A BILL TO BE ENTITLED			
AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO PROVIDE FREE BREAKFAST AND LUNCH TO			
STUDENTS ATTENDING PUBLIC SCHOOL UNITS.			
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
SECTION 1. G.S. 115C-263 reads as rewritten:			
"§ 115C-263. Required provision of services.			
As a part of the function of the public school system, local boards of education shall provide			
to the extent practicable school food <u>nutrition</u> services in the schools under their jurisdiction.			
Meals shall include breakfast and lunch at no cost to students. All school food nutrition services			
made available under this authority shall be provided in accordance with standards and			
regulations recommended by the Superintendent of Public Instruction and approved by the State			
Board of Education.established by the Food and Nutrition Service of the United States			
Department of Agriculture "

 - SECTION 2. G.S. 115C-264 reads as rewritten:

15 "§ **115C-264. Operation.**

16 In the operation of their public school nutrition programs, the public schools public (a) 17 school units shall participate in the School Breakfast Program and the National School Lunch Program established by the federal government. government and administered by the Department 18 19 of Public Instruction. The program shall be under the jurisdiction of the Division of School 20 Support, Child Nutrition Services Safe and Healthy Schools Support, School Nutrition Services, 21 of the Department of Public Instruction and in accordance with federal guidelines as established 22 by the Food and Nutrition Service of the United States Department of Agriculture. Instruction. The Department of Public Instruction shall allocate sufficient supplementary funds to public 23 school units to provide free breakfast for every student who elects to receive free breakfast and 24 25 free lunch for every student who elects to receive free lunch. Taking into account funds provided 26 toward the cost of breakfast and lunch for students under the National School Lunch Program, 27 the School Breakfast Program, any other federally assisted school nutrition program, or any program operated by a public school unit, the supplementary funds provided by the Department 28 29 shall be sufficient to ensure that each public school unit is compensated for each participating 30 student up to the federal free meal reimbursement rate. 31 For nutritional purposes, the public schools public school units shall not (i) use (b)

 cooking oils in their school food nutrition programs that contain trans-fatty acids or (ii) sell
 processed foods containing trans-fatty acids that were formed during the commercial processing
 of the foods.



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1 (c) All school food-nutrition services shall be operated on a nonprofit basis, and any 2 earnings therefrom over and above the cost of operation as defined herein shall be used to reduce 3 the cost of food, to serve better healthier food, or to provide free or reduced-price lunches to 4 indigent children breakfast and lunch to students and for no other purpose. The term "cost of operation" means the actual cost incurred in the purchase and preparation of food, the salaries of 5 6 all personnel directly engaged employed in providing food school nutrition services, and the cost 7 of nonfood supplies as outlined under standards adopted by the State Board of Education. 8 "Personnel" means child nutrition supervisors or directors, bookkeepers persons directly engaged 9 employed in food service record keeping and those persons directly involved in preparing and 10 serving food. Child the operation of the school nutrition program. School nutrition personnel 11 shall be paid from the funds of food services school nutrition services only for services rendered in behalf of the child-school nutrition program. Any cost incurred in the provisions and 12 13 maintenance of school food services over and beyond the cost of operation shall be included in 14 the budget request filed annually by local boards of education with boards of county commissioners. Public schools school units are not required to comply with G.S. 115C-522(a) in 15 16 the purchase of supplies and food for such school food-nutrition services." 17 SECTION 3.(a) Article 14A of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by 18 adding a new section to read: 19 "§ 115C-218.4. Charter school nutrition. 20 The charter school may provide school nutrition services for enrolled students by 21 participating in federally assisted school nutrition programs. All school nutrition services 22 provided at the school shall meet the same standards and regulations described in 23 G.S. 115C-263." 24 **SECTION 3.(b)** G.S. 115C-75.9(*l*) reads as rewritten: 25 School Nutrition Program. - The innovative school shall participate in the National "(1) School Lunch Program, as provided in G.S. 115C-264. provide school nutrition services for 26 27 enrolled students by participating in federally assisted school nutrition programs. All school 28 nutrition services provided at the school shall meet the same standards and regulations described 29 in G.S. 115C-263." 30 SECTION 3.(c) G.S. 115C-238.72(b) reads as rewritten: 31 Food Service. - The local school administrative unit identified by resolution shall "(b) 32 provide, to the extent practicable, provide school food services to the regional school. school in 33 accordance with G.S. 115C-263. For purposes of federal funding through the National School 34 Lunch Program or other federally supported food service programs, the local school 35 administrative unit identified by resolution shall be permitted to include eligible students enrolled 36 in the regional school. Other participating units shall not include students enrolled in the regional 37 school for purposes of federally supported food service programs." 38 SECTION 3.(d) G.S. 115C-150.14 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: 39 A school governed by this Article shall provide school nutrition services for enrolled "(a1) 40 students by participating in federally assisted school nutrition programs. All school nutrition services provided at the school shall meet the same standards and regulations described in 41 42 G.S. 115C-263." 43 **SECTION 3.(e)** G.S. 116-239.8(b)(4)c. reads as rewritten: 44 Food services. - Students enrolled in a laboratory school shall be "c. provided school nutrition services by the laboratory school 45 participating in federally assisted school nutrition programs. All 46 47 school nutrition services provided at the school shall meet the same 48 standards and regulations described in G.S. 115C-263. of Article 17 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes, the Department must all	locate to that Fund
three dollars (\$3.00) from the income taxes paid each year by each individual w	with an income tax
liability of at least that amount, if the individual agrees. A taxpayer must be give	en the opportunity
to indicate an agreement or objection to that allocation in the manner described	d in subsection (b)

