### FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Conference Committee Amendments ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2066

Introduced by

Industry, Business and Labor Committee

(At the request of the State Board of Dental Examiners)

#### 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 43-28-25.1 of the North Dakota Century Code,

- 2 relating to tribal sovereignty and the ownership of a dental office or clinic; to amend and reenact
- 3 sections 43-20-01.3, 43-20-03, 43-20-12.3, 43-20-13.2, 43-28-03, 43-28-04, 43-28-15,
- 4 43-28-18.1, 43-28-18.2, and 43-28-25 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the
- 5 practice and licensing of dental assistants and hygienists and dentists; and to provide a penalty.

#### 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-01.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 8 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 43-20-01.3. Licensure by credential review.

10 Applications for licensure to practice dental hygiene by credential review must be made on

11 forms provided by the board and submitted thirty days before the examination administered by

12 the board. The board may issue a license and certificate of registration to practice dental

13 hygiene to an applicant who meets all of the following requirements:

- The applicant, for at least threewithin the five years immediately preceding application,
   has been licensed in good standing and has been actively practicing dental hygiene in
   another jurisdiction where the requirements are at least substantially equivalent to
   those of this state.
- 18 2. Grounds for denial of the application under section 43-20-05 do not exist.
- 19 3. The applicant has paid to the board the fee established by the board by rule.
- 4. The applicant has delivered to the board a certificate from the examining or licensing
   board of every jurisdiction in which the individual is licensed to practice, certifying that
   the individual is a licensed and registered dental hygienist in good standing in that
   jurisdiction.

- The applicant has passed a written examination on the laws and rules governing the
   practice of dentistry in this state administered by the board at a meeting.
- 3 6. The applicant has met any requirement for licensure established by the board by rule.

4 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is

- 5 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 43-20-03. Dental hygienists Practice by.

As used in this chapter, "dental hygiene" and the practice thereof means the removal of accumulated matter from the natural and restored surfaces of teeth and from restorations in the human mouth, the polishing of such surfaces, and the topical application of drugs to the surface tissues of the mouth and to the surface of teeth if such acts are performed under the direct, indirect, or general supervision of a licensed dentist. General supervision may be used if the procedures are authorized in advance by the supervising dentist, except procedures which may

- 13 only be used under indirect or direct supervision as established by the board by rule.
- 14 Only a person licensed as a dental hygienist may be referred to as a dental hygienist.
- 15 Additional tasks permitted to be performed by licensed dental hygienists may be outlined by the
- 16 board of dental examiners by appropriate rules.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-12.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

19 **43-20-12.3.** Supervised administration of anesthesia - Board rules.

A licensed dentist may delegate to a dental hygienist licensed by the board the
administration of block and infiltration anesthesia to a patient who is at least eighteen years old.
The dental hygienist must be under the <u>directindirect</u> supervision of a dentist and the dental
hygienist must complete the educational requirements as required by the commission on dental

24 accreditation and approved by the board. The board shall adopt rules to implement this section.

- SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-20-13.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
   amended and reenacted as follows:
- 27 43-20-13.2. Registered and qualified dental assistant registration.
- 28 To be registered as a registered or qualified dental assistant, an individual shall apply and
- 29 meet the requirements established by the board by ruleto the executive director of the board on
- 30 forms prescribed by the board. The application must be verified under oath to the effect that all
- 31 of the statements contained in the application are true of the applicant's own knowledge. The

1 <u>applicant shall enclose with the application a recent autographed picture of the applicant and an</u>

2 application fee as determined by the board by rule. The board may grant a registration to an

- 3 applicant who has met all of the following requirements:
- <u>The applicant passed, within one year of making application, a written examination on</u>
   <u>the laws and rules governing the practice of dentistry in this state.</u>
- 6 <u>2.</u> <u>Grounds for denial of the application under section 43-20-05 do not exist.</u>
- 7 <u>3.</u> <u>The applicant met any requirement for registration established by the board by rule.</u>
- 8 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-28-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 9 amended and reenacted as follows:

