1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 54-52-06.4, subdivision e of subsection 3 of  
2 section 54-52-17, and subsection 4 of section 54-52-17 of the North Dakota Century Code,  
3 relating to retirement benefits for peace officers employed by the bureau of criminal  
4 investigation.

5 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-52-06.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 **54-52-06.4. Contribution by peace officers employed by the bureau of criminal**  
9 **investigation or security officers employed by the national guard - Employer**  
10 **contribution.**

11 1. a. Each peace officer employed by the bureau of criminal investigation who is a  
12 member of the public employees retirement system is assessed and shall pay  
13 monthly four percent of the employee's monthly salary. Peace officer  
14 contributions increase by one percent of the member's monthly salary beginning  
15 with the monthly reporting period of January 2012,~~and~~; with an additional  
16 increase of one percent, beginning with the reporting period of January 2013;  
17 with an additional increase of one percent, beginning with the reporting period of  
18 January 2024; and with an additional increase of one percent, beginning with the  
19 reporting period of January 2025.

20 b. Effective August 1, 2015, each national guard security officer who is a member of  
21 the public employee's retirement system is assessed and monthly shall pay six  
22 percent of the employee's monthly salary. National guard security officer  
23 contributions decrease by one-half of one percent of the member's monthly  
24 salary beginning with the monthly reporting period of January 2016.

1           c. The assessment under this subsection must be deducted and retained out of the  
2           employee's salary in equal monthly installments.

3           2. The employer of a peace officer's officer employed by the bureau of criminal  
4           investigation or national guard security officer's employer officer shall contribute an  
5           amount determined by the board to be actuarially required to support the level of  
6           benefits specified in section 54-52-17. The employer's contribution must be paid from  
7           funds appropriated for salary or from any other funds available for such purposes. If  
8           the peace officer's or security officer's assessment is paid by the employer under  
9           subsection 3 of section 54-52-05, the employer shall contribute, in addition, an amount  
10          equal to the required peace officer's or security officer's assessment.

11          **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Subdivision e of subsection 3 of section 54-52-17 of the North  
12          Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

13          e. Normal retirement date for a peace officer employed by the bureau of criminal  
14          investigation is:

15                (1) ~~The~~

16                (1) (a) For a member employed before August 1, 2023, the first day of the  
17                month next following the month in which the peace officer attains the  
18                age of fifty-five years and has completed at least three eligible years  
19                of employment; and

20                (b) For a member employed after July 31, 2023, the first day of the month  
21                next following the month in which the peace officer attains the age of  
22                fifty-five years and has completed at least ten eligible years of  
23                employment; or

24                (2) When the peace officer has a combined total of years of service credit and  
25                years of age equal to eighty-five and has not received a retirement benefit  
26                under this chapter.

27          **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 4 of section 54-52-17 of the North Dakota Century  
28          Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

29          4. The board shall calculate retirement benefits as follows:

30                a. Normal retirement benefits for all retirees, except supreme and district court  
31                judges and peace officers employed by the bureau of criminal investigation,

1 reaching normal retirement date equal an annual amount, payable monthly,  
2 comprised of a service benefit and a prior service benefit, as defined in this  
3 chapter, which is determined as follows:

4 (1) For members first enrolled:

5 (a) Before January 1, 2020, service benefit equals two percent of final  
6 average salary multiplied by the number of years of service  
7 employment.

8 (b) After December 31, 2019, service benefit equals one and seventy-five  
9 hundredths percent of final average salary multiplied by the number of  
10 years of service employment.

11 (2) Prior service benefit equals two percent of final average salary multiplied by  
12 the number of years of prior service employment.

13 b. Normal retirement benefits for all supreme and district court judges under the  
14 public employees retirement system reaching normal retirement date equal an  
15 annual amount, payable monthly, comprised of a benefit as defined in this  
16 chapter, determined as follows:

17 (1) Benefits must be calculated from the time of appointment or election to the  
18 bench and must equal three and one-half percent of final average salary  
19 multiplied by the first ten years of judicial service, two and eighty hundredths  
20 percent of final average salary multiplied by the second ten years of judicial  
21 service, and one and one-fourth percent of final average salary multiplied by  
22 the number of years of judicial service exceeding twenty years.

23 (2) Service benefits must include, in addition, an amount equal to the percent  
24 specified in subdivision a of final average salary multiplied by the number of  
25 years of nonjudicial employee service and employment.

26 c. Normal retirement benefits for a peace officer employed by the bureau of criminal  
27 investigation reaching the normal retirement date equals an annual amount,  
28 payable monthly, comprised of a service benefit and a prior service benefit  
29 determined as follows:

30 (1) The first twenty years of credited service multiplied by three percent of final  
31 average salary.

1                   (2) For years in excess of twenty years of credited service multiplied by one  
2                                   and seventy-five hundredths percent of final average salary.

3           d. Postponed retirement benefits are calculated as for single life benefits for those  
4           members who retired on or after July 1, 1977.

5           d-e. Early retirement benefits are calculated as for single life benefits accrued to the  
6           date of termination of employment, but must be actuarially reduced to account for  
7           benefit payments beginning before the normal retirement date, as determined  
8           under subsection 3. Except for a national guard security officer or firefighter, a  
9           firefighter employed by a political subdivision, a peace officer or correctional  
10          officer employed by the bureau of criminal investigation or by a political  
11          subdivision, or a supreme court or district court judge, early retirement benefits  
12          for members first enrolled after December 31, 2015, are calculated for single life  
13          benefits accrued to the date of termination of employment, but must be reduced  
14          by fixed rate of eight percent per year to account for benefit payments beginning  
15          before the normal retirement date. A retiree, other than a supreme or district court  
16          judge, is eligible for early retirement benefits only after having completed three  
17          years of eligible employment. A supreme or district court judge retiree is eligible  
18          for early retirement benefits only after having completed five years of eligible  
19          employment.

20          e-f. Except for supreme and district court judges, disability retirement benefits are  
21          twenty-five percent of the member's final average salary. Disability retirement  
22          benefits for supreme and district court judges are seventy percent of final  
23          average salary reduced by the member's primary social security benefits and by  
24          any workforce safety and insurance benefits paid. The minimum monthly  
25          disability retirement benefit under this section is one hundred dollars.
