- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the North Dakota
- 2 university system; to amend and reenact sections 15-10-47, 15-62.2-02, and 15.1-21-02.6 of
- 3 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to construction project variance reports, student
- 4 financial assistance grants, and the North Dakota scholarships; to provide an exemption; to
- 5 provide for transfer of funds; to authorize the state board of higher education to issue and sell
- 6 bonds for capital projects; and to declare an emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income to the North Dakota university system office and to the various entities and institutions under the supervision of the state board of higher education for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the North Dakota university system office and to the various entities for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, as follows:

28	amende	d an	d reenacted as follows:
29	15-6	2.2-	02. State board of higher education - Powers and duties.

The state board of higher education shall:

- Administer the North Dakota student financial assistance program and the North
 Dakota scholars program and adopt functional rules regarding the eligibility and
 selection of grant and scholarship recipients.
 - Determine the amount of individual grants, which may not exceed one thousand
 fivesix hundred fifty dollars per recipient per academic year, under the North Dakota
 student financial assistance program.
 - For the North Dakota student financial assistance program, adopt criteria for substantial need, based upon the ability of the parents or guardian to contribute toward the applicant's educational expenses.
- Establish the appropriate procedures for fiscal control, fund accounting, and necessary
 reports.
 - 5. Apply for, receive, expend, and administer granted moneys from federal or private sources.
 - **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-02.6 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-21-02.6. North Dakota scholarship - Amount - Applicability.

- 1. a. The state board of higher education shall provide to any student certified as being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction either a North Dakota academic scholarship or a North Dakota career and technical education scholarship in the amount of seven hundredone thousand two hundred fifty dollars for each semester during which the student is enrolled full time at an accredited institution of higher education in this state and maintains a cumulative grade point average of 2.75.
 - b. The state board of higher education shall provide to any student certified as being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction either a North Dakota academic scholarship or a North Dakota career and technical education scholarship in the amount of five hundred dollars for each quarter during which the student is enrolled full time at an accredited institution of higher education in this state and maintains a cumulative grade point average of 2.75.
- 2. The state board shall monitor each scholarship recipient to ensure that the student meets the academic and other requirements of this section. Upon determining that a

1 recipient student has failed to meet the requirements of this section, the board shall 2 provide notification to the student within ten days. 3 3. A student is not entitled to receive more than sixten thousand dollars under this 4 section. 5 4. The state board of higher education shall forward the scholarship directly to the 6 institution in which the student is enrolled. 7 This section does not require a student to be enrolled in consecutive 5. a. (1) 8 semesters. 9 (2) This section does not require a student to be enrolled in consecutive 10 quarters. 11 b. However, a scholarship under this section is valid only for six academic years 12 after the student's graduation from high school and may not be applied to 13 graduate programs. 14 A scholarship under this section is available to any eligible resident student who fulfills 15 the requirements of section 15.1-21-02.4 or 15.1-21-02.5 and who graduates from: 16 A high school in this state; a. 17 b. A high school in a bordering state under chapter 15.1-29; or 18 C. A nonpublic high school in a bordering state while residing with a custodial parent 19 in this state. 20 For purposes of North Dakota scholarship eligibility under this section, "full-time" 7. 21 means enrollment in at least twelve credits during a student's first two semesters and 22 enrollment in at least fifteen credits during each semester thereafter or enrollment in 23 the equivalent number of credits, as determined by the state board of higher 24 education, with respect to students in a quarter system. 25 **SECTION 6. CAPITAL ASSETS.** The sum of \$10,436,045, or so much of the sum as may 26 be necessary, included in the capital assets line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, 27 must be used by the state board of higher education to satisfy outstanding bond obligations. 28 SECTION 7. NORTH DAKOTA STATE UNIVERSITY - MINARD HALL - BUDGET 29 **SECTION REPORT.** North Dakota state university may use unspent funding from the 30 \$5,000,000 appropriation received during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending

June 30, 2009, and unspent funding from the \$13,000,000 appropriation received during the

