## SENATE BILL NO. 2072 with House Amendments SENATE BILL NO. 2072

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 4-30-01 and three new

2 sections to chapter 4-30 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to shared animal ownership

3 agreements; and to amend and reenact subsections 7 and 21 of section 4-30-01 and sections

4 4-30-36, 4-30-36.2, 4-30-36.3, and 4-30-36.4 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to

5 dairy products regulations.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 7 of section 4-30-01 of the North Dakota Century

8 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

9 7. "Dairy or dairy farm" means a place where one or more dairy animals are kept, a part
10 or all of the milk or milk products from which is sold or, offered for sale, or transferred
11 in accordance with a shared animal ownership agreement.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 21 of section 4-30-01 of the North Dakota Century
 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 14 21. "Pasteurized Milk Ordinance" means the 20092011 revision of the Grade "A"
- Pasteurized Ordinance issued by the United States food and drug administration and
  by the United States department of agriculture's public health service.

17 **SECTION 3.** A new subsection to section 4-30-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

18 created and enacted as follows:

- 19 <u>"Shared animal ownership agreement" means any contractual arrangement under</u>
  20 which an individual:
- 21 <u>a.</u> <u>Acquires an ownership interest in a milk-producing animal;</u>
- b. Agrees to pay another for, reimburse another for, or otherwise accept financial
   responsibility for the care and boarding of the milk-producing animal at the dairy
   farm; and

1c.Is entitled to receive a proportionate share of the animal's raw milk production as2a condition of the contractual arrangement.

3 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 4-30-36 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended
4 and reenacted as follows:

5 4-30-36. Standards for grade A milk and milk products - Adoption of amendments.

- Only grade A milk may be sold as fluid beverage for human consumption. The
   minimum standards for milk and milk products designated as grade A are the same as
   the minimum requirements of the Pasteurized Milk Ordinance which includes
   provisions from the "Grade A Condensed and Dry Milk Products and Condensed and
   Dry Whey Supplement 1 to the Grade A PMO". The commissioner may adopt as regulations-other standards in the interest of public safety, wholesomeness of product,
- 12 consumer interest, sanitation, good supply, salability, and promotion of grade A milk
   13 and milk products.
- 14 <u>2.</u> <u>It is not a violation of this section to transfer or obtain raw milk under a shared animal</u>
- ownership agreement. However, a person may not resell raw milk or raw milk products
   obtained under a shared animal ownership agreement.
- 17 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 4-30-36.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 18 amended and reenacted as follows:

19 4-30-36.2. State milk sanitation rating and sampling surveillance officer - Duties -

- 20 Guidelines.
- The state milk sanitation rating and sampling surveillance officer is responsible for the rating and certification of milk and dairy products. The rating and certification of milk and dairy
- 23 products must be in accordance with the procedures outlined in the public health service/food
- 24 and drug administration publication entitled "Methods of Making Sanitation Ratings of Milk
- 25 Shippers 20092011 Revision, Edition" and the sampling of milk and dairy products must be in
- 26 accordance with the guidelines in the Standard Methods.
- 27 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 4-30-36.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 28 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 29 4-30-36.3. Milk laboratory evaluations officer Duties Guidelines.
- 30 The milk laboratory evaluations officer is responsible for the certification and evaluation of
- 31 milk and dairy products laboratories within the state. Evaluations and certification of milk

- 1 laboratories must be made in accordance with the Standard Methods and the procedures
- 2 outlined in the public health service/food and drug administration publication entitled "Evaluation
- 3 of Milk Laboratories 20092011 Edition".

4 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 4-30-36.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is

- 5 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 **4-30-36.4. Grade A pasteurized milk ordinance.**
- 7 Dairy producers, processors, and manufacturers shall comply with the Pasteurized Milk
- 8 Ordinance and follow the standards set by the "Procedures Governing the Cooperative
- 9 State-Public Health Service Food and Drug Administration Program of the National Conference
- 10 on Interstate Milk Shipments, 20092011 Revision".

11 SECTION 8. A new section to chapter 4-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

12 and enacted as follows:

## 13 Shared animal ownership agreement - Dairy farm registration.

14 The owner of a dairy farm that participates in a shared animal ownership agreement shall

15 register with the commissioner by providing a written document that includes:

- 16 <u>1.</u> <u>The name of the dairy farm; and</u>
- 17 <u>2.</u> <u>The address of the dairy farm.</u>
- 18 SECTION 9. A new section to chapter 4-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
- 19 and enacted as follows:
- 20 Shared animal ownership agreement Requirements.
- 21 <u>A person that transfers an animal's raw milk production in accordance with a shared animal</u>
- 22 ownership agreement does not violate this chapter if:
- 23 <u>1.</u> <u>The dairy farm is registered under section 8 of this Act;</u>
- 24 2. The milk is transferred at the dairy farm where the milk-producing animal is located or
   25 delivered to another location in accordance with a shared animal ownership
- 26 <u>agreement;</u>
- 27 <u>3.</u> <u>The individual receiving milk has entered a shared animal ownership agreement with</u>
- 28 the owner of the dairy farm and is receiving milk on the individual's own behalf or on
- 29 the behalf of another who has entered a shared animal ownership agreement with the
- 30 <u>owner of the dairy farm:</u>

4		<u>b.</u>	Potential pathogens may be present in the milk; and	
5		<u>C.</u>	There are potential health concerns associated with the consumption of raw milk	
6			or raw milk products; and	
7	<u>5.</u>	<u>Ann</u>	ually, the owner of the dairy farm provides to individuals who have entered shared	
8		<u>anir</u>	nal ownership agreements with the owner:	
9		<u>a.</u>	The standards used to ensure the health of the milk-producing animals that are	
10			part of the shared animal ownership agreement;	
11		<u>b.</u>	The standards used to ensure the production of milk;	
12		<u>C.</u>	The results of any tests performed on the milk-producing animals, together with	
13			an explanation of the test results; and	
14		<u>d.</u>	The results of any tests performed on the milk from the milk-producing animals,	
15			together with an explanation of the test results.	
16	SECTION 10. A new section to chapter 4-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is created			
17	and enacted as follows:			
18	Shared animal ownership agreement - Prohibition.			
19	A person may not publish any statement that asserts or implies the approval or			
20	endorsement by the commissioner of shared animal ownership agreements and the acquisition			
21	of raw milk under such agreements.
