- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 15.1-09.2 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to regional education associations; and to repeal chapter 15.1-09.1 of the North Dakota
- 3 Century Code, relating to regional education associations.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 15.1-09.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 7 15.1-09.2-01. Definition.
- 8 For purposes of this chapter, "regional education association" means a group of school
- 9 <u>districts operating in accordance with a joint powers agreement that has been reviewed by the</u>
- 10 superintendent of public instruction and verified as meeting the requirements of section
- 11 15.1-09.2-02.
- 12 <u>15.1-09.2-02. Regional education associations Review by superintendent of public</u>
- 13 instruction Criteria.
- 14 For a group of school districts to be designated as a regional education association, the
- 15 <u>superintendent of public instruction shall review the joint powers agreement that the districts</u>
- 16 have entered and verify that the requirements of this section have been met.
- 17 1. The school districts must:
- 18 <u>a. Have a combined total land mass of at least five thousand eight hundred square</u>
 19 miles [1502193 hectares];
- b. (1) Have a combined total land mass of at least four thousand five hundred
 square miles [1165494 hectares]; and
- 22 (2) Number at least twelve;
- 23 <u>c. (1) Have a combined total land mass of at least four thousand square miles</u>
- 24 [1035995 hectares]; and

16		following services to its member districts:

18			and administrators employed by its member districts;				
19		<u>b.</u>	Supplementation of technology support services;				
20		<u>C.</u>	Assistance with achieving school improvement goals identified by the				
21			superintendent of public instruction;				
22		<u>d.</u>	Assistance with the collection, analysis, and interpretation of student				
23			achievement data; and				
24		<u>e.</u>	Assistance with the expansion and enrichment of curricular offerings.				
25	<u>2.</u>	Sub	section 1 does not preclude a regional education association from offering				
26		<u>add</u>	itional services to its member districts.				
27	<u>15.1</u>	15.1-09.2-06. Regional education association - Provision of special education and					
28	related	elated services.					
29	<u>1.</u>	A regional education association may prepare an annual plan regarding the provision					
30		of special education and related services on behalf of its members and submit					
31		to the superintendent of public instruction for approval.					

15.1-09.2-03. Regional education association - Legal status.

1 A regional education association shall plan and coordinate the transportation of 2 students who are enrolled in its member districts and to whom it provides special 3 education and related services. 4 15.1-09.2-07. Operating fund - Accounting functions. 5 Each regional education association shall maintain its own operating fund. 6 15.1-09.2-08. Regional education association - Report of expenses. 7 The board of a regional education association shall submit annually to the 1. 8 superintendent of public instruction, at the time and in the manner designated by the 9 superintendent, a report detailing all expenses incurred by the association and shall 10 attribute the expenses on a per student basis by participating school district. 11 The board shall deposit any moneys received by or on behalf of the regional education 12 association into the association's operating fund. 13 15.1-09.2-09. Compensation - Reimbursement - Extraordinary service. 14 A regional education association board member may not receive compensation for 1. 15 attending meetings of the board. 16 A regional education association board member may not receive reimbursement for <u>2.</u> 17 expenses incurred in attending meetings of the board. 18 <u>3.</u> A regional education association board member may receive compensation and 19 reimbursement, as determined by the board, if the member performs extraordinary 20 service on behalf of the board. For purposes of this subsection, "extraordinary service" 21 means duties beyond those reasonably expected of board members and includes 22 travel to and attendance at national meetings or conventions. 23 15.1-09.2-10. State aid - Payable to a regional education association - Obligation of 24 district. 25 <u>1.</u> The superintendent of public instruction shall forward that portion of a school district's 26 state aid, which is payable by the superintendent under section 15.1-27-03.1 as a 27 result of the district's participation in a regional education association, directly to the 28 association in which the district participates. The superintendent shall forward the 29 amount payable under this subsection at the same time and in the same manner as 30

provided for other state aid payments under section 15.1-27-01.

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- If the superintendent of public instruction determines that a school district failed to
 meet any contractual or statutory obligation imposed upon it as a result of the district's
 participation in a regional education association, the superintendent shall subtract the
 amount for which the district was not eligible from any future distribution of state aid to
 the district under section 15.1-27-01.
- 6 **15.1-09.2-11. Rights of employees.**
- 7 Any individual employed by the board of a regional education association has the same
- 8 statutory rights as those accorded to an individual employed by a public school district for the
- 9 same purpose.
- 10 **SECTION 2. REPEAL.** Chapter 15.1-09.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
