5	RESPONSIBLE FOR FILING DATA ON APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSURE

7	PROVIDING THAT LICENSING BOARDS SHALL DETERMINE AN APPLICANT'S
8	STATUS AS MILITARY-TRAINED OR A MILITARY SPOUSE; EXTENDING THE
9	PROTECTIONS AND BENEFITS OF THE INTERSTATE COMPACT ON
10	EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY FOR MILITARY CHILDREN TO THE CHILDREN
11	OF NATIONAL GUARD AND RESERVE MEMBERS WITHIN THE STATE;
12	EXPANDING THE EMPLOYMENT PREFERENCE FOR VETERANS; AND
