- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a COVID-19 relief grant program for essential workers; to provide an
- 3 appropriation; to provide a contingent appropriation; and to provide an expiration date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 7 <u>COVID-19 essential worker relief grant program Eligibility.</u>
- 8 <u>1.</u> The department shall establish a COVID-19 essential worker relief grant program to
- 9 provide financial assistance to essential workers. The grant program must be
- designed to award one thousand dollars to each eligible essential worker.
- 11 <u>2.</u> <u>To be eligible for financial assistance under the COVID-19 essential worker relief grant</u>
- 12 <u>program an individual must:</u>
- 13 <u>a. Apply for the grant before May 31, 2022;</u>
- b. Be employed as an essential worker on a full-time basis;
- 15 <u>c.</u> <u>Be a North Dakota resident; and</u>
- 16 <u>d. Earn less than sixty thousand dollars a year.</u>
- 17 3. As used in this section, "essential worker" means:
- 18 <u>a. A state or local government employee;</u>
- 19 <u>b.</u> <u>A health and human services employee;</u>
- 20 <u>c.</u> <u>A public health employee;</u>
- 21 <u>d. A mortuary service provider;</u>
- 22 e. An emergency services provider;
- f. A public transportation, taxi, or rideshare driver;
- 24 g. An educator or school employee;

2	<u>i.</u>	A child care provider;

15	<u>S.</u>	An individual employed to preempt and respond to cyber incidents involving
16		<u>critical infrastructure;</u>
17	<u>t.</u>	An individual employed to administer and deliver unemployment programs:
18	<u>u.</u>	A 2020 census worker;
19	<u>V.</u>	An individual employed for emergency-related permitting, credentialing,
20		certifying, and licensing for essential critical infrastructure operations;
21	<u>W.</u>	A member of the armed forces, North Dakota national guard, or armed forces
22		reserve component stationed in this state;
23	<u>X.</u>	An individual employed to support public radio, print, internet, or television news
24		services;
25	<u>y.</u>	An individual employed to support a dependent care provider including child care
26		and elder care;
27	<u>Z.</u>	A hotel or temporary lodging facility employee;
28	<u>aa.</u>	An individual employed to provide food, shelter, or social services to vulnerable
29		populations or to COVID-19 responders;
30	<u>bb.</u>	An individual employed to produce, deliver, or distribute hygiene and cleaning

1 An individual employed to provide disinfection services. 2 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - FEDERAL FISCAL STIMULUS FUNDS. There is 3 appropriated from federal fiscal stimulus funds made available to the state before December 31, 4 2021, for COVID-19 relief purposes, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$200,000,000, or 5 so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of commerce for the purpose of 6 administering the COVID-19 essential worker relief grant program, for the period beginning with 7 the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2022. 8 SECTION 3. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION. If federal funds appropriated under 9 section 2 of this Act are not available to provide the sum of \$200,000,000, there is appropriated 10 out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum 11 of \$200,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of commerce 12 for the purpose of administering the COVID-19 essential worker relief grant program, for the 13 period beginning on January 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2022. The department of commerce 14 may spend the funds appropriated under this section only to the extent federal funds 15 appropriated in section 2 of this Act are not available for these purposes. 16 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act is effective through June 30, 2022, and after that 17
