5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
6	<b>SECTION 1.</b> Consistent with the goals of Medicaid transformation outlined in			
7	Session Law 2015-245, as amended, the Department of Health and Human Services shall enter			
8	into capitated contracts with at least two prepaid dental plans for the provision of dental services			
9	to Medicaid and NC Health Choice recipients. For the purposes of this act, dental services are			
10	services that are rendered by licensed dental and specialist providers, and a prepaid dental plan			
11	is any entity that operates or will operate a capitated contract for the provision of dental services,			
12	either directly or by contracting with dental providers, pursuant to this act.			
13	<b>SECTION 2.(a)</b> Contracts for the provision of dental services entered into pursuant			
14	to Section 1 of this act shall be the result of requests for proposals issued by the Department of			
15	Health and Human Services (DHHS) and the submission of competitive bids by prepaid dental			
16	plans. DHHS shall oversee, monitor, and enforce capitated dental services contract performance			
17		tract. Contracts shall include, at a minimum, all of the following:

34		portion that is at risk for achievement of quality and outcome measures,		
35		including value-based payments.
