- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 14-09-09.38 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the child support obligation of an incarcerated parent.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 14-09-09.38 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **14-09-09.38. Child support obligation of incarcerated parents.**

- A monthly support obligation established under any provision of this code and in effect
 after December 31, 2017, expires by operation of law upon incarceration of the obligor
 under a sentence of one hundred eighty days or longer, excluding credit for time
 served before sentencing.
- Notwithstanding subsection 1, a monthly support obligation may be established for an
 obligor who is incarcerated under a sentence of one hundred eighty days or longer if
 the obligation is based on actual income of the obligor and the moving party makes a
 prima facie showing that the obligor's income exceeds the minimum amount provided
 in the guidelines established under section 14-09-09.7.
- As used in this section, "incarceration" means placement of an obligor in a custodial
 setting in which the obligor is not permitted to earn wages from employment outside
 the correctional facility, and does not include probation or work release.
- The expiration of a monthly support obligation under subsection 1 does not affect any
 past-due support that is owed before the expiration of the obligation.

 23 obligation can be re-established after the obligor is released from incarceration.
