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10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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12	NEW SECTION. Section 1. High-performance certification COMPLIANCE program for OPERATIONS
13	AND MAINTENANCE OF existing buildings. (1) The department of administration, in collaboration with the Montana
14	university system and other state agencies, shall adopt high-performance building standards of operation and
15	maintenance for existing buildings. In developing these standards, the department of administration shall
16	consider:
17	(a) integrated design principles to optimize energy performance, enhance indoor environmental quality,
18	and conserve natural resources;
19	(b) cost-effectiveness, including productivity, deferred maintenance, and operational considerations; $\underline{\text{AND}}$
20	(c) environmental, economic, and social sustainability of materials and components; and
21	(d)(C) building functionality, durability, and maintenance.
22	(2) When economically justified, state agencies may elect to improve the cost-effectiveness of existing
23	buildings by attempting to have the buildings rated as high-performance buildings according to standards
24	promulgated and certified by a third-party group chosen by the department of administration COMPLYING WITH
25	HIGH-PERFORMANCE BUILDING OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE STANDARDS ADOPTED BY THE DEPARTMENT BY RULE.
26	(3) For purposes of this section, an "existing building" means any state agency building that has not
27	already achieved a certification of high performance during its construction.
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29	NEW SECTION. Section 2. High-performance operational plan calculation of initial utility cost
30	savings. (1) Each state agency participating in the high-performance certification program for existing buildings

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'	in [section 1] shall create a high-performance operational plannor each existing building for which the agency is
2	seeking high-performance certification. The participating agency shall use the operational plan to:
3	 (a) define and document baseline utility consumption conditions in an existing building;
4	(b) develop a building-specific measurement and verification protocol that requires an annual review to
5	ensure that any cost-saving measures implemented continue to perform as expected; and
6	(c) calculate utility cost savings once the building has achieved high-performance certification.
7	(2) The department of environmental quality shall certify each operational plan and the utility cos
8	savings.
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0	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Transfer of budgeted utility funds special revenue accounts. (1) For
1	each fiscal year, each agency participating in the high-performance certification COMPLIANCE program for
2	OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE OF existing buildings in [section 1] may transfer to a special revenue account any
3	amount remaining in the budgeted utility fund of the agency.
4	(2) Each agency participating in the high-performance certification COMPLIANCE program for OPERATIONS
5	AND MAINTENANCE OF existing buildings shall establish a special revenue account to receive the transfers pursuant
6	to subsection (1).
7	(3) For each fiscal year, the Montana university system may establish a subfund of the plant fund to
8	receive the transfer pursuant to subsection (1).
9	(4) THE SPECIFIED AGENCY SPECIAL REVENUE ACCOUNTS AND UNIVERSITY PLANT FUNDS AND AUTHORITY ARE
20	DESIGNATED FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING HIGH-PERFORMANCE OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE COMPLIANCE AND
21	ACHIEVING UTILITY COST REDUCTIONS.
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23	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Codification instruction. [Sections 1 through 3 AND 2] are intended to be
24	codified as an integral part of Title 17, chapter 7, part 2, and the provisions of Title 17, chapter 7, part 2, apply
25	to [sections 1 through 3 AND 2].
