A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-21-02.4, 15.1-21-02.5, and 15.1-21-02.6
 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to North Dakota scholarships.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section-15.1-21-02.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 15.1-21-02.4. North Dakota career and technical education scholarship.
- Any resident student who graduates from a high school during or after the 2010-11 school
- 8 year is eligible to receive a North Dakota career and technical education scholarship provided
- 9 the student:
- Completed four units of English language arts from a sequence that includes literature,
 composition, and speech;
- 12 2. Completed three units of mathematics, including:
- a. One unit of algebra II, as defined by the superintendent of public instruction; and

24			each quarter during which the student is enrolled full time at an accredited
25			institution of higher education in this state and maintains a cumulative grade
26			point average of 2.75.

The state board of higher education shall forward the scholarship directly to the 6 institution in which the student is enrolled. 7 5. This section does not require a student to be enrolled in consecutive (1) a. 8 semesters. 9 (2) This section does not require a student to be enrolled in consecutive 10 quarters. 11 b. However, a scholarship under this section is valid only for six academic years 12 after the student's graduation from high school and may not be applied to 13 graduate programs. 14 6. A scholarship under this section is available to any eligible resident student who fulfills 15 the requirements of section 15.1-21-02.4 or 15.1-21-02.5 and who graduates from: 16 A high school in this state; a. 17 b. A high school in a bordering state under chapter 15.1-29; or 18 C. A nonpublic high school in a bordering state while residing with a custodial parent 19 in this state. 20 7. For purposes of North Dakota scholarship eligibility under this section, "full-time" <u>a.</u> 21 means enrollment in at least twelve credits during a student's first two semesters 22 and enrollment in at least fifteen credits during each semester thereafter or 23 enrollment in the equivalent number of credits, as determined by the state board 24 of higher education, with respect to students in a quarter system. 25 b. (1) If a student requires fewer than fifteen credits to graduate, the student may 26 retain scholarship eligibility by enrolling in fewer than fifteen but at least 27 twelve credits during the semester, or the equivalent number of credits, as 28 determined by the state board of higher education, with respect to students 29 in a quarter system. 30 (2)Students who graduated from high school during the 2009-10 or the

2010-11 school year and who have completed six semesters may retain

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I	scholarship eligibility by enrolling in only twelve credits during each of the
2	student's final two semesters, or the equivalent number of credits, as
3	determined by the state board of higher education, with respect to students
1	in a quarter system.
