# **HOUSE BILL NO. 1073**

(At the request of the Governor)

- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
- 2 public instruction, the state library, the school for the deaf, and the North Dakota vision
- 3 services school for the blind; to create and enact a new section to chapter 25-06 and a new
- 4 section to chapter 25-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the school for the blind
- 5 fund and the school for the deaf fund; to amend and reenact section 15.1-02-02 of the North
- 6 Dakota Century Code, relating to the salary of the superintendent of public instruction; and to
- 7 provide for a transfer.

### 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of public instruction, the school for the deaf, North Dakota vision services - school for the blind, and the state library for the purpose of defraying the expenses of those agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, as follows:

18	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - TUITION APPORTIONMENT. The sum of \$301,264,000,			
19	included in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is			
20	from the state tuition fund in the state treasury. Any additional amount in the state tuition fund			
21	that becomes available for distribution to public schools is appropriated to the department of			
22	public instruction for that purpose for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30,			
23	2019.			
24	SECTION 4. TRANSFER. The office of management and budget shall transfer, on a			
25	quarterly basis, a total of \$140,000,000 from the foundation aid stabilization fund to the			
26	operating fund of the department of public instruction for the purpose of covering expenses in			
27	the integrated formula payment line in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, for the biennium			
28	beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.			
29	SECTION 5. INTEGRATED FORMULA PAYMENTS AND SPECIAL EDUCATION			
30	CONTRACTS EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY. The superintendent of public instruction may			
31	expend funds included in the integrated formula payments and grants - special education			

contracts line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act in payment of grants for educational services that were due in the 2015-17 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly supported by the education provider until after June 30, 2017.

# SECTION 6. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM - MEDICAID MATCHING FUNDING - DISTRIBUTION.

- 1. The sum of \$800,000, included in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be distributed to reimburse school districts or special education units for gifted and talented programs upon the submission of an application that is approved in accordance with guidelines adopted by the superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall encourage cooperative efforts for gifted and talented programs among school districts and special education units.
- 2. State school aid payments for special education must be reduced by the amount of matching funds required to be paid by school districts or special education units for students participating in the medicaid program. Special education funds equal to the amount of the matching funds required to be paid by the school district or special education unit must be paid by the superintendent of public instruction to the department of human services on behalf of the school district or unit.

SECTION 7. REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATIONS - GRANTS. During the 2017-19 biennium, the superintendent of public instruction shall expend up to \$800,000 from the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act for the purpose of providing an annual grant to each eligible regional education association in order to assist each association with the cost of compensating a coordinator.

- 1. To receive a grant under this section, each regional education association must:
  - a. Enter a contract with an individual to serve as a coordinator, on a full-time or a part-time basis, for a duration of at least twelve months; and
  - Provide from other revenue sources at least thirty percent of the total compensation payable to the coordinator.
- 2. The maximum grant payable to a regional education association under this section during each year of the biennium is the lesser of \$50,000 or seventy percent of the total compensation payable to the coordinator.

#### 1 **SECTION 8. TRANSPORTATION GRANTS - DISTRIBUTION.** 2 During each year of the 2017-19 biennium, the superintendent of public instruction 1. 3 shall calculate the payment to which each school district is entitled based on the state 4 transportation formula as it existed on June 30, 2001, except that the superintendent 5 shall provide reimbursement at the rate of: 6 One dollar and three cents per mile for school buses having a capacity of ten or a. 7 more passengers; 8 Forty-eight cents per mile for vehicles having a capacity of nine or fewer b.

c. Forty-eight cents per mile, provided;

passengers;

- (1) The student being transported is a student with a disability, as defined in chapter 15.1-32;
- (2) The student's individualized education program plan requires that the student attend a public or a nonpublic school located outside the student's school district of residence;
- (3) The student is transported by an adult member of the student's family;
- (4) The student is transported in a vehicle furnished by the student's parents;
- (5) The student's transportation is paid for by the student's parents; and
- (6) The reimbursement does not exceed two round trips daily between the student's home and school.
- d. Forty-eight cents per mile, one way, provided:
  - (1) The student being transported resides more than two miles from the public school that the student attends;
  - (2) The student is transported by an adult member of the student's family;
  - (3) The student is transported in a vehicle furnished by the student's parents; and
  - (4) The student's transportation is paid for by the student's parents.
- e. Twenty-eight cents per student for each one-way trip.
- 2. The superintendent of public instruction shall use the latest available student enrollment count in each school district in applying the provisions of subsection 1.

