1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of

2 public instruction, the state library, the school for the deaf, and the North Dakota vision

3 services - school for the blind.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 6 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 7 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 8 other income, to the department of public instruction, the school for the deaf, North Dakota 9 vision services - school for the blind, and the state library for the purpose of defraying the 10 expenses of those agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 11 2019, as follows:

6 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - TUITION APPORTIONMENT. The sum of \$219,134,000,

7 included in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is

8 from the state tuition fund in the state treasury. Any additional amount in the state tuition fund

9 that becomes available for distribution to public schools is appropriated to the department of

10 public instruction for that purpose for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30,

11 2019.

12 SECTION 4. INTEGRATED FORMULA PAYMENTS AND SPECIAL EDUCATION

13 CONTRACTS EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY. The superintendent of public instruction may
14 expend funds included in the integrated formula payments and grants - special education
15 contracts line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act in payment of grants for educational
16 services that were due in the 2015-17 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly
17 supported by the education provider until after June 30, 2017.

18 SECTION 5. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM - MEDICAID MATCHING FUNDING 19 DISTRIBUTION.

- The sum of \$800,000, included in the integrated formula payments line item in
 subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be distributed to reimburse school districts
 or special education units for gifted and talented programs upon the submission of an
 application that is approved in accordance with guidelines adopted by the
 superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall
 encourage cooperative efforts for gifted and talented programs among school districts
 and special education units.
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 2. State school aid payments for special education must be reduced by the amount of
 28 matching funds required to be paid by school districts or special education units for
 29 students participating in the medicaid program. Special education funds equal to the
 30 amount of the matching funds required to be paid by the school district or special

12	departme	nt of public instruction may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its operating account.	
13	SECI	ION 10. STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES. The line item entitled grants in	
14	subdivisio	n 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$2,033,000 for aid to public libraries, of which no	
15	more thar	one-half is to be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.	
16	SECI	ION 11. FEES DEPOSITED IN NORTH DAKOTA VISION SERVICES - SCHOOL	
17	FOR THE	BLIND OPERATING FUND. Any moneys included in the estimated income line item	
18	in subdivi	sion 4 of section 1 of this Act, collected for subscription fees or braille fees, must be	
19	deposited	in the North Dakota vision services - school for the blind operating fund in the state

21	SECT	ION 12. SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF - HIGHER EDUCATION INTERPRETER GRANT	
22	PROGRA	M . The grants line item contained in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act is for the	
23	purpose o	f providing grants to assist institutions under the control of the state board of higher	
24	education	with the cost of interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf or	
25	hard of he	aring, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. Moneys	
26	appropria	ted for this program are not subject to section 54-44.1-11. Funds must be distributed	
27	pursuant	to the provisions of this section:	
28	1.	The school for the deaf shall develop a formula to determine the grant amount for	
29		which an institution is eligible. The formula must be based on an uniform hourly	

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2.	To obtain a grant under this section, an institution shall submit to the school for the
	deaf, at the time and in the manner directed by the school, invoices showing the
	amount expended for interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf
	or hard of hearing.
3.	The school for the deaf may not distribute more than fifty percent of the amount
	appropriated during the first year of the biennium.
4.	If any grant moneys remain undistributed at the end of the biennium, the school for the
	deaf shall provide additional prorated grants to institutions that incurred, during the
	biennium, hourly expenses in excess of the formula reimbursement level.
5.	At the request of an institution under the control of the state board of higher education,
	the school for the deaf shall consult with the institution and provide advice regarding
	the provision of services most appropriate to meet a student's needs.
SEC	TION 13. OTHER GRANTS - REPORTING. The superintendent of public instruction
shall cor	ntinue reporting on the cost per participant and the outcomes of other grants and report
to the size	ty-sixth legislative assembly regarding participation, cost, and outcomes of these
grants.
