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11	BE IT ENACTE	ED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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13	NEW S	SECTION. Section 1. Immunization education. (1) The department shall make the following
14	available online free of charge to a person seeking a religious exemption pursuant to 20-5-405:	
15	(a)	an immunization education program that meets the requirements of subsection (2); and
16	(b)	a form for use by a licensed physician or licensed nurse practitioner to verify an educational
17	immunization discussion pursuant to subsection (3). The form must enumerate the minimum discussion	
18	requirements contained in subsection (3)(a).	
19	(2)	A person seeking a religious exemption may fulfill the requirement for immunization education
20	by completing	an immunization education program produced and provided by the department. The
21	immunization education program provided by the department:	
22	(a)	must be designed to take 20 minutes or less to complete; and
23	(b)	must include at a minimum:
24	(i)	information about immunization-preventable illnesses;
25	(ii)	recommendations for reducing the likelihood of a nonimmunized person contracting or
26	transmitting an immunization-preventable illness;	
27	(iii)	information based on the best available science about the benefits and side effects of
28	immunization;	



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1	(iv)	interactive questions or activities;	
2	(v)	a certificate of completion that a person may use to verify completion of immunization	
3	education; and		
4	(vi)	a religious exemption form that is generated after a person completes the module and that ma	
5	be filed with th	e governing authority pursuant to 20-5-405.	
6	(3)	(a) A person seeking a religious exemption may fulfill the requirement for immunization	
7	education by engaging in an educational immunization discussion with a licensed physician or licensed nurse		
8	practitioner. The discussion must include at a minimum:		
9	(i)	information about immunization-preventable illnesses;	
10	(ii)	recommendations for reducing the likelihood of a nonimmunized person contracting or	
11	transmitting an	immunization-preventable illness; and	
12	(iii)	information based on the best available science about the benefits and side effects of	
13	immunization.		
14	(b)	The physician or nurse practitioner shall sign and date a form provided by the department	
15	pursuant to su	osection (1)(b), which the person may use to demonstrate completion of immunization education	
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17	Section	on 2. Section 20-5-405, MCA, is amended to read:	
18	"20-5-	405. Exemptions limitations on agency actions. (1) (a) There is a religious exemption to	
19	the immunizati	ons required under 20-5-403. A person enrolled or seeking to enroll in school may attend the	
20	school without	obtaining the immunizations if the person signer:	
21	<u>(i)</u>	completes immunization education as provided in [section 1]; and	
22	<u>(ii)</u>	_files with the governing authority:	
23	<u>(A)</u>	_a notarized affidavit on a form prescribed by the department stating that immunization is	
24	contrary to the religious tenets and practices of the signer; and		
25	<u>(B)</u>	documentation that the signer completed immunization education as provided in [section 1].	
26	(b)	The statement must be signed and the immunization education must be completed:	
27	(i)	by the person enrolled or seeking to enroll in the school, if the person is an adult; or	
28	(ii)	if the person is a minor, by a parent, guardian, or adult who has the responsibility for the care	



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1 and custody of the minor.

(c) The statement must be maintained as part of the person's immunization records.

(d) A person who falsely claims a religious exemption is subject to the penalty for false swearing as provided in 45-7-202.

- (2) (a) There is a medical exemption to the immunizations required under 20-5-403. A person enrolled or seeking to enroll in school may attend the school without obtaining the immunizations if a written medical exemption statement signed by a health care provider specified in subsection (2)(c) is filed with the governing authority. The medical exemption statement must:
- (i) attest that the physical condition of the person enrolled or seeking to enroll in school or the medical circumstances relating to the person indicate that some or all of the required immunizations are not considered safe; and
- (ii) indicate the specific nature and probable duration of the medical condition or circumstances that contraindicate immunization.
- (b) The person is exempt from the requirements of this part to the extent indicated by the medical exemption statement.
 - (c) The medical exemption statement must be signed by a person who:
- 17 (i) is licensed, certified, or otherwise authorized by the laws of any state or Canada to provide 18 health care as defined in 50-16-504;
 - (ii) is authorized within the person's scope of practice to administer the immunizations to which the exemption applies; and
 - (iii) has previously provided health care to the person seeking the exemption or has administered an immunization to which the person seeking an exemption has had an adverse reaction.
 - (d) The medical exemption statement must be maintained as part of the person's immunization records and may not be photocopied or otherwise duplicated for use by a third party without permission of the student's parent or, if the student is an adult, the written consent of the student.
 - (3) (a) A private school or child-care provider may choose to not enroll students or children with nonmedical exemptions to immunization if the school or provider has a sincere religious belief in immunization as a community health measure.



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1	<u>(b)</u>	A private school or child-care provider may claim a sincere religious belief in immunization if	
2	the owner or th	e owner's designee:	
3	<u>(i)</u>	completes immunization education as provided in [section 1]; and	
4	<u>(ii)</u>	files with the governing authority:	
5	<u>(A)</u>	a notarized affidavit on a form prescribed by the department stating that nonmedical	
6	immunization e	exemptions are contrary to the religious tenets and practices of the private school or child-care	
7	provider; and		
8	<u>(B)</u>	documentation that the owner or the owner's designee completed immunization education as	
9	provided in [section 1].		
10	<u>(c)</u>	The department shall maintain a public-facing list on its website of child-care providers and	
11	private schools	with a sincerely held religious belief in immunization as a community health measure.	
12	(3) (4)	(a) The department may not require a medical exemption form that imposes requirements that	
13	are more burde	ensome or otherwise in excess of the requirements described in this section. A form prescribed	
14	by the departm	ent that contains requirements not expressly described in this section is void to the extent that it	
15	purports to imp	ose requirements not included in this section.	
16	(b)	A governing authority may not deny a medical exemption on the basis that a person has not	
17	completed portions of the medical exemption form that are void under this subsection (3) (4).		
18	(c)	The department is not authorized to review a completed medical exemption statement or	
19	medical exemp	tion form for the purpose of granting or denying a medical exemption.	
20	(4) (5)	Whenever there is good cause to believe that a person for whom an exemption has been filed	
21	under this sect	ion has a disease or has been exposed to a disease listed in 20-5-403 or will as the result of	
22	school attenda	nce be exposed to the disease, the person may be excluded from the school by the local health	
23	officer or the de	epartment until the excluding authority is satisfied that the person no longer risks contracting or	
24	transmitting tha	at disease."	
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26	NEW S	SECTION. Section 3. Appropriation. There is appropriated \$15,000 from the general fund to	
27	the department	of public health and human services for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, for the purpose of	



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implementing [section 1] and maintaining the list established in 20-5-405(3).

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2	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
3	integral part of Title 20, chapter 5, part 4, and the provisions of Title 20, chapter 5, part 4, apply to [section 1].
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5	NEW SECTION. Section 5. Effective dates. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) [this act] is
6	effective June 1, 2024.
7	(2) [Section 3] and this section are effective July 1, 2023.

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
