6	SECTIONS 13-2-205, 13-13-201, 13-13-214, 13-13	-222, AND 13-19-207,	MCA."	
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8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:			
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10	Section 1. Section 13-2-205, MCA, is ame	nded to read:		
11	"13-2-205. Procedure when prospective	e elector not qualifie	d at time of registration. (1) An	
12	individual who is not eligible to register because of residence or age requirements but who will be eligible on or			
13	before election day may apply for voter registration pursuant to 13-2-110 and be registered subject to verification			
14	procedures established pursuant to 13-2-109.			
15	(2) Unless an individual is a "covered voter" as defined in 13-21-102, an election administrator may not			
16	give or send a ballot to an individual who is not eligible to register because of residence requirements until the			
17	residence requirements have been met."			
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19	Section 2. Section 13-13-201, MCA, is amended to read:			
20	"13-13-201. Voting by absentee ballot procedures. (1) A Except as provided by 13-2-205(2), a			
21	legally registered elector or provisionally registered	elector is entitled to vot	e by absentee ballot as provided for	
22	in this part.			
23	(2) The elector may vote absentee by:			
24	(a) marking the ballot in the manner specified;			
25	(b) placing the marked ballot in the secrecy envelope, free of any identifying marks;			
26	(c) placing the secrecy envelope containing	ng one ballot for each	election being held in the signature	
27	envelope;			
28	(d) executing the affirmation printed on the signature envelope; and			
29	(e) returning the signature envelope with all appropriate enclosures by regular mail, postage paid, or by			
30	0 delivering it to:			
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1 (i) the election office;

2 (ii) a polling place within the elector's county;

3 (iii) pursuant to 13-13-229, the absentee election board or an authorized election official; or

4 (iv) in a mail ballot election held pursuant to Title 13, chapter 19, a designated place of deposit within the
5 elector's county.

6 (3) Except as provided in 13-21-206 and 13-21-226, in order for the ballot to be counted, each elector 7 shall return it in a manner that ensures the ballot is received prior to 8 p.m. on election day.

8 (4) A provisionally registered elector may also enclose in the outer signature envelope a copy of the 9 elector's photo identification showing the elector's name. The photo identification may be but is not limited to a 10 valid driver's license, a school district or postsecondary education photo identification, or a tribal photo 11 identification. If the provisionally registered elector does not enclose a photo identification, the elector may 12 enclose a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, notice of confirmation of voter registration issued 13 pursuant to 13-2-207, government check, or other government document that shows the elector's name and 14 current address."

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Section 3. Section 13-13-214, MCA, is amended to read:

17 "13-13-214. Mailing absentee ballot to elector -- delivery to person other than elector. (1) (a) Except 18 as provided in <u>13-2-205(2)</u>, 13-13-213, and in subsection (1)(c) of this section, the election administrator shall 19 mail, postage prepaid, to each legally registered elector and provisionally registered elector from whom the 20 election administrator has received a valid absentee ballot application under 13-13-211 and 13-13-212 whatever 21 official ballots are necessary in a manner that conforms to postal regulations to require the return rather than 22 forwarding of ballots.

(b) The election administrator shall mail the ballots in a manner that conforms to the deadlines
established for ballot availability in 13-13-205.

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(c) The election administrator may deliver a ballot in person to an individual other than the elector if:

(i) the elector has designated the individual, either by a signed letter or by making the designation on
the application form in a manner prescribed by the secretary of state or pursuant to 13-1-116;

(ii) the individual taking delivery of the ballot on behalf of the elector verifies, by signature, receipt of theballot;

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(iii) the election administrator believes that the individual receiving the ballot is the designated person;

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1 and 2 (iv) the designated person has not previously picked up ballots for four other electors. 3 (2) The election administrator shall enclose with the ballots: 4 (a) a secrecy envelope, free of any marks that would identify the voter; and 5 (b) a signature envelope for the return of the ballots. The signature envelope must be self-addressed 6 by the election administrator and an affirmation in the form prescribed by the secretary of state must be printed 7 on the back of the signature envelope. 8 (3) The election administrator shall ensure that the ballots provided to an absentee elector are marked 9 as provided in 13-13-116 and shall remove the stubs from the ballots, keeping the stubs in numerical order with 10 the application for absentee ballots, if applicable, or in a precinct envelope or container for that purpose. 11 (4) If the ballots sent to the elector are for a primary election, the election administrator shall enclose an 12 extra envelope marked "For Unvoted Party Ballot(s)". This envelope may not be numbered or marked in any way 13 so that it can be identified as being used by any one elector. 14 (5) Instructions for voting must be enclosed with the ballots. Instructions for primary elections must 15 include use of the envelope for unvoted ballots. The instructions must include information concerning the type or types of writing instruments that may be used to mark the absentee ballot. The instructions must include 16 17 information regarding use of the secrecy envelope and use of the signature envelope. The election administrator 18 shall include a voter information pamphlet with the instructions if: 19 (a) a statewide ballot issue appears on the ballot mailed to the elector; and 20 (b) the elector requests a voter information pamphlet." 21 22 Section 4. Section 13-13-222, MCA, is amended to read: 23 "13-13-222. Marking ballot before election day. (1) As soon as the official ballots are available 24 pursuant to 13-13-205, except as provided by 13-2-205(2), the election administrator shall permit an elector to 25 apply for, receive, and mark an absentee ballot before election day by appearing in person at the office of the 26 election administrator and marking the ballot in a voting station area designated by the election administrator. 27 (2) The provisions of this chapter apply to voting under this section. 28 (3) For the purposes of this section, an official ballot is voted when the ballot is received at the election 29 administrator's office."

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1	Section 5. Section 13-19-207, MCA, is amended to read:		
2	"13-19-207. When materials to be mailed. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), for any election		
3	conducted by mail, ballots must be mailed no sooner than the 25th day and no later than the 15th day before		
4	election day.		
5	(2) (a) All Except as provided by 13-2-205(2), ballots mailed to electors on the active list and provisionally		
6	registered list must be mailed the same day.		
7	(b) At any time before noon on the day before election day, a ballot may be mailed or, upon request,		
8	provided in person at the election administrator's office to:		
9	(i) an elector on the inactive list after the elector reactivates the elector's registration as provided in		
10	13-2-222; or		
11	(ii) an individual who registers under the late registration option provided for in 13-2-304, except as		
12	provided by 13-2-205(2).		
13	(c) An elector on the inactive list shall vote at the election administrator's office on election day if the		
14	elector reactivates the elector's registration after noon on the day before election day.		
15	(d) An elector who registers pursuant to 13-2-304 on election day or on the day before election day must		
16	receive the ballot and vote it at the election administrator's office."
