- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 16.1-04-02 and 16.1-11.1-01 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to voting places.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-04-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 16.1-04-02. Voting places - Duties and responsibilities of the board of county

7 commissioners or the governing body of the city.

8 The board of county commissioners of each county:

- 9 1. Shall designate a voting place for each precinct and may alter the voting places when
- 10 there is a good and sufficient reason. However, the voting places for precincts
- 11 locatedany precinct that includes territory within the boundaries of any incorporated
- 12 city, the voting place must be designated, and altered if required, by the governing
- body of the city. <u>Each incorporated city that has a population of over one thousand</u>
- 14 <u>must have at least one voting place within the city open on the day of a statewide</u>
- 15 <u>election. Each legislative district must have at least one voting place within the district</u>
- 16 <u>open on the day of a statewide election. In any legislative district that comprises more</u>
- 17 than one county, at least one voting place within the district in each county must be
- 18 open on the day of a statewide election.
- Shall provide that all voting places are accessible to the elderly and the physically
 disabled.
- May utilize vote centers that contain all of the precincts in a county so that any
 qualified elector of the county may choose to cast a ballot in that polling location.
 Qualified electors may vote early at early voting precincts, by absentee ballot, at the

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1		polling location of their residential precinct, or at a county vote center. Vote center
2		polling places must serve as the designated polling place for at least one precinct in
3		the county in addition to serving as the site where any county voter may cast a ballot.
4		An individual voting or attempting to vote more than once in any single election is
5		guilty of a class A misdemeanor.
6	SEC	TION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-11.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
8	16.1	-11.1-01. Counties may conduct mail ballot elections - Polling places - Records.
9	1.	The board of county commissioners of a county may conduct an election by mail
10		ballot. The mail ballot election must include city elections administered by the county
11		auditor and may include any other election administered by the county auditor
12		pursuant to an agreement with the governing body of a political subdivision within the
13		county. The board and the governing body of a city shall designate one or more, as
14		provided under section 16.1-04-02, polling places in the county to be open on the day
15		of the election for voting in the usual manner. The county auditor shall place a notice
16		at all polling places in the county used at the last statewide election which states the
17		location of the polling places open for the election. The county auditor shall keep a
18		record of each mail ballot provided to qualified electors and provide to the election
19		board at each polling place open on the day of the election a list of every person who
20		applied for a mail ballot.
21	2.	The board of county commissioners of a county may conduct an election partially by
22		mail ballot. If the board of county commissioners chooses to conduct an election
23		partially by mail ballot, the commission may use mail ballots for any precinct in which
24		fewer than four hundred votes were cast for the office of governor at the last general
25		election at which that office was on the ballot.
