7	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Infrastructure advisory commission. (1) There is an American Rescue
8	Plan infrastructure advisory commission.
9	(2) The commission consists of nine members, who must be appointed as follows:
10	(a) three senators, two from the majority party and one from the minority party, appointed by the senate
11	president;
12	(b) three representatives, two from the majority party and one from the minority party, appointed by the
13	speaker of the house; and
14	(c) three members appointed by the governor.

23	DEPARTMENTS OF ADMINISTRATION AND COMMERCE ASSISTING.
24	(6) FUNDING FOR THE COMMISSION IS ALLOCATED FROM THE ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS ALLOWED IN [SECTION 3].
25	(7) The commission shall hold its first meeting no later than June 11, 2021.
26	(8) The commission shall set its future meeting dates.
27	(9) The commission shall elect a chair from the legislative branch and a vice chair from the executive
28	branch.

17	(4)(5) In preparing recommendations, for capital projects, preference must be given to projects that
18	carry out critical capital projects directly enabling work, education, and health monitoring, including remote
19	options, in response to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19. For local government WATER
20	AND WASTEWATER sewer infrastructure grants, preference may also be given to projects that provide a higher
21	match rate.
22	(6) The advisory commission shall certify that each project submitted is a necessary investment in
23	water and sewer infrastructure as defined in the American Rescue Plan Act and all applicable guidance.
23	(5)(6) (7) The recommendations of the advisory commission must be considered by the governor and
25	reviewed to comply with the American Rescue Plan Act and all applicable guidance. The governor may modify
