## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 11-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 7 Restriction Consumer merchandise.
- 1. For purposes of this section, "consumer merchandise" means merchandise offered for
  sale or lease, or provided with a sale or lease, primarily for personal, family, or
  household purposes.
- Notwithstanding section 11-09.1-05 and subsection 4 of section 12.1-31-03, a county,
  including a home rule county or any agency of the county, may not adopt an
- ordinance, motion, resolution, or amendment that sets standards or requirements
- 14 <u>regarding the sale or marketing of consumer merchandise which are different from or</u>
- in addition to any requirement established by state law.
- SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 40-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 18 <u>Restriction Consumer merchandise.</u>
- 1. For purposes of this section, "consumer merchandise" means merchandise offered for
  20 sale or lease, or provided with a sale or lease, primarily for personal, family, or
  21 household purposes.
