4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING UTILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR THE USE OF
5	ADVANCED METERING DEVICES; REQUIRING A UTILITY TO NOTIFY A CUSTOMER PRIOR TO
6	INSTALLATION OF ADVANCED METERING DEVICES; PROVIDING THAT DATA COLLECTED THROUGH
7	USE OF METERING DEVICES IS GENERALLY CONFIDENTIAL; REQUIRING THE PUBLIC SERVICE
8	COMMISSION TO DETERMINE WHETHER IMPLEMENTATION OF A CUSTOMER OPT-OUT PROGRAM IS
9	REQUIRED; GRANTING THE COMMISSION RULEMAKING AUTHORITY; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE
10	EFFECTIVE DATE."
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12	WHEREAS, Montanans have a right to privacy as guaranteed by the Montana Constitution; and
13	WHEREAS, advanced metering devices can present issues of privacy.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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17	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Definitions. As used in [sections 1 through 4], unless the context requires
18	otherwise the following definitions apply:
19	(1) "Advanced metering device" means any electric utility meter, electric utility meter component, or
20	device ancillary to the electric utility meter that is located at an end-user's residence or business and is equipped
21	and programmed to communicate with electrical appliances, electrical equipment, or electrical devices within the
22	end-user's residence or business or that is capable of estimating and recording electrical energy usage by types
23	of appliances, electrical equipment, or electrical devices.
24	(2) "Utility" means a public utility regulated by the public service commission pursuant to Title 69, chapter
25	3.
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27	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Meter security. (1) A customer's energy use data is private and confidential
28	and may not be disclosed by a utility, except as specifically provided by law.
29	(2) Energy use data from an advanced metering device must be sufficiently secured so that the data
30	cannot be intercepted by a person other than a utility.

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2	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Advanced metering devices notice required. (1) A utility shall:
3	(a) notify a customer in writing at least 60 days prior to installation of an advanced metering device at
4	the customer's address; and
5	(b) provide a sample copy of the notice to the public service commission and a list of customers who
6	have been provided notice.
7	(2) The notice provided in accordance with subsection (1) must:
8	(a) be sent by first-class mail to a customer's address and be separate from any billing mailing;
9	(b) clearly state the utility's intent to install an advanced metering device; and
10	(c) if determined to be a requirement by the public service commission, include the process and financial
11	obligations for a customer to opt-out of installation of an advanced metering device.
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13	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Opt-out public service commission responsibilities rulemaking.
14	(1) On or before July 1, 2020, the public service commission shall determine whether an opt-out program for
15	advanced metering devices should be established. In determining whether to establish an opt-out program, the
16	commission shall consider:
17	(a) an individual customer's privacy interest;
18	(b) costs and practicality of allowing customers to opt-out;
19	(c) availability of other technology; and
20	(d) other concerns related to advanced metering devices.
21	(2) If the commission determines an opt-out program should be established, the commission shall adopt
22	rules providing options and requirements for individual customers to opt out of advanced metering installation.
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24	NEW SECTION. Section 5. Codification instruction. [Sections 1 through 4] are intended to be codified
25	as an integral part of Title 69, and the provisions of Title 69, apply to [sections 1 through 4].
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27	NEW SECTION. Section 6. Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval.
