6	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code is created			
7	and enacted as follows:			
8	Corporate headquarters relocation program.			
9	<u>1.</u>	The	e commissioner shall establish and implement a corporate headquarters relocation	
10		pro	gram to provide grants to qualified businesses that locate or relocate the	
11		<u>bus</u>	inesses' headquarters to the state. The grants awarded by the department under	
12		<u>this</u>	section may not exceed the biennial appropriation for the grant program.	
13	<u>2.</u>	In order to qualify for receipt of a grant under the program:		
14		<u>a.</u>	An applicant must be an out-of-state, energy-related business that is locating or	
15			relocating its headquarters in this state;	
16		<u>b.</u>	The applicant must have at least ten employees who are located and working in	
17			North Dakota on a full-time, permanent basis; and	
18		<u>C.</u>	The applicant's business may not be a professional services company.	
19	<u>3.</u>	The	e department shall award a qualified grant recipient a grant that is distributed in	
20		thre	ee equal annual grant payments. The department may not distribute an annual	
21		grai	nt payment unless the recipient establishes the business maintained its	
22		qua	diffications for the preceding twelve months. If a grant recipient fails to maintain its	
23		gua	alifications for any year, the recipient is disqualified from receiving any remaining	

grant payments related to the award under this section.

1 The department shall calculate the amount of a grant recipient's grant award under 2 this section by determining the number of the business's qualified employees. In order 3 to qualify as an employee under this subsection, the employee must be located in 4 North Dakota and working in the business's North Dakota headquarters on a full-time, 5 permanent basis. A grant award is calculated as follows: 6 One hundred thousand dollars per qualified employee with an annual salary of at <u>a.</u> 7 least four hundred percent of the statewide average annual wage; and 8 Fifty thousand dollars per qualified employee with an annual salary of at least two <u>b.</u> 9 hundred and fifty percent and less than four hundred percent of the statewide 10 average annual wage. 11 5. Although a qualified business may apply for more than one grant award under this 12 section, a qualified employee under subsection 4 may not be counted in more than 13 one grant application. 14 **SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general 15 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$2,500,000, or so much of the 16 sum as may be necessary, to the department of commerce for the purpose of funding the 17 corporate headquarters relocation program, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and 18 ending June 30, 2015. 19 **SECTION 3. EXEMPTION.** The amount appropriated for the corporate headquarters 20 relocation program in section 2 of this Act is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any 21 unexpended funds from this appropriation are available for payment of grants that were 22 awarded during the 2013-15 biennium. 23 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION DATE. Section 1 of this Act is effective through July 30, 2015,
