1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of 2 public instruction, the state library, the school for the deaf, and the North Dakota vision 3 services - school for the blind; to create and enact a new section to chapter 25-06 and a new 4 section to chapter 25-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the school for the blind 5 fund and the school for the deaf fund; to repeal section 6-09-45 of the North Dakota Century 6 Code and section 13 of chapter 49 of the 2015 Session Laws, relating to a required transfer 7 from the Bank of North Dakota and a contingent appropriation; to provide exemptions; to 8 provide for a transfer; to provide a statement of legislative intent; to provide for a legislative 9 management study; and to declare an emergency.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of public instruction, the school for the deaf, North Dakota vision services - school for the blind, and the state library for the purpose of defraying the expenses of those agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, as follows:

7 The 2017-19 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the

8 2019-21 biennium. The department of public instruction, school for the deaf, and North Dakota

9 vision services - school for the blind shall report to the appropriations committees of the

10 sixty-sixth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning

11 July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

12 SECTION 4. TRANSFER - PUBLIC INSTRUCTION FUND TO STATE TUITION FUND.

13 During the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, the office of

management and budget shall transfer \$4,282,905 from the public instruction fund to the state
tuition fund for the purpose of providing funding for integrated formula payments.

SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - TUITION APPORTIONMENT. The sum of \$305,546,905, included in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is from the state tuition fund in the state treasury. Any additional amount in the state tuition fund that becomes available for distribution to public schools is appropriated to the department of public instruction for that purpose for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

22 SECTION 6. ESTIMATED INCOME - FOUNDATION AID STABILIZATION FUND. The

estimated income line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$295,100,000 from

the foundation aid stabilization fund. Of this amount, \$100,000 is for regional education

association merger grants and \$295,000,000 is for integrated formula payments. Of the total

26 provided, \$185,100,000 is considered to be one-time funding.

27 SECTION 7. ESTIMATED INCOME - ONE-TIME FUNDING - STUDENT LOAN TRUST

- **FUND.** The estimated income line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes
- 29 \$220,000 from the student loan trust fund for the purpose of providing a one-time grant for
- 30 North Dakota governor's school science, technology, engineering, and mathematics programs.

SECTION 8. FUNDING TRANSFER - EXEMPTION - AUTHORIZATION. Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the superintendent of public instruction may transfer up to \$1,200,000 from the integrated formula payments line item to the grants - special education line item and up to \$108,000 from the integrated formula payments line item to the grants - transportation line item, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. The superintendent of public instruction shall notify the office of management and budget of any transfer made pursuant to this section.

8 SECTION 9. EXEMPTION - ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM FUNDING. The 9 unexpended amount remaining from the transfer of \$1,252,627 from the 2013-15 biennium, as 10 authorized in section 32 of chapter 137 of the 2015 Session Laws to enhance the delivery of 11 and the participation of students and teachers in advanced placement courses during the 12 2015-17 biennium, is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11 at the end of the 13 2015-17 biennium and may be continued into the 2017-19 biennium for the purpose of program 14 grants, including leveraging the senior year, leadership program, continuing education grants, 15 preschool continuing education grants, curriculum alignment grants, and teacher and principal 16 evaluation system grants. 17 SECTION 10. INTEGRATED FORMULA PAYMENTS AND SPECIAL EDUCATION

18 CONTRACTS EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY. The superintendent of public instruction may 19 expend funds included in the integrated formula payments and grants - special education line 20 items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act in payment of grants for educational services that 21 were due in the 2015-17 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly supported by 22 the education provider until after June 30, 2017. To be reimbursed under this section, claims 23 must be properly supported and filed with the superintendent of public instruction by June 30, 2018.

SECTION 11. GRANTS - SPECIAL EDUCATION DEFICIENCY AUTHORIZATION. If funds provided to the superintendent of public instruction in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act for grants - special education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, are not sufficient to meet special education contract obligations, the superintendent of public instruction shall request supplemental funding from the sixty-sixth legislative assembly.

