HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3050 of North Dakota

A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to consider studying issues of fairness and equity as they relate to child support guidelines and the obligor model.

WHEREAS, North Dakota law provides both parents have a mutual duty to support a child of the parents; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of a child to be supported emotionally, physically, and financially by both parents, regardless of the marital status of the parents; and

WHEREAS, more than a quarter of the children in North Dakota live in single-parent households; and

WHEREAS, concerns have been expressed the child support guidelines do not adequately recognize child support caps and as a result some child support payments are excessive and result in providing support to the obligee instead of to the child; and

WHEREAS, concerns have been expressed there are inequities in the child support guidelines and child support obligor model as they relate to children and obligors; and

WHEREAS, although the Legislative Management has studied the issue of child support guidelines and the obligor model in the past, including during the 1991-92, 1997-98, and 2009-10 interims, these studies have not adequately addressed these concerns regarding the child support guidelines and child support model;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Legislative Management consider studying issues of fairness and equity as they relate to child support guidelines and the obligor model; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Management report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the Sixty-seventh Legislative Assembly.
