1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of

2 public instruction, the state library, the school for the deaf, and North Dakota vision services -

3 school for the blind; to provide for the distribution of funding for gifted and talented programs

4 and other grants; to amend and reenact sections 15.1-02-02 and 15.1-18.1-02 of the North

5 Dakota Century Code, relating to the salary of the superintendent of public instruction and the

6 national board certification program; to provide an effective date; and to declare an emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 9 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 10 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 11 other income, to the department of public instruction, the school for the deaf, North Dakota 12 vision services - school for the blind, and the state library for the purpose of defraying the 13 expenses of those agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 14 2015, as follows:

27 North Dakota vision services - school for the blind shall report to the appropriations committees

28 of the sixty-fourth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium

beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

30 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from special funds derived from
 31 federal funds the sum of \$25,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the

1 superintendent of public instruction for grants for the period beginning with the effective date of

2 this Act and ending June 30, 2013.

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - TUITION APPORTIONMENT. The sum of \$140,326,000,
 included in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is
 from the state tuition fund in the state treasury. Any additional amount in the state tuition fund
 that becomes available for distribution to public schools is appropriated to the department of
 public instruction for that purpose for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30,
 SECTION 5. INTEGRATED FORMULA PAYMENTS - FUNDING FROM PROPERTY TAX

RELIEF FUND. The integrated formula payments line item contained in subdivision 1 of
section 1 of this Act include \$714,173,838 from the property tax relief sustainability fund which
is appropriated to the department of public instruction for the purpose of providing integrated
formula payments to school districts during the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending
June 30, 2015.

SECTION 6. INTEGRATED FORMULA PAYMENTS AND SPECIAL EDUCATION
 CONTRACTS EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY. The superintendent of public instruction may
 expend funds included in the integrated formula payments and grants - special education
 contracts line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act in payment of grants for educational
 services that were due in the 2011-13 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly

services that were due in the 2011-13 blenham but which were not med, claimed, or proper
 supported by the education provider until after June 30, 2013.

SECTION 7. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM - MEDICAID MATCHING FUNDING DISTRIBUTION.

- The sum of \$800,000, included in the integrated formula payments line item in
 subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be distributed to reimburse school districts
 or special education units for gifted and talented programs upon the submission of an
 application that is approved in accordance with guidelines adopted by the
 superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall
 encourage cooperative efforts for gifted and talented programs among school districts
 and special education units.
- 30 2. State school aid payments for special education must be reduced by the amount of
 31 matching funds required to be paid by school districts or special education units for

- 4 2. If any of the amount appropriated for this purpose remains after the superintendent of
 5 public instruction has awarded grants to all eligible recipients, the superintendent shall
 6 distribute that amount as an additional per student payment on a prorated basis,
 7 according to the latest available average daily membership of each school district.
- 8 **SECTION 10. INDIRECT COST ALLOCATION.** Notwithstanding section 54-44.1-15, the
- 9 department of public instruction may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its operating account.
- 10 SECTION 11. STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES. The line item entitled grants in
- 11 subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$1,766,500 for aid to public libraries, of which no
- more than one-half is to be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014.
- 13 SECTION 12. STATE LIBRARY LIBRARY RENOVATION AND REPAIR GRANTS -
- EXEMPTION. The grants line item contained in subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$275,000 from the general fund for grants to public libraries for renovation and repair projects. Grant procedures and award criteria may be developed by the state library and may include matching requirements. Any portion of the \$275,000 not spent as of June 30, 2015, is exempt from the provisions of section 54-44.1-11 and may be continued for the purposes of this grant program.
- 20 SECTION 13. FEES DEPOSITED IN NORTH DAKOTA VISION SERVICES SCHOOL
- FOR THE BLIND OPERATING FUND. Any moneys included in the estimated income line item in subdivision 4 of section 1 of this Act, collected for subscription fees or braille fees, must be deposited in the North Dakota vision services - school for the blind operating fund in the state treasury and may be spent subject to appropriation by the legislative assembly.
- 25 SECTION 14. SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF HIGHER EDUCATION INTERPRETER GRANT
- PROGRAM. The grants line item contained in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act is for the purpose of providing grants to assist institutions under the control of the state board of higher education with the cost of interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf or hard of hearing, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. Moneys appropriated for this program are not subject to section 54-44.1-11. Funds shall be distributed pursuant to the provisions of this section:

16	addition to any other compensation otherwise payable as a result of any contract				
17	neg	otiated under chapter 15.1-16.
