- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation; to provide for a transfer; to authorize full-time
- 2 equivalent positions; to provide an exemption; to provide for a report; and to provide an effective
- 3 date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION STATE TREASURER ONE-TIME FUNDING LOCAL
- 6 FISCAL RELIEF ALLOCATIONS TO POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS. In addition to the funding
- 7 provided under subdivision 1 of section 2 of House Bill No. 1395, as approved by the sixty-
- 8 seventh legislative assembly, there is appropriated from federal funds the sum of \$3,014,975, or
- 9 so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state treasurer for the purpose of providing
- 10 local fiscal relief allocations to political subdivisions, for the period beginning with the effective
- 11 date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023. The funding provided under this section is
- 12 considered a one-time funding item.
- 13 SECTION 2. TRANSFER BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA PROFITS UNIVERSITY OF
- 14 NORTH DAKOTA. The industrial commission shall transfer to the university of North Dakota
- 15 \$750,000 from the current earnings and accumulated undivided profits of the Bank of North
- 16 Dakota for expenses associated with campus network upgrades, for the period beginning with
- the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023.
- 18 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION ATTORNEY GENERAL ATTORNEY GENERAL
- 19 **REFUND FUND SALARY EQUITY INCREASES.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in
- 20 the attorney general refund fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of
- \$537,297, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the attorney general for the purpose
- 22 of providing salary equity increases to employees in the crime laboratory of the attorney
- 23 general's office, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30,
- 24 2023.

SECTION 4. DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT

- **POSITIONS.** Pursuant subsection 1 of section 26 of Senate Bill No. 2086, as approved by the
- 3 sixty-seventh legislative assembly, the department of human services is authorized sixteen full-
- 4 time equivalent positions for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending
- 5 June 30, 2023.

SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - ONE-TIME FUNDING - EXEMPTION.

- 1. There is appropriated from federal funds the sum of \$79,600,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of federal medical assistance percentage adjustments, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023. The funding provided under this section is considered a one-time funding item.
- 2. Notwithstanding section 7 of House Bill No. 1012, as approved by the sixty-seventh legislative assembly, the department of human services may use up to \$16,000,000 from general fund savings resulting from federal enhancements or adjustments that cause the federal medical assistance percentage to exceed the rates used by the sixty-seventh legislative assembly for budgeting purposes to address any decreases in the regular federal medical assistance percentage rate for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023.

SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - MEDICAID POSTPARTUM COVERAGE. There is appropriated from federal funds the sum of \$600,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of medicaid postpartum coverage, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023.

SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - LIFESPAN RESPITE CARE PROGRAM. There is appropriated from federal funds the sum of \$386,690, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of the lifespan respite care program, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023.

SECTION 8. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - VULNERABLE ADULT PROTECTION SERVICES PROGRAM. There is appropriated from federal funds the

1 sum of \$1,936,350, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human 2 services for the purpose of the vulnerable adult protection services program, for the period 3 beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023. 4 SECTION 9. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - ONE-TIME 5 FUNDING - SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM VERIFICATION 6 **DATABASE.** There is appropriated from federal funds the sum of \$239,558, or so much of the 7 sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of a 8 supplemental nutrition assistance program verification database, for the period beginning with 9 the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023. The funding provided under this section 10 is considered a one-time funding item. 11 SECTION 10. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - CHILDREN 12 AND FAMILY SERVICES TRANSITION PROGRAM. There is appropriated from federal funds 13 the sum of \$1,168,347, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of 14 human services for the purpose of children and family services transition program, for the 15 period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023. 16 SECTION 11. FUNDING TRANSFERS - EXEMPTION - AUTHORIZATION - REPORT. 17 Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the director of the office of management and budget shall 18 transfer appropriation authority between line items within subdivision 6 of section 1 of House Bill 19 No. 1394, as approved by the sixty-seventh legislative assembly, and subdivision 6 of section 2 20 of House Bill No. 1395, as approved by the sixty-seventh legislative assembly, for the period 21 beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023, as requested by the 22 department of human services. The department of human services shall notify the legislative 23 council of any transfer made pursuant to this section. The department shall report to the budget 24 section after June 30, 2022, any transfer made in excess of \$50,000 and to the appropriations 25 committees of the sixty-eighth legislative assembly regarding any transfers made pursuant to 26 this section. 27 SECTION 12. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - ONE-TIME 28 **FUNDING - STATE HOSPITAL.** There is appropriated from federal funds the sum of \$200,000, 29 or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the 30 purpose of defraying expenses at the state hospital, for the period beginning with the effective

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1 date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023. The funding provided under this section is 2 considered a one-time funding item. 3 SECTION 13. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - MONEY 4 FOLLOWS THE PERSON CAPACITY PROGRAM. There is appropriated from federal funds 5 the sum of \$5,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of 6 human services for the purpose of the money follows the person capacity program, for the 7 period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023. 8 SECTION 14. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - RANDOLPH 9 SHEPPARD VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION PROGRAM. There is appropriated from federal 10 funds the sum of \$22,663, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of 11 human services for the purpose of the Randolph Sheppard vocational rehabilitation program, for 12 the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023. 13 SECTION 15. APPROPRIATION - RETIREMENT AND INVESTMENT OFFICE -14 FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITIONS. There is appropriated out of any moneys from special 15 funds derived from income, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,806,862, or so much of 16 the sum as may be necessary, to the retirement and investment office for the purpose of new 17 full-time equivalent positions and salary adjustments, for the period beginning with the effective 18 date of this Act and ending June 30, 2023. Of the amount appropriated in this section, 19 \$1,731,862 is for salaries and wages and \$75,000 is for operating expenses. The retirement 20 and investment office is authorized six full-time equivalent positions. 21 SECTION 16. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION - PUBLIC 22 INSTRUCTION FUND - STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND - ONE-TIME FUNDING. There is 23 appropriated out of any moneys in the public instruction fund in the state treasury, derived from 24 reimbursements withheld from school districts' integrated formula payments, not otherwise 25 appropriated, the sum of \$10,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, and from 26 federal funds derived from the state fiscal recovery fund, the sum of \$100,000, or so much of 27 the fund as may be necessary, to the department of public instruction for the purpose of

information technology project upgrades to the state automated reporting system and the

withholding from school districts not eligible for federal elementary and secondary school

statewide longitudinal data system and for information technology upgrade funding in lieu of

- emergency relief funding allocations, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act
 and ending June 30, 2023. The funding provided in this section is a one-time funding item.
- 3 SECTION 17. EMERGENCY COMMISSION AND BUDGET SECTION SPENDING LIMIT
- 4 FOR SPECIAL FUNDS EXEMPTION. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection 4 of
- 5 section 54-16-04.2 regarding the aggregate request limit of \$5,000,000 per biennium, the
- 6 emergency commission may authorize up to \$20,000,000 of aggregate requests for special
- 7 funds and other sources under section 54-16-04.2, subject to any budget section approval
- 8 requirements, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.
- 9 **SECTION 18. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Act becomes effective on December 1, 2021.
