- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 16.1-05 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the appointment of poll checkers; to amend and reenact sections
- 3 16.1-02-05, 16.1-05-04, 16.1-05-07, and 16.1-10-06.1 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 4 relating to verification of eligibility of voters; to repeal sections 16.1-05-06 and 58-04-09 of the
- 5 North Dakota Century Code, relating to challenging the right to vote; and to provide a penalty.

#### 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-02-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
   amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 **16.1-02-05.** Entry of new voters into the central voter file Query of the central voter 10 file for double voting Challenges Postelection verification.
  - 1. Within forty-five days following an election, the county auditor shall enter the name and required information of each individual who voted at the last election who is not already contained in the central voter file and update any required information requested and obtained at the last election for any individual contained in the central voter file.
  - 2. The secretary of state, with the assistance of the county auditors, within eighty-five days following an election, shall query the central voter file to determine if any individual voted more than once during the preceding election. The secretary of state shall immediately notify the county auditor and state's attorney in each affected county for further investigation.
  - 3. Upon return of any nonforwardable mail from an election official, the county auditor shall ascertain the name and address of that individual. If the individual is no longer at the address recorded in the central voter file, the county auditor shall transfer the voter to the correct precinct in the central voter file or notify the county of the voter's new

- residence so the voter record can be transferred to the correct county. If a notice mailed at least sixty days after the return of the first nonforwardable mail is also returned by the postal service, the county auditor shall designate the individual as "inactive" in the central voter file.
  - 4. Within forty-five days after an election, the county auditor shall send a notice to each individual who was challenged on election day according to section 16.1-05-06. If a notice is returned as not deliverable, the county auditor shall attempt to determine the reason for the return. A county auditor who does not receive or obtain satisfactory proof of an individual's eligibility to vote shall notify immediately the state's attorney to conduct an investigation of the individual's eligibility to vote in that election.
  - **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 16.1-05-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

## 16.1-05-04. Duties of the members of the election board during polling hours.

- The election inspector shall supervise the conduct of the election to ensure all election
  officials are properly performing their duties at the polling place. The election inspector
  shall assign duties so as to equally and fairly include both parties represented on the
  election board.
- 2. The election inspector shall assign ministerial duties to poll clerks, who shall carry out the ministerial duties assigned by the election inspector.
- 3. The election inspector shall assign the poll clerks to perform the function of maintaining the pollbook. The designated poll clerks shall maintain the pollbook. The pollbook must contain the name and address of each individual voting at the precinct and must be arranged in the form and manner prescribed by the secretary of state.
- 4. The members of the election board shall challenge the right of anyone to vote whom they know or have reason to believe is not a qualified elector by requiring the elector to complete and sign a voter's affidavit.
- 5. Each member of the election board shall remain on the premises of the polling place during the time the polls are open to prevent the occurrence of fraud, deceit, or other irregularity in the conduct of the election.
- 6.5. All members of the election board shall distribute ballots and other election materials to electors. An election judge from each party represented on the election board shall

1 give any assistance requested by electors in marking ballots or operating electronic 2 voting system devices. 3 <del>7.</del>6. Each member of the election board shall maintain order in the polling place. 4 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-05-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows: 6 16.1-05-07. Poll clerks to check identification and verify eligibility - Poll clerks to 7 request, correct, and update incorrect information contained in the pollbook. 8 Before delivering a member of the election board delivers a ballot to an individual 9 according to section 16.1-13-22, the poll clerks shall request the individual to show 10 identification, which includes the individual's residential address and date of birth. 11 The An approved form of identification may include includes: 12 An official form of identification issued by the state; 13 An official form of identification issued by a tribal government; b. 14 A form of identification prescribed by the secretary of state; or C. 15 A combination of any of the forms of identification under subdivisions a through c. 16 If an individual offering to vote does not have or refuses to show an appropriate form-17 of identification, the individual may be allowed to vote without being challenged 18 according to section 16.1-05-06 if the individual provides to the election board the 19 individual's date of birth and if a member of the election board or a clerk knows the 20 individual and can personally vouch that the individual is a qualified elector of the 21 precinct. 22 If an individual offering to vote does not meet either of the options set forth in 23 subsection 1 or 2, the election board shall challenge the individual's right to vote and 24 the individual may not vote unless the individual executes a voter's affidavit, as-25 provided in section 16.1-05-06. 26 <del>4.</del> When verifying an individual's eligibility or when entering the name of an a. 27 individual into the pollbook, poll clerks shall request, correct, and update any 28 incorrect or incomplete information about an individual required to be included in 29

the pollbook generated from the central voter file.

1 If the individual's name is contained in the pollbook generated from the central 2 voter file, the poll clerks shall verify the individual's residential address and 3 mailing address, if different from the individual's residential address. 4 If the individual's name is not contained in the pollbook generated from the C. 5 central voter file but the individual is determined eligible to vote, the poll clerks 6 shall record the individual's name in the pollbook. The poll clerks shall request 7 and obtain any additional information for the individual required to be included in 8 the pollbook. 9 <del>5.</del>3. Poll clerks shall direct an individual who is attempting to vote in the incorrect precinct 10 to the proper precinct and voting location. 11 SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 16.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 12 and enacted as follows: 13 Poll checkers. 14 The district chairman of each political party represented on the election board may appoint 15 up to three poll checkers to a polling place. A poll checker may not interfere with the election 16 process or with the members of the election board in the performance of the member's duties. A 17 poll checker may not be a member of the election board. The district chairman shall notify the 18 county auditor of each county contained in the legislative district one day before the day of the 19 election of the name of any individual the district chairman has appointed to serve as a poll 20 checker in the legislative district. 21 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-10-06.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 22 amended and reenacted as follows: 23 16.1-10-06.1. Paying for certain election-related activities prohibited. 24 No 25 1. A person may <u>not</u> pay <del>another personany individual</del> for: 26 <del>1.</del> Any loss or damage due to attendance at the polls; <u>a.</u> 27 <del>2.</del> <u>b.</u> Registering; 28 The expense of transportation to or from the polls; or <del>3.</del> C. 29 <del>4.</del> d.