30 SECTION 12. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM - MEDICAID MATCHING FUNDING 31 DISTRIBUTION.

1	2. If any of the amount appropriated for this purpose remains after the superintendent of
2	public instruction has awarded grants to all eligible recipients, the superintendent shal
3	distribute that amount as an additional per student payment on a prorated basis,
4	according to the latest available average daily membership of each school district.
5	SECTION 15. REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATION MERGER GRANTS - ONE-TIME
6	FUNDING - DISTRIBUTION. The grants - other grants line item included in subdivision 1 of
7	section 1 of this Act includes \$100,000 from the foundation aid stabilization fund for the purpose
8	of providing a one-time \$25,000 grant to each regional education association that merges with
9	another regional education association to form a single entity with a single governing board
10	during the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.
11	SECTION 16. REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATION GRANTS - DISTRIBUTION. The
12	integrated formula payments line item included in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes
13	\$500,000 from the general fund for the purpose of providing annual grants to regional education
14	associations for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. An annual
15	grant of \$31,250 is provided to each regional education association that exists as of July 1,
16	2017. Regional education associations that merge during the 2017-19 biennium are entitled to
17	the annual grants that would have been paid to each of the member associations.
18	SECTION 17. EXEMPTION - INDIRECT COST ALLOCATION. Notwithstanding section
19	54-44.1-15, the department of public instruction may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its
20	operating account.
21	SECTION 18. STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES. The line item entitled grants in
22	subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$1,737,528 for aid to public libraries, of which no
23	more than one-half may be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.
24	SECTION 19. FEES DEPOSITED IN NORTH DAKOTA VISION SERVICES - SCHOOL
25	FOR THE BLIND OPERATING FUND. Any moneys included in the estimated income line item
26	in subdivision 4 of section 1 of this Act, collected for subscription fees or braille fees, must be
27	deposited in the North Dakota vision services - school for the blind operating fund in the state
28	treasury and may be spent subject to appropriation by the legislative assembly.
29	SECTION 20. SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF - HIGHER EDUCATION INTERPRETER GRANT
30	PROGRAM. The grants line item contained in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act is for the
31	purpose of providing grants to assist institutions under the control of the state board of higher

1	educatio	on with the cost of interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf or		
2	hard of hearing, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. Moneys			
3	appropr	iated for this program are not subject to section 54-44.1-11. Funds must be distributed		
4	pursuan	t to the provisions of this section:		
5	1.	The school for the deaf shall develop a formula to determine the grant amount for		
6		which an institution is eligible. The formula must be based on an uniform hourly		
7		reimbursement.		
8	2.	To obtain a grant under this section, an institution shall submit to the school for the		
9		deaf, at the time and in the manner directed by the school, invoices showing the		
10		amount expended for interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf		
11		or hard of hearing.		
12	3.	The school for the deaf may not distribute more than fifty percent of the amount		
13		appropriated during the first year of the biennium.		
14	4.	If any grant moneys remain undistributed at the end of the biennium, the school for the		
15		deaf shall provide additional prorated grants to institutions that incurred, during the		
16		biennium, hourly expenses in excess of the formula reimbursement level.		
17	5.	At the request of an institution under the control of the state board of higher education,		
18		the school for the deaf shall consult with the institution and provide advice regarding		
19		the provision of services most appropriate to meet a student's needs.		
20	SEC	TION 21. PASSTHROUGH GRANTS - APPLICATION - DISTRIBUTION -		
21	REPOR	TING. The line item entitled grants - passthrough grants included in subdivision 1 of		
22	section	1 of this Act includes \$2,100,000 for passthrough grants for writing projects, an		
23	entrepreneur program, and a mentoring program. The superintendent of public instruction shall			
24	determine the manner in which each passthrough grant is distributed. Grantees, as a condition			
25	of receiving the grant, must establish performance measures to be reviewed by the			
26	superintendent of public instruction. Grantees shall report to the superintendent of public			
27	instruction regarding performance based on the measures before October 1, 2018. The			
28	superintendent of public instruction shall report to the appropriations committees of the			
29	sixty-sixth legislative assembly regarding funds granted, performance measures established for			
30	each grantee, and whether grantees met performance expectations.			

1 SECTION 22. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - TEACHER AND ADMINISTRATOR MENTORING. 2 It is the intent of the sixty-fifth legislative assembly that school districts, in addition to mentoring 3 services provided by the state, use federal title II funding for teacher and administrator 4 mentoring. 5 SECTION 23. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS. 6 During the 2017-18 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the feasibility 7 and desirability of combining services for any or all English language learner programs, 8 distance learning programs, regional education agencies, teacher center networks, adult 9 learning centers, career and technical education programs, education technology services, 10 continuing education for counselors, educational leadership, and the teacher mentoring 11 program. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together 12 with any legislation necessary to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-sixth legislative 13 assembly. 14 SECTION 24. A new section to chapter 25-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 15 and enacted as follows: 16 School for the blind fund. 17 The school for the blind fund is a special fund in the state treasury. All moneys received 18 pursuant to section 2 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota, revenues received from 19 services and leases, and contributions must be deposited in the fund. Moneys in the fund are to 20 be used pursuant to legislative appropriation for the provision of services under this chapter. 21 SECTION 25. A new section to chapter 25-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 22 and enacted as follows: 23 School for the deaf fund. 24 The school for the deaf fund is a special fund in the state treasury. All moneys received 25 pursuant to section 2 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota and all revenues received 26 from the lease of buildings and the provision of meals and services, including interpreter 27 services, must be deposited in the fund. Moneys in the fund are to be used pursuant to 28 legislative appropriation for provision of services under this chapter. 29 **SECTION 26. REPEAL.** Section 6-09-45 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed. 30 SECTION 27. REPEAL. Section 13 of chapter 49 of the 2015 Session Laws is repealed.

1 SECTION 28. EMERGENCY. Sections 8 and 27 of this Act are declared to be emergency

2 measures.