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1 of this section. In the case of a married couple filing a joint return, each individual must have the 2 option of agreeing or objecting to the allocation. The amounts allocated under this subsection to 3 the Fund must be credited to it on a monthly basis. 4 Returns. – Individual income tax returns must give an individual an opportunity to (b) agree to the allocation of three dollars (\$3.00) of the individual's tax liability to the North Carolina 5 6 School Breakfast and Lunch Fund. The Department must make it clear to the taxpayer that the dollars will support financing for breakfast and lunch for students in public school units, as 7 8 defined in G.S. 115C-266(a), and that allocation of the dollars neither increases nor decreases the 9 individual's tax liability. The following statement must be used to meet this requirement: "Mark "Yes" if you want to designate \$3.00 of taxes to this special Fund for providing financing, 10 11 including administrative costs, for free breakfast and lunch meals to students in public schools. Marking "Yes" does not change your tax or refund." The Department must consult with the State 12 13 Board of Education to ensure that the information given to taxpayers complies with the intent of 14 this section. 15 The Department must inform the entities it approves to reproduce the return that they must 16 comply with the requirements of this section and that a return may not reflect an agreement or 17 objection unless the individual completing the return decided to agree or object after being 18 presented with the statement required by subsection (b) of this section and, as available 19 background information or instructions, the information required by subsection (c) of this 20 section. No software package used in preparing North Carolina income tax returns may default 21 to an agreement or objection. A paid preparer of tax returns may not mark an agreement or 22 objection for a taxpayer without the taxpayer's consent. 23 Instructions. - The instructions for individual income tax returns must include the (c) 24 following explanatory statement: "The North Carolina School Breakfast and Lunch Fund 25 provides an alternative source of funding to offset the costs of breakfast and lunch meals for 26 students attending public school. Three dollars from the taxes you pay will go to the Fund if you mark an agreement. Regardless of what choice you make, your tax will not increase, nor will any 27 refund be reduced."" 28 29 **SECTION 5.(b)** This section is effective for taxes imposed for taxable years 30 beginning on or after January 1, 2021. 31 **SECTION 6.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 32 Public Instruction the sum of two hundred million dollars (\$200,000,000) in nonrecurring funds 33 for the 2021-2022 fiscal year to provide free breakfast and lunch for students in the 2021-2022 34 school year in accordance with this act and the sum of two hundred million dollars 35 (\$200,000,000) in recurring funds for the 2022-2023 fiscal year to supplement the Fund 36 established pursuant to Section 4 of this act.

37 SECTION 7. Except as otherwise provided, this act becomes effective July 1, 2021,
 38 and applies beginning with the 2021-2022 school year.