Legislative Assembly 1 If any moneys provided for transportation payments in the grants - transportation line 2 item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, remain after application of the formula 3 provided for in this section, the superintendent of public instruction shall prorate the 4 remaining amounts according to the percentage of the total transportation formula 5 amount to which each school district is entitled. 6 4. This section does not authorize the reimbursement of any costs incurred in providing 7 transportation for student attendance at extracurricular activities or events. 8 SECTION 9. CONTINUING EDUCATION GRANTS - FUNDING - DISTRIBUTION. The 9 sum of \$125,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the grants - other 10 grants line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act is provided for continuing education 11 grants, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. 12 The superintendent of public instruction shall award grants in amounts up to \$1,200 to 13 eligible recipients in chronological order, based on the date of an individual's 14 application. An eligible recipient must: 15 Be licensed to teach by the education standards and practices board: 16 (2) Have taught in this state during each of the last three school years; and 17 (3) Be enrolled at an institution of higher education in this state in either a 18 master of education program in educational leadership or a program leading 19 to a specialist diploma in educational leadership; 20 Be pursuing the requirements for a certificate in career development facilitation: b. 21 or 22 Be pursuing a school counselor credential. 23 2. If any of the amount appropriated for this purpose remains after the superintendent of 24 public instruction has awarded grants to all eligible recipients, the superintendent shall 25 distribute that amount as an additional per student payment on a prorated basis,

SECTION 10. INDIRECT COST ALLOCATION. Notwithstanding section 54-44.1-15, the department of public instruction may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its operating account.

SECTION 11. STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES. The line item entitled grants in subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$1,919,700 for aid to public libraries, of which no more than one-half is to be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

# Sixty-fifth Legislative Assembly 1 SECTION 12. SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF - HIGHER EDUCATION INTERPRETER GRANT 2 PROGRAM. The grants line item contained in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act is for the 3 purpose of providing grants to assist institutions under the control of the state board of higher 4 education with the cost of interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf or 5 hard of hearing, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. Moneys 6 appropriated for this program are not subject to section 54-44.1-11. Funds must be distributed 7 pursuant to the provisions of this section: 8 The school for the deaf shall develop a formula to determine the grant amount for 9 which an institution is eligible. The formula must be based on an uniform hourly 10 reimbursement. 11 To obtain a grant under this section, an institution shall submit to the school for the 2. 12 deaf, at the time and in the manner directed by the school, invoices showing the 13 amount expended for interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf 14 or hard of hearing. 15 The school for the deaf may not distribute more than fifty percent of the amount 16 appropriated during the first year of the biennium. 17 If any grant moneys remain undistributed at the end of the biennium, the school for the 18 deaf shall provide additional prorated grants to institutions that incurred, during the 19 biennium, hourly expenses in excess of the formula reimbursement level. 20 5. At the request of an institution under the control of the state board of higher education, 21 the school for the deaf shall consult with the institution and provide advice regarding 22 the provision of services most appropriate to meet a student's needs. 23 SECTION 13. STATE SCHOOL AID PROGRAM. The sum of \$1,947,120,547 included in

STATE SCHOOL AID PROGRAM.** The sum of \$1,947,120,547 included in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act was calculated with the following assumption: Per student payment rates remain at \$9,646 for the 2017-18 academic year and increase to \$9,742 for the 2018-19 academic year.

**SECTION 14. GRANTS - OTHER GRANTS.** The line item entitled grants - other grants in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act contains \$7,965,661 of passthrough grants, of which no more than one-half is to be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

SECTION 15. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC

INSTRUCTION - STUDENT CONTRACTS AND TRANSPORTATION GRANTS. If any funding

  - Use any remaining funds to pay state obligations in excess of the amount appropriated for grants - transportation for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.
- 11 **SECTION 16. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-02-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 13 **15.1-02-02. Salary.**
- The annual salary of the superintendent of public instruction is one hundred sixteen
- 15 thousand nine hundred three dollars through June 30, 2016, and one hundred twenty thousand
- 16 four hundred ten dollars through June 30, 2018, and one hundred twenty-one thousand six
- 17 <u>hundred fourteen dollars</u> thereafter.
- 18 **SECTION 17.** A new section to chapter 25-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 19 and enacted as follows:
- 20 School for the blind fund.
- 21 The school for the blind fund is a special fund in the state treasury. All moneys received
- from North Dakota department of trust lands, contributions, and revenues received from the
- 23 provision of services and from the lease of buildings and land must be deposited in the fund.
- 24 Moneys in the fund are to be used pursuant to legislative appropriation for the provision of
- 25 <u>services under this chapter.</u>
- SECTION 18. A new section to chapter 25-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 28 School for the deaf fund.
- The school for the deaf fund is a special fund in the state treasury. All moneys received from
- 30 the North Dakota department of trust lands, and all revenues received from the lease of
- 31 buildings and the provision of meals and services, including interpreter services, must be

- 1 deposited in this fund. Moneys in the fund are to be used pursuant to legislative appropriation
- 2 for provision of services under this chapter.