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- Legislative Assembly 1 biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011, for the Minard hall project, for the 2 biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. North Dakota state university shall 3 report to the budget section regarding the status of the Minard hall project and may request 4 increased spending authorization from the budget section for the project. 5 SECTION 8. SYSTEM INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES. The sum of 6 \$38,792,946, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the system information 7 technology services line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be used for the 8 benefit of the institutions and entities under the control of the state board of higher education, as 9 determined by the board. Funding allocations are to be made based on the North Dakota 10 university system information technology plan and data and technology priorities. Funds 11 allocated pursuant to this section must be used to support the system information technology 12 services, including the data network, video and collaborative academic services, the on-line 13 Dakota information network, connectND, and other related data technology initiatives and 14 services as determined by the board.
 - **SECTION 9. STUDENT LOAN TRUST FUND.** Subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$1,004,744, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the student loan trust fund of which \$465,307 is for the professional student exchange program and \$539,437 is for connectND campus solution positions, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.
 - **SECTION 10. DEFERRED MAINTENANCE POOL.** The deferred maintenance pool line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$10,000,000 which must be transferred by the state board of higher education to institutions under its control, based on the recommendation of the chancellor, to address deferred maintenance and other critical renovation needs as identified in the systemwide facility master plan.
 - SECTION 11. NEW PROGRAM STARTUP POOL. The new program startup pool line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$1,500,000 which must be transferred by the state board of higher education to institutions under its control, based on the recommendation of the chancellor, to assist with initiating new or expanding existing academic or technical programs that support state needs.

1	SECTION 12. STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE GRANTS. The student financial
2	assistance grants line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of
3	\$21,245,679, which may be used, in part, to provide financial assistance to part-time students.
4	SECTION 13. UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AND HEALTH
5	SCIENCES OPERATIONS. The operations line item in subdivision 5 of section 1 of this Act
6	includes the sum of \$158,904,848, which must be transferred, in part, by the state board of
7	higher education, based on the recommendation of the chancellor, to the University of North
8	Dakota school of medicine and health sciences for operations consistent with the higher
9	education per student credit-hour funding formula.
10	SECTION 14. FEDERAL, PRIVATE, AND OTHER FUNDS - APPROPRIATION. All funds,
11	in addition to those appropriated in section 1 of this Act, from federal, private, and other sources
12	for competitive grants or other funds that the legislative assembly has not indicated the intent to
13	reject, received by the institutions and entities under the control of the state board of higher
14	education are appropriated to those institutions and entities, for the biennium beginning
15	July 1,2013, and ending June 30, 2015. All additional funds received under the North Dakota-
16	Minnesota reciprocity agreement during the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending
17	June 30, 2015, are appropriated to the state board of higher education for reimbursement to
18	institutions under the control of the board.
19	SECTION 15. TRANSFER AUTHORITY. If, during the biennium beginning July 1, 2013,
20	and ending June 30, 2015, the state board of higher education determines that funds allocated
21	to operations in section 1 of this Act are needed for capital assets, the board may transfer funds
22	from operations to capital assets. The board shall report any transfer of funds under this section
23	to the office of management and budget.
24	SECTION 16. FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITION ADJUSTMENTS. Notwithstanding
25	any other provisions of law, the state board of higher education may adjust full-time equivalent
26	positions as needed, subject to the availability of funds, for institutions and entities under its
27	control. The North Dakota university system shall report any adjustments to the office of
28	management and budget before the submission of the 2015-17 biennium budget request.
29	SECTION 17. EDUCATION INCENTIVE PROGRAMS. The funding appropriated for
30	education incentive programs in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act may be allocated to
31	education incentive programs as determined by the state board of higher education, including

1 the reduction or elimination of specific programs, and the state board of higher education may 2 determine the appropriate number of years of program eligibility for each education incentive 3 program. SECTION 18. TRIBALLY CONTROLLED COMMUNITY COLLEGE GRANTS. The tribally 4 5 controlled community college grants line in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, includes the 6 sum of \$1,000,000 from the general fund, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, for the 7 purpose of providing grant assistance payments to tribally controlled community colleges, for 8 the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. No more than \$500,000 may 9 be expended for this purpose during the first year of the biennium. 10 SECTION 19. BOND ISSUANCE AUTHORIZATION - PURPOSES - APPROPRIATION. 11 The state board of higher education, in accordance with chapter 15-55, may arrange for the 12 funding of projects authorized in this section, declared to be in the public interest, through the 13 issuance of self-liquidating, tax-exempt evidences of indebtedness under chapter 15-55, 14 beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2015. Evidences of 15 indebtedness issued pursuant to this section are not a general obligation of the state of North 16 Dakota. Any unexpended balance resulting from the proceeds of the evidences of indebtedness 17 must be placed in a sinking fund to be used for the retirement of indebtedness. The evidences 18 of indebtedness may be issued and the proceeds are appropriated, for the biennium beginning 19 July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, for the purpose of financing the following capital 20 projects: 21 University of North Dakota - student housing facility \$19,187,262 22 University of North Dakota - resident apartment building 8,300,000 23 Total special funds \$27,487,262 24 SECTION 20. EMERGENCY. The capital assets and education incentive line items 25 contained in section 1 and sections 6 and 19 of this Act are declared to be an emergency 26 measure.
