to contract with mental health support personnel to provide mental health services in one or more		

schools in the unit.

- (g) Report. No later than March 15, 2023, and every year thereafter in which funds are provided for the Program, the Department shall report on the Program to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee and the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services. The report shall include at least the following information:

 (1) The identity of each public school unit that received a grant through the Program.
 - (2) The amount of funding received by each public school unit.
 (3) The services purchased with grant funds by each public school unit that
 - received a grant.

 (4) Recommendations for the implementation of additional measures to improve
 - (4) Recommendations for the implementation of additional measures to improve student mental health, especially among students with limited or no access to mental health services."

SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Instruction for the 2022-2023 fiscal year the sum of forty million dollars (\$40,000,000) in recurring funds to provide grants for school mental health services in public school units in accordance with G.S. 115C-377, as enacted by this act. The Department may use up to fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) of these funds each year for administrative costs related to the Program.

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2022, and applies beginning with the 2022-2023 school year.
