5	SE	ECTION 1. Article 15 of Chapter 113 of the General Statutes is amended	by adding

8		urpose The marine resources of the State of North Carolina belong to		
9		State and should be conserved and managed for the benefit of the State, i		
10	and future generations. To this end, the General Assembly enacts limitations on marine net			
11	fishing in coastal fishing waters to protect saltwater finfish, shellfish, and other marine animals			
12	from unnecessary killing, overfishing, and waste.			
13	(b) <u>Net Prohibition. – It is unlawful to use either a gill net or other entangling net in</u>			
14	coastal fishing waters for the purpose of catching or taking any saltwater finfish, shellfish, or			
15	other marine animals.			
16 17	(c) <u>Additional Net Restrictions. – In addition to the prohibition set forth in subsection (b)</u>			
17	of this section, no other type of net containing more than 500 square feet of mesh area shall be used in coastal fishing waters. Additionally, no more than two nets which shall not be connected

3	nets shall be based on the shape of the individual components."		
4	<b>SECTION 2.</b> The question of whether North Carolina should limit marine net fishing		
5	as set out in the statutory amendment in Section 1 of this act shall be submitted to the qualified		
6	voters of the State at the general election in November 2022. Any other election or referendum		
7	validly called or scheduled by law at the time the election on the bond question provided for in		
8	this section is held may be held as called or scheduled. Notice of the election shall be given in		
9	the manner and at the times required by G.S. 163-33(8). The election and the registration of		
10	voters therefor shall be held under and in accordance with the general laws of the State. Absentee		
11	ballots shall be authorized in the election and shall be available 50 days prior to the date on which		
12	the election is to be held. Ballots, voting systems authorized by Article 14A of Chapter 163 of		
13	the General Statutes, or both may be used in accordance with rules prescribed by the State Board		
14	of Elections. The question to be used in the ballots or voting systems shall be:

16	Limits on marine net fishing in order to protect saltwater finfish, shellfish, and other		
17	marine animals from unnecessary killing, overfishing, and waste."		
18	<b>SECTION 3.</b> If a majority of the votes cast on the question are in favor of the		
19	question set out in Section 2 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the amendment		
20	to the Secretary of State and to the Revisor of Statutes. The amendments to the General Statutes		
21	set forth in Section 1 shall become effective upon this certification. The Secretary of State shall		
22	enroll the amendment so certified among the permanent records of that office.		
23	<b>SECTION 4.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
