11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

13	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Maximizing information quality. (1) The department of administration shall
14	issue guidelines that provide policy and procedural guidance to state agencies for ensuring and maximizing the
15	quality, objectivity, utility, and integrity, including statistical integrity, of information disseminated and used by state
16	agencies as a qualitative or quantitative basis for taking a government act, as defined in 2-11-103.

18	(a) issue rules of procedure to ensure and maximize the quality, objectivity, utility, statistical integrity, and
19	general integrity of information disseminated by that agency not later than 1 year after the issuance of guidelines
20	under subsection (1); and
21	(b) report periodically to the director of the department of administration:
22	(i) the number and nature of complaints received by the agency regarding the accuracy of information
23	disseminated by each agency; and
24	(ii) how the complaints were handled by each agency.
25	(3) The director of the department of administration shall report annually to the state administration and
26	veterans' affairs interim committee.

28	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Statement of qualitative or quantitative basis required. (1) When a
29	government entity THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH, WILDLIFE, AND PARKS takes a government act, as defined in 2-11-103,
30	it shall provide upon request a written statement of the specific qualitative or quantitative studies, reviews, or other

analyses upon which the action is based. The statement must be provided within 30 days of the written request by the applicant for the written statement of qualitative or quantitative basis or within 30 days after the government act, whichever occurs last.

(2) The statement of qualitative or quantitative basis must clearly cite the studies, reviews, or other analyses used as a basis for the government act and the specific reason for those identified studies, reviews, or other analyses.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 3. Procedure for disputing analyses. (1) A person disputing the quality, objectivity, utility, or integrity, including statistical integrity, of the studies, reviews, or other analyses used as a basis for a government act may request a hearing by the board or agency taking the government act by submitting a written request stating the reason for the request within 30 days after the government act.

(2) The contested case provisions of the Montana Administrative Procedure Act, Title 2, chapter 4, part 6, apply to a hearing held under this part.

Section 2. Section 2-11-102, MCA, is amended to read:

"2-11-102. Findings and purpose. (1) The purpose of this part is to require government entities to make known the legal authority and the qualitative and quantitative basis upon which certain action is based. The benefits of this requirement will be that government officials will articulate and reaffirm their legal authority and the qualitative and quantitative basis to act and that both the government and the people will have a fuller understanding of the limits of the law; and AND the facts to which the law applies; and the integrity of the studies; reviews, or other analyses government relies on to act. This understanding will benefit both government and the people by helping to resolve disputes between government servants and the people, without lengthy and costly litigation, by instilling trust in government, and by helping to identify deficiencies in the law or in studies, reviews; or other analyses government relies on to act so that those deficiencies may be addressed by legislative action.

(2) THE PURPOSE OF [SECTION 1] IS TO REQUIRE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH, WILDLIFE, AND PARKS ALSO MAKE KNOWN UPON WRITTEN REQUEST THE QUALITATIVE AND QUANTITATIVE ANALYSES, INCLUDING ANY STUDIES OR REVIEWS, UPON WHICH A GOVERNMENT ACT BY THE DEPARTMENT IS BASED. THIS WILL ALLOW PEOPLE TO ASSESS THE INTEGRITY OF THE INFORMATION UPON WHICH THE GOVERNMENT ACT IS BASED."

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Codification instruction. (1) [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
