1 A BILL for an Act providing an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the legislative branch

2 of state government; to provide for applications, transfers, and cancellation of unexpended

3 appropriations; to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-35 of the North Dakota Century

4 Code, relating to hosting out-of-state dignitaries; to amend and reenact subsections 1, 2, and 7

5 of section 54-03-20 and section 54-35-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to

6 legislative compensation and expense reimbursement; to provide legislative intent; to provide

7 an effective date; to provide for retroactive application; and to declare an emergency.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from the insurance
regulatory trust fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the legislative branch of state government
for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that branch, for the fiscal period beginning with the
effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2015, as follows:

The 2013-15 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the
2015-17 biennium. The legislative council shall report to the appropriations committees of the
sixty-fourth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning
July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

20 SECTION 4. TRANSFERS. Notwithstanding section 54-16-05, the director of the office of 21 management and budget and the state treasurer shall make transfers of funds between line 22 items of appropriations for the legislative management and legislative council as may be 23 requested by the chairman of the legislative management or the chairman's designee upon the 24 finding by the chairman or desginee that the nature of studies and duties assigned to the 25 legislative management or legislative council requires the transfers in properly carrying on the 26 legislative management's and legislative council's functions and duties. The director of the office 27 of management and budget and the state treasurer shall similarly make transfers of funds 28 between the line items for the sixty-third and sixty-fourth legislative assemblies, upon request by 29 the chairman of the legislative management or the chairman's designee upon the finding by the 30 chairman or designee that the transfers are required for the legislative assembly to carry on its 31 functions and duties.

25			for each calendar day during the period of any organizational, special, or regular
26			session. On August first of each even-numbered year, the director of the office of
27			management and budget shall set the maximum monthly reimbursement for the
28			subsequent two-year period at an amount equal to thirty times
29			sixty-fiveseventy-five percent of the daily lodging reimbursement in effect on that
30			date as provided under subdivision d of subsection 2 of section 44-08-04.

1	(1)	A member of the legislative assembly may elect to be reimbursed for less
2		than the amount to which the legislator is entitled under this subsection by
3		claiming the lesser amount on a voucher submitted with the receipt required

6		reduced maximum reimbursement for a single dwelling in which two or more
7		legislators share lodging and the total rent for that dwelling exceeds the
8		amount to which a legislator is entitled under subdivision a.

16	expenses	s incurred in attending said meetings and in the performance of their official
17	duties in	the amounts provided by law for other state officers.
18	2. In additio	on to the compensation provided in subsection 1, the chairman of the
19	legislativ	e management is entitled to receive an additional five dollars for each day
20	spent in a	attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees,
21	and the c	chairman of each of the legislative management's committees is entitled to
22	receive fi	ive dollars for each day spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative
23	manager	ment or of the committee which the person chairs.
24	SECTION 10.	AMENDMENT. Section 54-35-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
25	amended and reer	nacted as follows:
26	54-35-10. Con	npensation of members and leadership.
27	1. The men	nbers of the legislative management and the members of any committee of
28	the legisl	ative management are entitled to be compensated for the time spent in
29	attendan	ce at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees at the rate
30	of one hu	undred sixty-twosixty-seven dollars per day and must also be paid for

1		expenses incurred in attending said meetings and in the performance of their official		
2		duties in the amounts provided by law for other state officers.		
3	2.	In addition to the compensation provided in subsection 1, the chairman of the		
4		legislative management is entitled to receive an additional five dollars for each day		
5		spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees,		
6		and the chairman of each of the legislative management's committees is entitled to		
7		receive five dollars for each day spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative		
8		management or of the committee which the person chairs.		
9	SEC	TION 11. A new section to chapter 54-35 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
10	and ena	cted as follows:		
11	Leg	islative hosting of dignitaries.		
12	<u>The</u>	legislative management or the chairman of the legislative management may approve		
13	the hosting of out-of-state dignitaries on behalf of the legislative assembly and may authorize			
14	<u>the majo</u>	rity and minority leaders of the senate and the house of representatives or their		
15	designees to assist in the hosting of such dignitaries. An expenditure for the purchase of items			
16	to promo	ote or to host a dignitary under this section may not be construed as a gift for purposes		
17	of section 18 of article X of the Constitution of North Dakota. The provisions of chapter 44-08 do			
18	not apply	y to expenditures made under this section.		
19	SEC	TION 12. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the sixty-third legislative assembly		
20	that the	legislative management not proceed with implementing a process to record and archive		
21	video of	standing committee meetings during the legislative session for the biennium beginning		
22	July 1, 2	013, and ending June 30, 2015.		
23	SEC	TION 13. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the sixty-third legislative assembly		
24	that the	legislative management consider implementing during the sixty-fourth legislative		
25	assembl	y a limited bill analysis report pilot project to provide bill analysis reports similar to		
26	analysis	reports prepared in other states.		
27	SEC	TION 14. EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 6 and 9 of this Act become effective on July 1,		
28	2013, ar	nd sections 7 and 10 become effective on July 1, 2014.		
29	SEC	TION 15. RETROACTIVE APPLICATION. Section 8 of this Act applies retroactively to		
30	January	1, 2013.		
31	SEC	TION 16. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
