4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REQUIRING THE INSURANCE COMMISSIONER TO CONVENE

6	ILLNESS PROGRAM; REQUIRING A REPORT; APPROPRIATING AND AUTHORIZING THE USE OF FUNDS

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9	WHEREAS, Montana firefighters work hard each and every day, proudly protecting and serving the
10	citizens of Montana by answering the call for helpa call to save lives; and
11	WHEREAS, Montana firefighters are at an increased risk of exposure to various carcinogens and
12	therefore have an increased risk of developing certain cancers, heart disease, and infectious diseases; and
13	WHEREAS, 46 states throughout the United States have recognized the inherent danger in firefighting
14	activities and the increased risks and exposures to firefighters and have instituted some form of presumptive
15	illness program for firefighters; and
16	WHEREAS, firefighters with a career of service to Montana communities have a significantly higher
17	mortality rate and shorter life expectancy.
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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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21	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Firefighter presumptive health care advisory council. (1) The
22	insurance commissioner shall convene an advisory council to review the costs, benefits, and procedural and
23	technical requirements necessary to design, implement, and maintain a statewide presumptive illness program
24	for firefighters.
25	(2) The commissioner and advisory council shall investigate the following matters related to firefighte
26	presumptive illness programs:
27	(a) specific strategies for measuring and collecting data on the administration, outcomes, and cost o
28	a firefighter presumptive illness program;
29	(b) data elements that foster improvements and peer group comparisons;
30	(c) usable and comparable information from other states, workers' compensation providers, health care

providers, and health insurers related to the cost-effective and efficient administration of firefighter presumptive
 illness programs;

- (d) standards or methods for establishing and maintaining presumptive illness claims that are utilized by existing firefighter presumptive illness programs;
 - (e) the cost-effectiveness and efficiency of providing a firefighter presumptive illness program; and
- (f) any other information that the commissioner and advisory council considers relevant to the creation and funding of a statewide firefighter presumptive illness program.
- (3) The commissioner shall report by August 31, 2014, to the state administration and veterans' affairs interim committee on the findings of the advisory council's investigation and on any recommendations for action by the legislature in 2015.

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NEW SECTION. Section 2. Appropriation and authorization. The insurance commissioner is authorized to expend \$1,000 in each of the fiscal years beginning July 1, 2013, and July 1, 2014, for a biennial total of \$2,000. These funds are appropriated from the state special revenue fund credited to the state auditor's office and must be used exclusively for paying the costs associated with the study of a statewide firefighter presumptive illness program as provided in [section 1].

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NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 2013.

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20 NEW SECTION. **Section 4. Termination.** [This act] terminates December 31, 2014.

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
