21		CTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the	-	
22	•	Public Safety the sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) in nonrecurring funds		
23	for the 2021-2022 fiscal year to allocate to the Alcoholic Beverage Commission to use for the			
24	design and development of a system to create, maintain, and disseminate the record required by			
25	G.S. 18B-204(a3) as enacted in Section 1 of this act. The funds shall not revert at the end of the			
26	2021-2022 fiscal year but shall remain available to be used in accordance with this section.			
27	SECTION 3. Section 1 of this act becomes effective January 1, 2022, and applies to			
28	all spirituous liquor received or distributed on or after that date. The remainder of this act			
29	becomes effecti	ive July 1, 2021.