## 10 43-28-03. State board of dental examiners - Members - Appointment - Terms of office -

11 Oath - Vacancies.

12 The state board of dental examiners consists of seveneight members appointed by the 13 governor. The membership of the board must include five dentist members, one dental hygienist 14 member, one registered dental assistant member, and one consumer member. Appointment to 15 the board is for a term of five years, with terms of office arranged so that one term expires on 16 March sixteenth of each year, except that each fifth year there must be two new board members 17 appointed, one of whom is a dentist and the other a dental hygienist and, two years later two 18 new board members must be appointed, one of whom is a dentist, and one of whom is a 19 consumer member, and two years later two new board members must be appointed, one of 20 whom is a dentist and one of whom is a registered dental assistant. The first five-year term of 21 the consumer member commences on July 1, 1993, and continues through March 15, 1998. 22 Each member of the board shall hold office until a successor is appointed and gualified. 23 Persons appointed to the board shall qualify by taking the oath required of civil officers. No 24 member may serve more than ten years or two 5-year terms of office. If the terms of more than 25 two board members expire in the same year, the governor may extend for no more than two 26 years the terms of one or more of those board members in order to comply with this section. If a 27 member of the board is absent from two consecutive regular meetings, the board may declare a 28 vacancy to exist. All vacancies on the board must be filled by the governor by appointment. 29 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 43-28-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 30 amended and reenacted as follows:

19		C.	Is not a dentist, a dental hygienist, a dental assistant, a physician, a nurse, or the
20			spouse of an individual engaged in any of those occupations.
21	4.	<u>An</u>	individual may not be appointed as the registered dental assistant member of the
22		boa	ard unless the individual:
23		<u>a.</u>	Is a registered dental assistant under chapter 43-20; and
24		<u>b.</u>	Is actively engaged in the practice of dental assistance in this state for at least
25			five years immediately preceding the dental assistant's appointment.
26	<u>5.</u>	The	e dental hygienist, the registered dental assistant, and consumer member of the
27		boa	ard shall exercise full voting privileges in all areas except that the dental hygienist
28		ma	y not participate in the clinical examination of dentists for licensure and the
29		reg	istered dental assistant and the consumer member may not participate in the
30		clin	ical examination of dentists or hygienists for licensure.

- the investigation, including responding promptly and completely to a request or
   requirement.
   The complaint, response, and any record received by the board in investigating the
- 4 complaint are exempt records, as defined in section 44-04-17.1, until the board
   5 determines to proceed with a disciplinary action.
- 5. The board shall determine if there is a reasonable basis to believe the dentist engaged in conduct identified as grounds for disciplinary action under section 43-28-18. If the board determines there is not a reasonable basis to believe, the board shall notify the complainant and the dentist. If the board determines there is a reasonable basis to believe, the board shall proceed with a disciplinary action in accordance with chapter 28-32.
- 12 6. The board, at any time, may offer or accept a proposal for informal resolution of the13 complaint or disciplinary action.
- The board may impose a fee on the dentist for all or part of the costs of an action
  resulting in discipline, including administrative costs, investigation costs, attorney's
  fees, witness fees, the cost of the office of administrative hearings' services, and court
  costs.

# 18 SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 43-28-25 of the North Dakota Century Code is 19 amended and reenacted as follows:

- 20 43-28-25. Unlawful acts Penalty.
- 21 It is a class A misdemeanor:
- For any unlicensed person to construct, alter, repair, or duplicate any denture, partial
   denture, bridge, splint, or orthodontic or prosthetic appliance, except as provided by
   rule adopted by the board.
- 25 2. For any person:
- a. To falsely claim or pretend to be a graduate from any dental college or the holder
  of any diploma or degree from such college;
- b. To practice any fraud and deceit either in obtaining a license or a certificate of
  registration;
- 30 c. To falsely claim or pretend to have or hold a license or certificate of registration
  31 from the board to practice dentistry; or

1		d.	To practice dentistry in this state without a license and certificate of registration.			
2	3.	For	any person, except a dentist, to own more than forty-nine percent of an office			
3		prac	ctice or business at which the practice of dentistry is performed. This provision
