- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-09 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the joint employment of school district superintendents; and to amend
- 3 and reenact section 15.1-09-55 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the joint
- 4 employment of school district superintendents.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 7 and enacted as follows:
- 8 School district superintendent Joint employment.
- 9 If multiple school districts within a county have fewer than one thousand combined
- 10 students, the school districts may jointly employ a superintendent.
- 11 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-09-55 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 13 15.1-09-55. School district superintendent Joint employment Accreditation.
- 14 <u>1.</u> The superintendent of public instruction may not impose through the accreditation 15 process any penalties or sanctions on a school district for employing a superintendent 16 jointly with one or more other districts.
- 3. The superintendent of public instruction may not include as a condition for
 accreditation the requirement that a school district employ a full-time superintendent.
- The superintendent of public instruction may not impose through the accreditation
 process additional requirements on a superintendent employed by multiple school
 districts above or beyond the accreditation requirements for a superintendent

The superintendent may not require, through the accreditation process, that an employee of a school district having fewer than one hundred students in high school spend more than thirty-three percent of the employee's time performing the duties of a school principal if the school district employs a superintendent jointly with one or more other districts.
