- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-19 and a new section to
- 2 chapter 54-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to providing schools with information,
- 3 programs, and resources regarding student safety and crisis awareness issues to be posted in
- 4 school common areas and a student safety and crisis awareness reporting program; and to
- 5 provide a continuing appropriation.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
- 8 and enacted as follows:
- 9 <u>Student safety and crisis awareness information, programs, and resources in</u>
- 10 schools.
- 11 The superintendent of public instruction, in coordination with other relevant state agencies,
- 12 shall create information and resources for students regarding appropriate school safety and
- 13 awareness issues. The superintendent shall disseminate the information and resources to
- 14 schools to be posted in school common areas.
- 15 **SECTION 2.** A new section to chapter 54-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
- 16 and enacted as follows:

## 17 Student safety and crisis awareness reporting programs - Confidentiality of records -

- 18 <u>Continuing appropriation.</u>
- <u>1.</u> The attorney general shall encourage and promote the use of statewide and locally
  <u>selected school safety and crisis reporting programs.</u>
- 21 <u>2.</u> If funding becomes available, the attorney general may:
- 22a.Expand a statewide program to include tailored reporting mechanisms targeted to23incidents of bullying and physical or sexual abuse; and

1		b. Conduct outreach to promote awareness of statewide and locally selected school
2		safety and crisis reporting programs.
3	<u>3.</u>	All records or information related to the operation of programs described in
4		subsection 1 are exempt records as defined in section 44-04-18.1.
5	<u>4.</u>	The attorney general may seek and accept gifts, grants, and donations from any
6		source for the purpose of carrying out its duties under this section. All moneys
7		received as gifts, grants, and donations are appropriated to the attorney general on a
8		continuing basis for the purpose of carrying out this section.
9	<u>5.</u>	The attorney general may adopt rules necessary to administer the duties required to
10		carry out this section.
