- A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 15-10-18.6 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to providing reduced tuition and fee charges in North Dakota institutions of higher education for dependents of disabled veterans; and to provide an appropriation.

 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 15-10-18.6 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 7 <u>15-10-18.6. Reduced tuition in North Dakota institutions of higher education.</u>
 - As used in this section:

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- a. "Dependent" means a child, stepchild, spouse, widow, or widower of a resident veteran, as "veteran" is defined in section 37-01-40, who:
 - (1) Has a service-connected disability rating of at least fifty percent but no more than ninety-nine percent, as determined by the department of veterans' affairs; or
 - (2) Has an extra-schedular rating to include individual unemployability that brings the veteran's total disability rating to at least fifty percent but not more than ninety-nine percent, as determined by the department of veterans' affairs.
 - b. "Resident veteran" has the same meaning as provided under section 15-10-18.2.
 - 2. Any dependent upon being duly accepted for enrollment into any undergraduate degree or certificate program of a North Dakota state institution of higher education is entitled to obtain a bachelor's degree or certificate of completion, for so long as the dependent is eligible, at reduced tuition and fee charges provided the bachelor's degree or certificate of completion is earned within a forty-five-month or ten-semester

3	<u>3.</u>	A dependent is entitled to the following reduction in tuition and fees under		
4		sub	section 2:	
5		<u>a.</u>	A fifty percent reduction if the resident veteran has a service-connected disability	
6			rating of at least fifty percent but not more than fifty-nine percent;	
7		<u>b.</u>	A sixty percent reduction if the resident veteran has a service-connected disability	
8			rating of at least sixty percent but not more than sixty-nine percent;	
9		<u>C.</u>	A seventy percent reduction if the resident veteran has a service-connected	
10			disability rating of at least seventy percent but not more than seventy-nine	
11			percent;	
12		<u>d.</u>	An eighty percent reduction if the resident veteran has a service-connected	
13			disability rating of at least eighty percent but not more than eighty-nine percent;	
14			<u>or</u>	
15		<u>e.</u>	Ninety percent reduction if the resident veteran has a service-connected disability	
16			rating of at least ninety percent but not more than ninety-nine percent.	
17	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general			
18	fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$3,800,000, or so much of the			
19	sum as may be necessary, to the state board of higher education for the purpose of providing			
20	reduced tuition and fees to a dependent of a disabled resident veteran, for the biennium			
21	beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.
