- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 43-45 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to licensed clinical addiction counselors; and to amend and reenact
- 3 sections 43-45-01, 43-45-02, 43-45-03, 43-45-04, 43-45-05, 43-45-05.1, 43-45-05.2,
- 4 43-45-05.3, 43-45-05.4, 43-45-06, 43-45-07, 43-45-07.1, 43-45-07.2, and 43-45-07.3 of the
- 5 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the scope of practice for addiction counselors and the
- 6 licensure authority of the board of addiction counseling examiners.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-45-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

9 amended and reenacted as follows:

10 **43-45-01**. **Definitions**.

- 11 As used in this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:
- 12 1. "Addiction counseling" means the provision of counseling or assessment of
- personsindividuals regarding theirthe use or abuse of tobacco, nicotine, or alcohol, or
 a controlled substance the addictive engagement in gambling.
- 15 2. "Board" means the board of addiction counseling examiners.
- 16 3. "Clinical training" means training in addiction counseling, approved by the board.
- 17 4. "Internship" means work experience in a licensed addiction treatment facility under the
 18 supervision of a clinical supervisor registered by the board.
- 19 5. <u>"Licensee" means an individual licensed by the board to practice addiction counseling.</u>
- 20 <u>6.</u> "Private practice of addiction counseling" means the independent practice of addiction
- 21 counseling by a qualified individual who is self-employed on a full-time or part-time
- 22 basis and is responsible for that independent practice. Consultation services provided
- to an organization or agency are not the private practice of addiction counseling.

27	d.	Establish continuing education requirements and approve providers of continuing
28		education.

30	f.	Register clinical trainees and addiction counselor trainees.
31	g.	Register interns.

1		h.	Register clinical supervisors.
2		i.	Register licensees for private practice.
3		j.	Approve and administer examinations.
4		k.	Periodically evaluate initial licensure coursework requirements and clinical
5			training requirements to ensure the requirements are up to date and do not serve
6			as an undue barrier to licensure.

9		b.	Issue subpoenas, examine witnesses, and administer oaths, and may investigate
10			allegations of practices violating the provisions of this chapter.
11		C.	Recommend prosecution for violations of this chapter to the appropriate state's
12			attorney.
13		d.	Recommend that the attorney general bring civil actions to seek injunctive and
14			other relief against violations of this chapter.
15		e.	Collect fees for examinations, initial licensures, renewal of licenses, late
16			renewals, private practice registrations, renewal of private practice registrations,
17			approval of continuing education providers, and administrative fees. The fees
18			must be established by rule in amounts necessary to compensate the board for
19			administration and enforcement of this chapter.
20		f.	Employ persons to assist the board in carrying out its the board's duties under this
21			chapter.

6		by the board, at an accredited college or university.
7		b. Has successfullySuccessfully completed one or more oral or written
8		examinations approved by the board for this purpose.
9		c. Has successfullySuccessfully completed a clinical training program approved by
10		the board or accumulated experience as established by the board by rule.
11		d. Has satisfied Satisfied to the board that the applicant agrees to adhere to the
12		code of professional conduct adopted by the board.
13	2.	For the clinical training program or accumulated experience required of an intern
14		seeking initial licensure, at least fifty percent of the required supervision must be
15		provided by a supervising licensed addiction counselor, and the additional supervision
16		may be with other professionals who are designated by the supervising addiction
17		counselor, approved by the board, and competent in the area of practice being
18		supervised. The other professional must be registered as a clinical supervisor by the
19		board that licenses the other professional.
20	<u>3.</u>	The board may grant reciprocity, on such terms and conditions as it may determine
21		necessary, to an applicant for licensure who is in good standing as a licensed,
22		approved, or certified addiction counselor, licensed clinical addiction counselor, or
23		masters addiction counselor under the laws of another jurisdiction that imposes at
24		least substantially the same requirements that are imposed under this chapter.
25	3.<u>4.</u>	An applicant who is denied If the board denies a licensure must be notified application,
26		the board shall notify the applicant in writing of the reasons for denial and of the
27		applicant's right to a hearing before the board, under chapter 28-32, if a hearing is
28		requested within thirty days.

22			obtain licensure as an addiction counselorby the board.
23		b.	The Bank of North Dakota shall determine all terms applicable to the time and
24			manner in which loans made under this section must be repaid.
25		C.	Interest on outstanding loans under this section must accrue at the Bank of North
26			Dakota's current base rate, but may not exceed six percent per annum.
27		d.	The maximum loan for which an applicant may qualify under this section is seven
28			thousand five hundred dollars.
29		e.	This subsection is applicable only to individuals beginning an internship after
30			June 30, 2015.

14		trainees or interns in board-approved programs from engaging in addiction counseling
15		related to training.

18		of the complainant to be made a matter of public record, if the board concludes that
19		good cause exists for preserving the confidentiality of the complainant.
20	3.	An addiction counselorA licensee who is the subject of an investigation by the board
21		shall cooperate fully with the investigation. Cooperation includes responding fully and
22		promptly to any reasonable question raised by or on behalf of the board relating to the
23		subject of the investigation, and providing copies of patient records when reasonably
24		requested by the board and accompanied by the appropriate release.
25	4.	In order to pursue the investigation, the board has the power tomay subpoena and
26		examine witnesses and records, including patient records, and to copy, photograph, or
27		take samples. It The board may require the licensed addiction counselor licensee to
28		give statements under oath, to submit to a physical or mental examination, or both, by
29		a physician or physicians and other qualified evaluation professionals selected by the
30		board if it appears to be in the best interest of the public that this evaluation be

1		secured. A written request from the board constitutes authorization to release
2		information. The patient records that are released to the board are not public records.
3	5.	Unless there is a patient release on file allowing the release of information at the
4		public hearing, all data and information, including patient records , acquired by the
5		board in itsthe board's investigation are confidential and closed to the public. All board
6		meetings whereinat which patient testimony or records are taken or reviewed are
7		confidential and closed to the public. If no patient testimony or records are taken or
8		reviewed, the remainder of the meeting is an open meeting unless a specific
9		exemption is otherwise applicable.
