4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROHIBITING THE USE OF A VAPOR PRODUCT OR AN
5	ALTERNATIVE NICOTINE PRODUCT IN A PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDING OR ON PUBLIC SCHOOL
6	PROPERTY; PROVIDING DEFINITIONS; AND AMENDING SECTION 20-1-220, MCA."

8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
9	
10	Section 1. Section 20-1-220, MCA, is amended to read:
11	"20-1-220. Use of tobacco product products in public school building or on public school
12	property prohibited. (1) An individual may not use a tobacco product, vapor product, or alternative nicotine
13	product in a public school building or on public school property.
14	(2) Subsection (1) does not apply to the use of a tobacco product, vapor product, or alternative nicotine
15	product in a classroom or on other school property as part of a lecture, demonstration, or educational forum
16	sanctioned by a school administrator or faculty member concerning the risks associated with use of a tobacco
17	product, vapor product, or alternative nicotine product.
18	(3) The principal of an elementary or secondary school, or the principal's designee, may enforce this
19	section.
20	(4) A violation of this section is subject to the penalties provided in 50-40-115.
21	(5) For the purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:
22	(a) "Alternative nicotine product" means a manufactured noncombustible product that contains nicotine
23	derived from tobacco and that is intended for human consumption by being chewed, absorbed, dissolved, or
24	ingested by any other means.
25	(a)(b) "Public school building" or "public school property":
26	(i) means public land, fixtures, buildings, or other property owned or occupied by an institution for the
27	teaching of minor children that is established and maintained under the laws of the state of Montana at public
28	expense; and
29	(ii) includes school playgrounds, school steps, parking lots, administration buildings, athletic facilities,
30	gymnasiums, locker rooms, and school buses.

1	(b)(c) "Tobacco product" means a substance intended for human consumption that contains tobacco,
2	including cigarettes, cigars, snuff, smoking tobacco, and smokeless tobacco.
3	(d) "Vapor product" means a noncombustible product that may contain nicotine and that uses a heating
4	element, power source, electronic circuit, or other electronic, chemical, or mechanical means, regardless of shape
5	or size, to produce vapor from a solution or other substance. The term includes:
6	(i) an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe, or similar product or
7	device; and
8	(ii) a vapor cartridge or other container in a solution or other form that is intended to be used with or in
9	an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe, or similar product and device."
