, and cost of these future cleanups are currently unknown and cannot be accurately estimated at this time.
