## SECOND ENGROSSMENT with Senate Amendments REENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1475

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact three new sections to chapter 4.1-01.1 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to an agriculture diversification and development fund,
- 3 agriculture diversification and development committee, and agriculture diversification and
- 4 development fund grants program; to provide an appropriation; to provide a continuing
- 5 appropriation; and to provide for a transfer.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 4.1-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
  8 and enacted as follows:
- 9 <u>Agriculture diversification and development fund Continuing appropriation.</u>
- 10 <u>1.</u> <u>There is created in the state treasury the agriculture diversification and development</u>
- 11 <u>loan fund. The fund consists of all moneys transferred to the fund by the legislative</u>
- 12 assembly, interest upon moneys in the fund, and payments of interest and principal on
- 13 loans made from the fund. Moneys in the fund are appropriated to the Bank of North
- 14 Dakota on a continuing basis for loan disbursements, grants, and administrative costs
- pursuant to this section. No more than twenty-five percent of the fund may be utilized
   for grants in a biennium.
- 17 2. Loans, interest rate buydowns, or grants may be issued from the fund to support new
   18 or expanding value-added agriculture businesses that demonstrate financial feasibility.
- 19 <u>enhance profitability for farmers and ranchers, create jobs, and grow the state's</u>
- 20 <u>economy. Value-added agriculture businesses include food production or processing</u>
- 21 <u>facilities; feed or pet food processing facilities; commodity processing facilities;</u>
- 22 agriculture product manufacturers; and animal agriculture production facilities,
- 23 including swine, poultry, dairy, and feed lot production facilities.

8	one percent of the amount of the outstanding loans. The Bank shall contract with a					
9	certified public accounting firm to audit the fund if the fund has any loans. The cost of					
10	the audit must be paid from the fund.					
11	SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 4.1-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created					
12	and enacted as follows:

18		<u>a.</u>	<u>Fou</u>	r of the members appointed by the commissioner must be actively engaged		
19			<u>in fa</u>	arming in this state and the fifth member appointed by the commissioner must		
20			<u>be a</u>	actively engaged in agribusiness in this state.		
21		<u>b.</u>	<u>The</u>	governor shall appoint one member for a term of two years which expires in		
22			odd	-numbered years.		
23		<u>C.</u>	<u>The</u>	member appointed by the governor must be actively engaged in business in		
24			<u>this</u>	state.		
25		<u>d.</u>	<u>The</u>	remaining committee members must consist of:		
26			<u>(1)</u>	One representative from the independent community banks of North		
27				Dakota;		
28			<u>(2)</u>	One representative from the North Dakota bankers association;

1		(5) The agriculture commissioner or the commissioner's designee.					
2		e. The committee shall elect one of its members as chairman.					
3	<u>2.</u>	The agriculture diversification and development committee shall develop guidelines for					
4		the grants, including eligibility criteria and reporting requirements. The guidelines must					
5		include priority for businesses with a majority of the ownership comprised of North					
6		Dakota residents. The agriculture diversification and development committee shall					
7		review grant applications and make funding determinations.					
8	SEC	CTION 3. A new section to chapter 4.1-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created					
9	and enacted as follows:						
10	<u>Agr</u>	Agriculture diversification and development fund grants program - Access to					
11	<u>records</u>	<u>S.</u>					
12	<u>1.</u>	To the extent the agriculture diversification and development committee determines					
13		the materials or data provided under section 1 of this Act consist of trade secrets or					
14		commercial, financial, or proprietary information of individuals or entities applying for					
15		grants with the committee, materials and data submitted to, made by, or received by					
16		the committee, are not public records subject to section 44-04-18 and section 6 of					
17		article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota, and are subject to section 44-04-18.4.					
18	<u>2.</u>	A person may file a request with the committee to have material designated as					
19		confidential under subsection 1. The request must contain any information required by					
20		the committee and must include at least the following:					
21		a. A general description of the nature of the information sought to be protected;					
22		b. An explanation of why the information derives independent economic value,					
23		actual or potential, from not being generally known to other persons;					
24		c. An explanation of why the information is not readily ascertainable by proper					
25		means of other persons;					
26		d. A general description of any person that may obtain economic value from					
27		disclosure or use of the information, and how the person may obtain this value;					
28		and					
29		e. A description of the efforts used to maintain the secrecy of the information.					
30	<u>3.</u>	A request under subsection 2 is confidential. The committee shall examine the request					
31		and determine whether the information is relevant to the matter at hand and is a trade					

	secret under the definition in section 47-25.1-01 or 44-04-18.4. If the committee			
	determines the information is not relevant or not a trade secret, the committee shall			
	notify the requester and the requester may ask for the return of the information and			
	the request within ten days of the notice. If no return is sought, the information and			
	request are public records.			
<u>4.</u>	The names or identities of independent technical reviewers on a project or program			
	are confidential, may not be disclosed by the committee, and are not public records			
	subject to section 44-04-18 or section 6 of article XI of the Constitution of North			
	Dakota.			
SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER TO AGRICULTURE DIVERSIFICATION				
1 <b>AND DEVELOPMENT FUND.</b> There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in				
the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$10,000,000, or so much of the sum				
as may be necessary, to the agriculture diversification and development fund for the biennium				
beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.
