4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING REQUIREMENTS FOR SCIENCE INSTRUCTION		
5	IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS; DEFINING "SCIENTIFIC FACT"; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE		
6	DATE."

8	WHEREAS, the purpose of K-12 education is to educate children in the facts of our world to better		
9	prepare them for their future and further education in their chosen field of study, and to that end children must		
10	know the difference between scientific fact and scientific theory; and		
11	WHEREAS, a scientific fact is observable and repeatable, and if it does not meet these criteria, it is a		
12	theory that is defined as speculation and is for higher education to explore, debate, and test to ultimately reach		
13	a scientific conclusion of fact or fiction.

15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

17	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Requirements for science instruction in schools. (1) Science		
18	instruction may no	t include subject matter that is not scientific fact.	
19	(2) TI	ne board of public education may not include in content area standards any standard	
20	requiring curriculum or instruction in a scientific topic that is not scientific fact.		
21	(3) TI	ne superintendent of public instruction shall ensure that any science curriculum guides	
22	developed by the office of public instruction include only scientific fact.		
23	(4) (a) The trustees of a school district shall ensure that science curriculum and instructional	
24	materials, including textbooks, used in the district include only scientific fact.		
25	(b) Bo	eginning July 1, 2025, a parent may appeal the trustees' lack of compliance to subsection	
26	(4)(a) to the county superintendent and, subsequently, to the superintendent of public instruction under the		
27	provisions for the appeal of controversies in this title pursuant to 20-3-107 and 20-3-210.		
28	(5) Ti	ne legislature intends for this section to be strictly enforced and narrowly interpreted.

1	(6) As used in this section, "scientific fact" means an indisputable and repeatable observation of	f a	
2	natural phenomenon.

4	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Transition. The board of public education, the superintendent of publ	ic	
5	instruction, and school district boards of trustees shall fully implement the requirements of [section 1] no late	ŧr	
6	than July 1, 2025.

8	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an		
9	integral part of Title 20, chapter 7, part 1, and the provisions of Title 20, chapter 7, part 1, apply to [section 1].

11	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval.
